## 2022 Lacrosse Australia Life Membership

Lacrosse WA was thrilled with the announcement that Subiaco Lacrosse Club's, Ian Toy, had been awarded a Life Membership for Lacrosse Australia.

Ian's service to lacrosse in Australia and Western Australia is significant. Ian was recognised for his dedication and passion to develop and promote the sport of lacrosse at club, state and national levels as a player and administrator.

Ian's achievements as a player on the field were impressive. After starting over 60 years ago at the Subiaco Lacrosse Club in 1959, Ian represented WA at both Junior and Senior levels gaining numerous player awards and captaining his club South Perth to a Premiership in 1973 before working up to captaining the Australian team at the 1974 World Championships in Melbourne. Subsequently some years after he ceased playing in 1986, in 2000 Ian was named to the WALA Team of the Century. Ian was a skilled and tenacious defenseman and he carried that tenacity through into sports administration where he was as successful off the field as he had been on it. Ian has had a number of coaching roles,



mainly at Subiaco across both Junior and Women's versions of lacrosse and he has held too many administrative roles to count but his involvement in establishing the Wanneroo Club with Malcolm Stokes, his work with the Western Australian Lacrosse Foundation and his Presidency of the WALA are probably stand out roles. In addition to this, Ian has an unparalleled knowledge in documenting lacrosse history particularly in WA where he is the author of 'A History of the Western Australian Lacrosse Association 1896 to 2010'.

# 2022 DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT & GROWTH REPORT

2022 has again been a successful year in the area of growth and development with all clubs committing to:

- a club driven growth program with a focus on the recruitment of junior primary school players and the retention of current club players
- identifying and undertaking proactive engagement with local catchment primary schools to deliver Lacrosse Australia's Quick Stix programs in school delivery via Sport School Australia funding and after school delivery of Quickstix Invade via player pay to play
- providing monthly reporting of age group numbers attending club based programs and Quickstix sessions and the numbers converting to players
- to work with local school clusters to develop and then host interschool carnivals
- support the development of a regional WA lacrosse carnival
- Governance improvements between members, clubs and LWA
- Upholding and delivering improvements to the LWA and Club's Code of Conduct, including sanctions when required
- greater engagement and sharing of lessons learnt between clubs, LWA and LA

The JLC team again recognised and agreed to achieve annual growth their clubs needed:

- to secure separate and additional club resources to drive the growth of new club players, including a Quick Stix co-ordinator
- commitment from their boards for a 5 year rolling growth program with a focus on the growth of the u11 playing group
- to develop their own non-travelling Quickstix/Modcrosse/Sixers competition for new players

By actioning the above commitments during 2022 the achieved Growth and Development outcomes include:

1. Agreement and achievement of closer alignment of men's, women's and junior grades
2. Successful launch of LWA's first World Lacrosse Sixers tournament
3. All clubs undertaking Quickstix programs
4. Continued improvement and delivery of LWA policy and procedure on Child safeguarding

Again, we must decide and commit.

If growth of junior playing numbers is our number one priority, each club, their board and members must reflect on how well this priority is resourced. I will continue to challenge each Club to match this priority of growth with the required sustained resources to deliver results.

I understand it's a privilege to chair this Committee and to work with all of its dedicated members.

# 2022 DIRECTOR OF HIGH PERFORMANCE REPORT

The 2022 season welcomed the return of national and international competition. LWA were represented on both fronts with some incredibly talented athletes, coaches, and umpires. In addition to attending multiple events, Western Australia also hosted the U15 National Championship in conjunction with the Wembley Lacrosse Club. LWA having so many representatives at these competitions stems from the hours of work our volunteers do to make this possible. A sincere thank you to everyone involved with our high-performance programs this year, without your efforts this wouldn't be possible.

### **International representation**

On the international stage, we saw many years of preparation finally pay off, with our Under 21 Australian Men's Team competing at the World Championships in Limerick, Ireland. LWA were represented by Head Coach Gavin Leavy and players Jaesaya Bidwell-Barton, Daniel Bowater, Lucas Koczwara (co-captain), Ethan Moir, Thomas Richards and Travis Wolfe. The team competed in the bronze medal match, but unfortunately lost 6-10 to Haudenosaunee.

We had a strong West Australian contingent in the Women's Under 23 side, competing at the Vail Shootout and the World Festival Tournament in the US/Canada, with Olivia Antulov, Bailie-Rose Keenan, Erin Mitchell and Shannon Mitchell (Vice Captain) playing and Faye Beaman as team manager. Bailie-Rose Keenan was named in the All-Star Team for the Vail Tournament, where the team finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> place. In the World Festival the team finished in 2<sup>nd</sup> place, losing by a goal in the championship match to the English Lions.

