Executive Officer's Report

Once again this has been a challenging and busy year for the Board, Clubs, Volunteers and Staff of Lacrosse SA.

One of the on field highlights of the year was the fielding of six teams (four girl's and two boy's) at the ALA Under 15 Boy's and Girl's National Tournament, and the ultimate victory of the Girl's Comets team in this event. Please read Development Director Luke Oswald's Report for the rationale and development behind this team which was, in my opinion, a great strategic move.

As I said this time last year, selecting, training and all the preparations to organise representative teams, whether they go away, or play in Adelaide, is almost a constant process these days. Under the new governance structure trialled this year, the introduction of a Representative Teams Committee—Chaired by Lyndal Dinning was the first step in refining and standardising these processes. As I write the RTC is already planning for the U18 Girl's and Boy's Teams which will compete in the National Championships in Melbourne next year. The earlier we can appoint Coaches etc, the more successful these teams and our participation will be.

Congratulations and thank you to all the Coaches, Managers, Selectors and Players who have represented SA at any level this past 12 months. No matter the results, your commitment and effort is very much appreciated.

Off the field, the Board worked its way through the first year of a revised governance structure which meant a smaller Board, concentrating more on strategic issues, and greater responsibility for the various Committees for managing the operation matters within their sphere of control and making recommendations to the Board on larger issues. It hasn't been all smooth sailing largely due to some vacancies on the Board which has seen an increased work load for some members and in some cases the office, and some tasks being put on the back burner. Subject to the approval of the membership, the Board has decided to continue with the new structure for at least one more year. Hopefully a full Board will be elected for 2014, and the new structure will go from strength to strength.

Most other activities will be covered by the Director's reports in this report, but some perhaps additional ones to note include :

i-lax. Always popular and coordinated last year by Marilyn Fuss.

Japanese Lacrosse Camps. Several camps were held for visiting Japanese teams at the beginning of the year. It's great to work with our sponsor Bunnik Travel on these. Thank you to Trish Adams who largely manages the camps.

Mad March Lax Fest. This event was held at Yankallilla on the Fleurieu Peninsula and incorporated a Golf Day and a two day lacrosse event in which 138 players, including a large Japanese contingent participated. As well as being a pre-season hit out, the event raised funds to support the State Men's and Women's State teams and was organised by Tim Dickson under the LaxRatz Australia banner.

Australian Club Championship. This event was moved from its traditional time slot of the June long weekend due to the scheduling of the National Championships, and was played in October immediately following the Under 15 National Tournament. The Premiership Teams from 2012 plus a wild card were invited to participate in both the Men's and Women's event. In the end only Brighton (SA) and Newport (Victoria) participated in the Women's event – won by Brighton, while the last minute withdrawal of Williamstown (Vic) saw Brighton and Glenelg (SA) and Wembley and Bayswater (WA) participating in the Men's event – won by Bayswater. Thank you to Graham Hobbs and the Eureka Group for his generous sponsorship of this event.

Sponsorship. We have had a small but loyal band of sponsors this year and in recent years. We have found it hard to attract new sponsors and to retain the sponsors which were linked to Club purchases —eg Balfours and Carlton United. This portfolio is one which has fallen by the wayside with the restructure, and this needs addressing although it is not an easy task.

Sporting Pulse. This Membership and Results management data base really is the hub of many of our administrative functions. It went completely online this year which had some advantages, but also created some challenges for the office. Well done and thank you to those at the clubs who diligently entered results and kept their membership information up to date. There are some statistics which we need to be more diligent in collecting, and thorough date entry will be even more important .

360° Review Along with most funded sports in SA we participated in a 360° review conducted by the Office for Recreation and Sport. The resultant report will form the basis of an action plan for 2014.

Volunteer Recognition. Tammy Varga has been named as a finalist in the Sport SA "Official of the Year" Award. The winner will be announced on November 22.

This is my 10th and last Annual Report for Lacrosse SA, as I finish in my role at the end of November.

Our Administration Officer Tiffany Smith and I started virtually on the same day 10 years ago—she still at school, and working at Lacrosse SA part time as a Trainee, and me as an administrator with limited knowledge of the game. I like to think I have played a role in Tiff's development over the years, and she certainly has been invaluable to me. Thank you Tiffany.

I think the time I have had a full Board to work with while here could be counted in months rather than years—that is an ongoing problem for the Board and the Administration. Thank you to all the Board members who have assisted and supported me over the years, particularly the Presidents during my time—Helen Keane, Gary Mortimer, Colin Cunningham, Greg Hamilton and Bob Hewitson. Bob and Alan Carr have been on the Board for the entirety of my tenure here, and I'm very grateful for their support in particular. Thank you to the LSA Development Officers over the years —Trish Adams, Rebecca Hakendorf, and now, Marilyn Fuss.

