Executive Officer's Report

2006 was another very busy year for Lacrosse South Australia. Some aspects of the year were very positive, others not so.

Highlights and activities included :

Men's World Cup—Canada

- A significant number of South Australians contributed to the Men's 2006 World Cup campaign—Peter Inge, Mark Mangan and Wes Green (team members) Stephen Mortimer and Justin Casagrande (alternates), Colin Cunningham (Executive Director), Peter Brown (Head Coach), Paul Sheidow (Finance Manager) Stephen Robinson, (Assistant Manager), Kevin Humphrys (Bench Coordinator), Bob Carter (Team Analyst), Craig Treloar (Strength and Conditioning Coach and Aust. Delegate on All Stars selection panel), Dave Mack (Trainer), Lesley Cunningham (Assistant Finance Manager /Exec. Asst.), Sue Robinson (Merchandising Support Officer).
- SA Referees Mark Polden and David Campbell officiated, and Dennis Mulroney and assessed.

Under 19 Girl's World Cup

- A significant number of SA girls trained and remain in the squad for the 2007 event in Canada
- Trish Adams was appointed as local coach to look after these girls

Australian U19 World Cup Team

- Bob Carter was appointed as Head Coach and Craig Treloar Strength and Conditioning Coach

Australian Lacrosse League

- 2005 saw us stage a preliminary round, plus the final (in which we didn't participate) in Adelaide.
- 2006 (season just completed) was the last year of the inaugural 3 year cycle of this style of competition. From SA's point of view the cost, timing (and a population explosion) made fielding a team difficult. Gary Mortimer pulled things together almost single handedly and Mark Mangan made his debut as State Coach. No doubt the ALL format will be extensively reviewed by Lacrosse Australia.

WLA Senior Women's National Championships

- Disappointing that we could not put together a team for either the original date in July, or the revised date in September. No doubt there were many reasons for player's lack of availability and interest—some understandable, never-the-less this is a major concern. The Championships were eventually cancelled altogether

WLA Under 21 and Under 17 National Championships

- Held in Sydney in April—both teams finished 2nd. to Victoria

LA Under 19 Men's Championship and Under 17 Zone Boy's Tournament

- Well hosted and run by Woodville Lacrosse Club.

LA Under 15 Boys and WLA Under 15 Girls

- Held in Melbourne in October. Sending 80 boys and girls away is quite an exercise and starting this event on the weekend of the AFL Grand Final proved to be quite a challenge. A particular thank-you to these Coaches and Managers and to Helen Keane.

Overseas teams

- During the year we had several teams and groups visit us for coaching and games—USA West, and several teams from Japanese Colleges included.
- Thank-you to Trish Adams who managed this aspect of our operation and to all those who assisted in any way.

Men's State League Indoor Comp.

- Held at the Blackwood Recreation Centre in January and managed predominantly by Sturt Lacrosse Club. Well done to all concerned.

Women's Summer League Competition

- Again well organised by a player's committee and proved to be a very popular pre-season event.

Development Activities

The team played each Saturday at the SACA grounds which also gave all the lower grades, junior players and their spectators a chance to watch an STX game. Well done to Sascha Newmarch, Courtney Hobbs and Sarah Falcione for their work in setting up and coaching this team.

All other STX games continued to be played at Port Adelaide in the Wednesday night competition. It was fantastic to see Wilderness emerge and win their first premiership in an exciting grand final against Brighton. Congratulations to Wilderness as well as the STX All Star team and individual award winners. Thank you to Graham Hobbs and Roger Attenborough for their continued support for the STX competition.

On a disappointing note regarding our interstate commitment, we were unable to field a team in the Senior Women's National Championships during the year. There were some legitimate reasons for this including the non-standing of a number of players who played in last year's World Cup winning team as well as the financial commitment already faced by players in the U19 National squad. The cost of travelling to Perth can be prohibitive for many but given our history of success in this competition, it was certainly a poor reflection on us as a state that we could not find the players willing to stand.

The A Reserves and B grade competition continued on a Saturday at the SACA ground. Well done and thank you to clubs and their volunteers for all the work they put in to enter and support these teams in the competitions. We could not do it without you. Congratulations to Brighton and UniSA for taking out the respective premierships in these grades. as well as all the other teams for making it such a successful competition each week.