Our Senior Women's team had Ashtyn Hiron and Madison Copeland competing at the World Championship, falling to England in overtime in the bronze medal match. The team then went on to compete at the World Games, in sixes format with Tegan Brown and Ashtyn Hiron (co-captain) as the WA representatives. Ocea Leavy was also selected as the alternate for the World Games team. The team went on to win the bronze medal in a very fast paced, exciting match.

LWA also sent 3 officials to the Women's World Championships, represented by Suzanne Kirkby, Susan Milne and Kellie Morley. For the World Games we were represented by Tim Kennedy who officiated the men's games.

Our Senior Men's side made their debut at the World Games, again in the sixes format. WA had strong representation from Thomas Graham, Tim Stone and Lachlan Walker. With several WA based alternates named; Jordan Gillespie, Ryan Hockey and Brayden Panting. The team finished in 6<sup>th</sup> place, going down to Haudenosaunee 12-19 in their final match.

The 2023 Australian Men's Team has recently been announced with the following WA representatives named in the Team to compete in San Diego in June this year: With Glenn Morley as Assistant Coach, players include Isaac Cahill, Ashby Dennis, Thomas Graham, Brayden Panting, Ryan Spark, Lachlan Walker and Matt Wood with Jae Bidwell-Barton named as an Alternate.

### **National Championships**

Moving on to our state representatives we welcomed the long-awaited return of National Championships in April with our Senior State Teams. Our Women's team were hampered by injuries and finished in third place, and our Men's team made it to the final, falling short to Victoria. We had a strong showing in the All-Star teams with Sam Koczwar, Ashby Dennis, Tegan Brown and Bailey Eastman named.

After several delays the Under 18 Championships were finally held in South Australia. Our Women's side comfortably defeated New Zealand 15-9 to finish in 3<sup>rd</sup> place. While our Men's team fell short to South Australia in the championship game 6-9, ending the tournament in 2<sup>nd</sup> place. We had several WA representatives named in the All Star Teams: Kade Moir, Jack Cooper, Joseph Manning, Ruby Koczwar, Emily Dawson and Holly Plummer.

We finished the year on a high with a fantastic Under 15 Championship, held at HBF Arena Joondalup. For the women's competition, Flames finished in 5<sup>th</sup> spot with a 1 goal win over Ice, and Stars finished in 4<sup>th</sup> place after a hard game against Fire. The men's competition came to a very exciting ending with a final between Thunder and Braves. Braves coming out victors with a 5-goal win.

### **The year ahead**

Looking forward to the 2023 season, we have lots of exciting competition ahead, with the 2023 Men's World Championship in San Diego, and, on the local front, LWA is set to host the Under 18 National Championships. As always, we will rely on our exceptional and dedicated volunteers to make these events and teams possible, and to help our sport flourish within the wider WA sporting community.

In 2023, we will once again be looking for volunteers and I strongly encourage all members of the lacrosse family to consider their skill set and how they may be able to contribute to the success of our state teams. Our ongoing success in a high-performance setting begins with the support we offer locally. 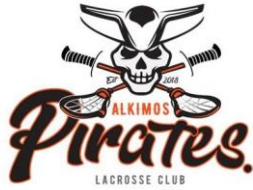

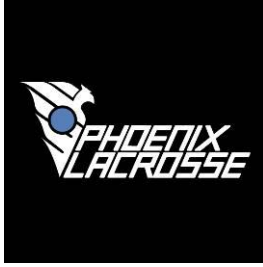

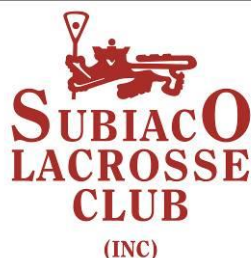

Whilst COVID still managed to have an impact early in the season, it was nice to be able to get back to some normality on the lacrosse field and to be able to reunite with referees outside Western Australia.

On a domestic level, senior referee numbers managed to hold relatively steady from years past with enough referees to be able to meet requirements in the higher grades, but with a number of vacancies still throughout Division 2 and Division 3. To that end, I would like to thank our clubs for their efforts in attempting to address shortfalls. It is hoped that heading into 2023, in conjunction with clubs, we will see the number vacancies decline in senior ranks and look to improve pathways for transitioning players in refereeing and attracting non-players to referee.

Juniors refereeing number were however a significant concern. Whilst I can appreciate the difficulties faced by clubs in finding junior referees, this directly feeds into issues surrounding the application of rules and refereeing quality. If the referees that officiate games changes every week, it is impossible to set a standard and quality suffers, particularly in grades with rule modifications such as U13's and to a lesser extent, U15's. This also becomes problematic in U11's where the difficulty in establishing a cognizant rule book leads to confusion and inconsistency which is not a good look on field. More on this below.