To all Club Personnel, Officials, Players, Families, Sponsors, indeed all of the lacrosse community I have either worked with or had contact with over the years, I thank you for your support, and wish you all the best in the seasons to come.

President's Report

I have the pleasure to once again welcome everyone here to a Lacrosse SA Annual General Meeting.

As all clubs now know I am a very outspoken advocate of the junior compliancy policy and again we have increased our junior numbers, which is what the policy is designed to achieve. The LSA board has agreed to the JLC recommendation that compliancy will again be applied in season 2014 in the same format as it was for this year regarding the age grouping, and the further JLC recommendation that compliancy become gender specific not club specific.

The U13 Boy's Competition, for the first time in many years, had every club field a team, while the U13 girl's competition maintained the 2 divisions. This alone demonstrates that compliancy policy is working and that all clubs need to get on board and be a part of advancing our sport and stop trying to undermine the good work that has been done by the progressive clubs. I add a reminder here that the recruitment and retention of all junior players is the club's responsibility. The Association's role is only to assist clubs in this matter, through our Development Coordinator Marilyn Fuss .

An historic event occurred for lacrosse during the season with the completion of the "Grand Stand" at the Woodville Hockey Club at Finsbury. This facility is there for us to enjoy for the remaining tenure for Lacrosse at this venue.

LSA thanks Graham Hobbs most sincerely for this structure— it is a great sheltered viewing area to watch lacrosse. Thanks again Graham it is most appreciated as is all of your support for Lacrosse in our state.

It seems that every year I make the following comment in my report and again in 2013 we have seen the disappointing trend of significant portfolio holders resigning during the year. This again forces the Board to make changes to its structure and asks members to take on extra duties. This year it was a lot harder as everyone was just learning what was expected of them and on top of it all had to pick up on someone else's portfolio. There were occasions during the year we were unable to run a properly constituted meeting due not having the required quorum. This must change if our game is to continue to progress. We are currently burning out our willing workers and as everyone knows we are all time poor and there is only so much time a volunteer can put into an amateur sport such as ours. I take this opportunity to again thank the 2013 Board members for their untiring efforts and time that they put in to keep the Board working. Clubs and members must understand that the Board and the LSA office cannot give them the time and service they sometimes demand with the extra work they are required to do due to the reduced number on the Board. Unfortunately the game could suffer accordingly.

This year was the first full year of the "new" LSA Board structure that has been put into place with more focus on the strategic plan that was developed in consultation with clubs back in 2011/12, allowing the Competition committees to have more autonomy in running the competitions. These committees are not running satisfactorily as club reps are still hung up on their own agenda, making it very hard for the Competition Directors to progress this new concept; however they do appreciate the added responsibility that is now attached to their roles on these committees. I believe we still have a way to go before we get any meaningful value from these competition committees, and a lot more education is required before we make any great progress. The new restructure relies heavily upon clubs choosing the right person to represent them on the competition committees and more importantly when making a personnel change briefing them as to the clubs stance on any minuted subject.

The U15 National Tournaments were held here in October at Barratt Reserve and were organised and run by LSA staff along with a small band of helpers led by Board member Lyndal Dinning. My special thanks and congratulations to all those who were involved on an excellent job well done—it was a very successful event, well managed. A special mention must be made and my congratulations go to the U15 girls "Comets" team for winning this year's girls tournament—only the second time a SA team has won an U15 Tournament. This team consisted of players from the "IGSSA" schools and was entered for the very first time, achieving the ultimate result. They were very well coached by Sarah Falcione, Courtney Hobbs and Tim Dickson and managed by Judy Thurgood. LSA entered 4 girls and 2 boys' teams, also a first for this age group of players. A further indication of the growth in junior numbers and the improvement that is currently taking place at the junior girl level.

I personally would like to give a huge thanks to all of the LSA Board Members for their efforts during 2013 and a special mention to Mark Basham for the manner in which he managed the Women's Competition during some very challenging occasions. Mark, as have all the LSA Board Members, truly has the game of lacrosse at heart and all have worked exceptionally hard in 2013 to keep our game progressing to the standard and expectations of the SA lacrosse people.