A thank you to Sue Hogan for all her work as the chair of the Women's Competition Committee in the first half of the season and to tireless contributors, Margaret Pallant and Kathy Benger, along with the club representatives. Also thank you to Helen Lewis for her support and assistance. Both forms of the game need to be developed, proposed suggestions include

- Super league with modified rules, draft, sponsors/owners

- More players/teams becoming involved with the Indoor contact game.

Clubs, players and officials must become proactive with these developments, we need to be focussed to try something new. We are all involved in the greatest game ever played but are reluctant to make changes, and seem content to go with the norm, other sports have kept their more traditional game while developing

other forms with great success.

Junior Competition

Whilst the analogy is usually 'two steps forward, one step back' I view 2006 as a season of 'three steps forward, one step back'. In summary, Lacrosse SA has seen an increase in junior numbers amongst boys & girls, an increase in the number of teams competing at a junior level and the reduction of the dependency on junior players to 'play-up' grades to make a team. Whilst 11.13 was postponed for a season, it's pleasing to see that that the concept has the support of the clubs and will be fully implemented in its entirety in season 2007, through to 11.17 in 2010.

It's pleasing to see that our junior numbers have reached 559, the highest figures we have seen since 2001, with both junior boys and junior girls seeing increases. Whilst this figure is pleasing, it reiterates comments made by many clubs that for recruitment to be successful clubs must receive support from both male & female players within the club.

2006 has seen eleven additional teams introduced into the junior competition, a remarkable ten teams amongst the girls and one amongst the boys. This statistic is pleasing in two ways.

1. The increase in junior teams is more evident in the lower age groups.
2. The teams consist of 'actual' new players rather than existing players 'playing-up', thanks to the implementation of the 'minimum number' rule, which has been most evident and pleasing in the girls competition.

With team numbers at an all time high of 58, I congratulate all clubs on a fantastic effort in recruiting new players, but urge clubs to develop retention strategies, outside of the game to maintain these playing numbers through to senior grades.

The later half of the season, saw 'duty of care' issues arise. With an estimated 50 children in the under 11 competition aged under 8 years of age, this issue will need to receive additional prominence as we see an ever increasing number of younger children take up the sport of lacrosse.

With 11.13 taking up a significant part of my year, the association's Member Protection Policy has taken a back seat, however with breaches occurring throughout season 2006, this project will be completed and implemented prior to the 2007 season as a matter of urgency.

In closing, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of the Junior Competition Committee who have joined with me in looking 'outside the square' to develop strategies to boost junior numbers, improve the quality of the game and support and share ideas on how to best recruit players.

I thank my fellow board members for their support and in particular Helen Lewis for her assistance and advice throughout the year.

Development

2006 was again a busy year. We launched the season with the Dragon Boats on the Torrens Lake. This was a great day and an excellent opportunity for us to gather prior to the season start.

A mid season Club Executive meeting was well attended by clubs, airing points of view, clarifying issues and reaching consensus on the 11/13 rule. This rule will take full effect in season 2007, providing all clubs ample lead time to guarantee these teams. Nathan Aston, through his efforts and consultation through the Junior Competition Committee, is to be congratulated on the successful adoption of 11/13.

Clubs have been encouraged to draft proposals for local lacrosse competitions that might meet a need within their area or club. Such proposals need to be approved through LSA but models of delivery similar to the Indoor Contact Competition run at Blackwood, and the expansion of the Non Contact Competition at Croydon High School are good examples of developing our game outside the winter field competitions.

The Indoor Non Contact Competition has been held at three venues in 2006; Windsor Gardens and Westminster venues have returned and we added Croydon High School this year. Thank you to the West Torrens Lacrosse Club for developing the competition at Croydon.

The Mini-League concept was further expanded this year with a number of clubs fielding U 9 games at half time through senior matches. Congratulations to those clubs who were able to develop this opportunity.

Trish Adams has decided to try her hand in other areas and has resigned as our Development Officer. Trish managed this role very well for a number of years and her efforts, dedication and commitment to our sport are to be commended. Trish worked tirelessly over the period to introduce lacrosse to many people. Her work with the Japanese, both here in Adelaide and in Japan, has brought many rewards for the association, players, clubs and herself. Trish will continue to work with the Japanese for LSA.