On a National level, the highlight of the year was being able to have our officials participate in interstate and international events. This started at the Seniors with WA well represented across that Championship as well as the 18's. We were represented in Limerick, Ireland this year on-field and off-field, with a particular shout out to Western Australian refereeing legend – Lindsay Scott – who was awarded the 2022 International Officiating Award for making a significant worldwide impact to the growth and development of lacrosse officiating. The year then finished on another high with a number of young Western Australians referees making their debuts at the U15 National Tournament.

2022 also highlighted some concerns for referees moving forward. 2022 saw an increase in poor behaviour towards referees, particularly from spectators. This is an issue that is not unique to

lacrosse, but it doesn't make it right. Adding to this is the difficulty faced in disciplining poor spectator behaviour. ALRA(WA) attempted to work with clubs to rectify this behaviour and for those clubs who we worked with on this front, I thank you. We have a terrific group of Club Presidents at the moment and their willingness to help address this behaviour was welcomed. Sadly, though reports were still made and it highlights some difficulties in terms of imposing penalties which could act as a deterrent. ALRA(WA) looks forward to working with clubs in this respect.

The other concern, as mentioned above, is the decline in regular junior referees. Whilst not oblivious to the issues, we also can't accept it. ALRA(WA) has moved towards a simplified accreditation model to ensure that referees are able to discharge their obligations competently, but more needs to be done to attract regular referees. Poor, and often uneducated, spectator behaviour is a large deterrent for new referees but it's hoped that we can work with clubs in 2023 to find new ways to attract referees.

Last year, we set ourselves three distinct challenges for 2022. We achieved 2 of them in terms of establishing a new set of rules (which we trust will be formalized in the coming months ahead of 2023) designed to ensure mandatory accreditation. We also created a new series of accreditations for local junior rule variations. Unfortunately, due to commitments elsewhere, the expansion of ALRA(WA) objectives to include Women's officials was unable to be completed.

That leads to 2023 where ALRA (WA) will again look to continue its evolution focusing on the following key objectives:

1. Unifying Men's referees and Women's umpires under a single banner;
2. Finalising and enforcing accreditation requirements for all officials;
3. Working on junior referee numbers by working with clubs to attract new officials to take up refereeing on a regular basis; and
4. Improving collaboration with clubs with a focus on rule knowledge (through training and seminars for all age groups)

Thank you to my committee in 2022 for bearing with me as I looked to work on a few things and I look forward to a productive 2023.

**Notes to the Financial Statements  
For the year ended 31 October 2022**

**Note 1. Summary of accounting policies**

**(a) General statement**

The Association is a not for-profit reporting entity that prepares special purpose financial statements in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, the Framework, Statements of Accounting Concepts and other authoritative pronouncements of the AASB.

Where modification is required and has had a material or significant financial effect upon the reported results, details of that modification and the resulting financial effect are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

**(b) Basis of preparation**

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting using the historical cost convention, except for land and buildings which have been measured at fair value.

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements have been consistently applied throughout all periods presented unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars and all values are rounded to the nearest dollar (\$).

**(c) Reporting entity**

The association is not a reporting entity because there are unlikely to exist users who are unable to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy all of their information needs, and these accounts are therefore "special purpose accounts" that have been prepared solely to meet the requirements of the Constitution and the Associations Act.

**(d) Income tax**

The association is exempt from income tax.

**(e) Revenue and other income**

Revenue is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income when the Association obtains control and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the association and the amount can be measured reliably.

**(f) Goods and services tax (GST)**

Transactions are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

**(g) Receivables**

Receivables are recognised at original invoice amount less an allowance for any uncollectible amounts. The collectability of receivables is reviewed on an ongoing basis and any receivables identified as uncollectible are written-off against the allowance account. The allowance for uncollectible amounts (doubtful debts) is raised when there is objective evidence that the Association will not be able to collect the debts. The carrying amount is equivalent to fair value as it is due for settlement within 30 days.

**(h) Payables**

Payables are recognised at the amounts payable when the Association becomes obliged to make future payments as a result of a purchase of assets or services at fair value, as they are generally settled within 30 days.

**(i) Provisions**

Provisions are liabilities of uncertain timing or amount and are recognised where there is a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of a past event and when the outflow of resources embodying economic benefits is probable and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are reviewed at the end of each reporting period.

**(j) Comparative figures**

Comparative figures are, where appropriate, reclassified to be comparable with the figures presented in the current financial year.