Also a special thanks to our Executive Officer Helen Lewis who will be leaving us at the end of November. Helen has had a great impact in this position since joining us in February 2004; she has made many lacrosse friends over the years and has been held in very high regard by the wider sports community while pushing the Lacrosse cause. Her professional approach to her position will be sorely missed. Helen, on behalf of the Lacrosse community thank you very much and we all wish you well in whatever endeavour you wish to pursue in the future. Please don't become a stranger as you have many lacrosse friends.

To the office staff ,Tiffany Smith and Marilyn Fuss thank you also for your efforts in 2013. Next year will be "different" for you both and I look forward to working with you in 2014.

Financial Report

The following 2 pages are details of the financial statements (**subject to audit**) for the 12 months concluded on 30th September 2013 - prepared on an accruals basis. Accruals basis means income still to be received after 30th September, but relating to the 2012/13 financial year is included (and is shown in debtors in the balance sheet) - and conversely expenses paid after 30th September but relating to the 2012/13 financial year are included (and shown in the balance sheet as creditors).

The "bottom line" shows a \$5133 surplus for the year. You can analyse from the statements which income or expense items have gone up or down from the previous year, and the obvious major increase in expenses is in regards to insurance where LSA took out player insurance for the first time in many years. Whilst it may appear to be a large jump in office rental from the previous year, we were "hit" with a \$2400 bill for back-payment of electricity this year which had not been accounted for previously.

The Club debtor amounts shown in the balance sheet were the amounts outstanding as at 30th September (and unfortunately many of those amounts were not actually invoiced from the office until after 30th September - hence it is not a huge surprise that they were not paid before 30th September). The amount in the balance sheet of \$1670 showing as "sundry debtors other" conservatively only includes amounts which have been paid since 30th September.

Other items to explain might be "prepaid expenses" which is part of our insurance which was paid "up front" but really covers the period up to April 2014. Also "receipts in advance" is amounts regarding state representative teams (mainly under 15's) paid just prior to 30th September for which the associated expenses against those moneys had not been paid out at that point in time.

The sundry creditor amount is mainly referee and umpire payments from the 2013 season which have been paid after 30th September.

Unfortunately due to circumstances I was unable to actually attend any of the LSA Board meetings during the year, but I did present financial reports to each meeting. I am happy to commit to continue in a similar way for the foreseeable future if that is acceptable to members.

Women's Competition Report

The Women's Lacrosse Committee, as it is now named, is responsible for running women's lacrosse in SA and as Director of Women's Competition, I chair this committee.

Fortunately, in 2013 we have continued to have excellent people on this committee where there is often spirited but rational and positive debate, and significant issues regarding the future direction of women's lacrosse are discussed and decided.

The major issues for the 2013 season have been the implementation of Women's State League rules into Divisions 1 & 2 and U18s, the disaffiliation of SAWLUA and associated umpiring issues and without a doubt, the number 1 – Park 25 and car parking!

On the car parking issue, we ended the season on a high note. After over a year of negotiations, with Adelaide City Council installing gates on the car park to Park 25, as of the 2014 season, the only people able to park there on Saturdays are those we let in. With the Women's Lacrosse Committee voting to continue using Park 25 as the base for senior games in 2014, life there will be much easier than 2013. We also will continue to use Finsbury Lacrosse Field, now with the added goodness of the wonderful stand thanks to Graham Hobbs.

The implementation of the WSL rules (for those not in the know, effectively it mainly means that the players can continue to run even after the umpire blows the whistle for a foul, making the game faster and a better spectacle; alongside some other changes) went very well I believe.

Umpiring is always a topic on which everyone has an opinion. To bring women's lacrosse umpiring in SA to an administrative, coaching and on field level of excellence (to bring many more up to the International level of three of our officials) I believe we need to copy the ALRA (SA) model of having a large core group of umpires who are dedicated to umpiring, assessing and administration of umpiring rather than playing. This will take time and sacrifice for some – but ultimately women's lacrosse and those individuals will be the richer for it.

Our Women's State League competition is arguably the best women's club competition in the world, and along with the other divisions provided some excellent sport playing and viewing this year. Congratulations to the Premiers Brighton, Adelaide University and Glenelg, but also to all participants for getting out there and having a go, A special congratulations to the team who finished last in Div 2 – North Adelaide Red – for not just turning up but improving through the season with a team of almost all first year players – lacrosse was better for their team competing and I hope we can see many more like them in the years to come!

I give my sincere thanks to the wonderful support of Helen Lewis, Tiffany Smith, Bob Hewitson, Tammy Varga, Kari Borges and many others who assisted me this season in my role and that of Women's Registrar, and to Graham Hobbs and the Eureka Group for ongoing sponsorship of our competition.