I would like to thank all the board members and Helen Lewis for their support through the year, and look forward to the coming season.

This project is an initiative by the government to encourage typically inactive kids to get motivated for sport and physical activity. Lacrosse has been involved since the program began in 2005. This commitment usually means being involved in an eight week program, 1 hour per week, run after school hours. Deliverers must complete a training course which is free of charge and takes two days (some RPL applies). Lacrosse SA has about 20 qualified deliverers and sessions have been very successful with many schools requesting lacrosse as their first choice.

Primary and High School Lacrosse Championships

This year we decided to try and run a South-West and North-East combined Primary/High School Competition. Interest in both carnivals was high but the North-East carnival date was a show day for many interested. We tried to postpone and re-schedule without any success.

Next year the carnival will be run in Term 1 which should allow clubs to use the SAPSASA (Primary School) carnival as a good way to recruit potential players.

Thank you to the Glenelg Lacrosse Club for the use of the ground and facilities. Many volunteers were present on the day and put in a huge effort to help make the day a success. Feedback from the day was very positive with several making the initiative to contact me and ask about clinics etc.

Lesson Plans

Eight Week lesson plans were developed and posted on the Lacrosse SA website to assist coaches with the Active After School Program. This has also proven to be a great resource for teachers wanting to learn more about the sport, especially those in remote areas without access to clinics. The lesson plans can be easily adapted for shorter sessions and we have had great feedback from teachers and coaches alike.

Coaching Report

Over the year, we introduced application forms for all State/Zone staff positions, to allow better record keeping and conformance of applicants to requirements. It was disappointing that many applicants (including selectors) were not already Police cleared or had Play by the Rules in place, although many applicants were dealing with juniors at club level. Clubs need to address this without compromise. It is also disappointing that coach applicants were scarce on the ground and could, in many instances, only be appointed late in the process, giving very little lead time for preparation.

Most State/Zone coaches and managers have returned reports this year, allowing valuable feedback to be put into action plans, resulting in the re-writing of the Manager/Coach guidelines; the initiation of a U/17 Men's Development Squad and the initial development of a drill manual.

There were some 38 education opportunities offered, varying from short two hour courses to two day accreditation courses, from the Office of Sport and Recreation, Australian Strength and Conditioning Association, Dieticians Australian and Sports Medicine Australia. The feedback received was that no lacrosse coach took up any education or updating this year. There are currently only 8 accredited lacrosse coaches in South Australia.

One Lacrosse SA coaching seminar was offered this year, with two coaches attending. It is anticipated that two to three seminars will be offered next year, for which a budget allocation will be sought for external speakers. The new Coach Accreditation Scheme coursework was due out this year, but because of difficulties at a higher level, this was delayed, but will be rolled out next year.

Having filled a vacant position late 2005 I have worked to the best of my ability for the benefit of Officiating in SA and I trust to the benefit of the Sport in this State.

SAWLUA submitted a request for increased Umpire payments which, subsequent to negotiation and an agreement to meet achievable KPI's, was approved by Lax SA. There is still a way to go, however the effort made by SAWLUA was acceptable and every effort will be made during 2007 to complete the KPI's.

ALRA(SA) have achieved requests made by Lax SA and as their administration grows will be able to take on further responsibilities. The aim is to have ALRA(SA) have more dealings with Junior officiating, (Under 13's & 15's) and am sure that in the not too distant future this will be able to be implemented.

I congratulate SAWLUA and ALRA(SA) administrations on their achievements in 2006 and look forward

to working closely with both bodies in 2007.

I will be making some recommendations to SAWLUA with respect to their administration and succession planning for the future and ask that all supporters and umpires offer assistance when called over the next few years.

It is acknowledged that there have been some hiccups in the system with respect to the payment of Junior Umpires and Referees in season 2006 and I apologise for delays with respect to remedial action. These things are to be expected in the inaugural year of the Club Nominated Officials working with the Under 15's & U13's and I thank Clubs and Officials for their tolerance whilst these matter were resolved.

It is believed that we have controls in place for 2007.
