28A

28A. Any member of a club in the P.A.F.L.A. may play for any club in this Association other than that representing the district in which he resides on receiving the permission of this Association, which shall only be granted on the written application of such player within a period of four weeks after the commencement of the season's matches as arranged by the Association. Should such permission be granted and the player avail himself of it he shall play for no other club in this Association during that season.

Should the above rule come into force, rule No. 28 would require to be amended slightly in the direction of altering the clause in brackets so as to except players availing themselves of rule No. 28A.

Mr D. M. Steele gave notice of the following proposed addition to the rules:- "That in the event of the scores being level at the call of time, the play shall be continued until a goal has been scored by either side, the extra time not to exceed 15 minutes. If no goal is scored in that time the game shall be counted a draw."