I also give thanks and my admiration to the players, officials, coaches, volunteers and spectators who make up our wonderful game. Special thanks to those who sacrificed so much to represent, and to help those who represented Australia (including the umpires!), and South Australia in the sport they love. You inspire me.

We have the best sport on the planet; and we need to continue to work together to ensure we make it a success in every way possible.

Junior Competition Report

I would like to thank Bob Hewitson who acted as Junior Competition Director and Chaired the Junior Lacrosse Committee for most of the season and Natalie Clark Reynolds who does a fantastic job with the minutes.

At the beginning of the season the U17 competition for boys struggled and thanks goes to those clubs who rallied around to ensure we had a competition. The U15 girls competition commenced with two divisions, however after the first round it was

decided to go with the one division due to a couple of teams dropping out.

The new rules for U18 girls (Women's State League rules) was successful and it was agreed to continue for the coming years.

Congratulations to the Junior teams who were successful in winning premierships. There's a complete list at the end of this report.

The U11 Boys and Girls and U8 mixed zone competition was successful again this year. It was noted that the North area did not have as many teams and depending on nominations for 2014 consideration may need to be given to rezoning. Discussion has been held on having all the U8s and U11 all played at SACA, however parking is a big issue and playing at Clubs also gives the opportunity for clubs to showcase lacrosse in their area and introduce parents to the club environment.

Junior compliance this past season included the need to have a minimum of five correct age players when nominating a team at the beginning of the year, and then to play in the finals. The intent of this was to prevent an Under 15 team (for example) being made up of mainly under 13 players playing two games in a day. Also, players were only permitted to play one age level above their playing age group eg an Under 13 player could play Under 15s, but not Under 18s.

In regard to the compliancy rule for 2014 season it was agreed by the Board that it will be compulsory to have:

- One U15 boy's and girl's teams
- One 13 boy's and girl's teams
- Two U11 boy's and two U11 girl's teams

However, the compliancy rule will be gender specific, so if clubs meet the criteria of filling all their girls teams then their senior women will play for full points, even if the boys don't fulfil their requirement and vice versa.

Congratulations to all those involved in the U15 tournament which was a great success and a credit to you all.

After the U15 tournament ALA agreed to consider the age groupings across the states, with a view to achieving consistency and the maximum opportunity for growth. They will be conducting a review with subsequent recommendations for the 2015 season.

On the local front, and in light of this it has been agreed that there will be no change to our age groupings for season 2014.

Thank you to Marilyn Fuss who does a great job assisting clubs with clinics and liaising with schools on their behalf. Clubs, keep in mind that it is up to you to provide Marilyn with assistance with the clinics and to be the future contact with schools.

The JLC is reviewing the junior rules to ensure they are correct and clearer to understand for the coming season.

Mouth guards for 2014 season will be brought in for all junior boys U13 and up.

It was agreed that having a separate grand final for Juniors was very successful that that the practice should continue for the 2014 season.

Development Report

This was my third year in the Development portfolio, and again the focus of my efforts has been to encourage the growth of lacrosse by establishing school teams.

High School Competition

The 2013 High School Competition had both boys' and girls' matches played at Park 21W in the south park lands, with the girls' matches previously having been played at Walford. This added to the atmosphere of the competition with all matches being played at the one venue for the first time since the competition's first year in this format in 2009. Once again, there were junior (Years 7-9) and senior (Years 10-12) divisions for both girls and boys, playing 6-a-side on a smaller sized field.

This year's competition was enhanced with increased promotion with the help of WhoWon.net.au. WhoWon is a website that covers high school, university and representative sport with video highlights of sporting matches and interviews of players. By working with WhoWon, we engaged many of the competition participants by posting video interviews and match highlights online. Many thanks to Peter Keane who liaised between Lacrosse SA and WhoWon, filming and photographing matches each week.

The competition produced four different winners, with first-time winners in both the senior girls' and boys' divisions:

Junior Boys: Rostrevor College

Junior Girls: St Michael's College

Senior Boys: Immanuel College

Senior Girls: Cabra Dominican College

In total the High School Competition had 125 participants (61 boys and 64 girls), with 6 teams from 3 schools in 2 divisions of the boys' competition, and 7 teams from 7 schools in 2 divisions of the girls' competition.

It is worth noting that this Competition is bringing new players to the sport, from both the boys' and girls' competitions. In particular the work that Glenelg has put into Immanuel has seen several boys recruited to their U15 and U17 boys' teams and should be seen as an example, along with others from previous years, that investment in the competition will produce results.

Many thanks to everyone who helped run the Lacrosse SA High School Competition this year, including coaches, referees, umpires and other helpers.

University Competition

The SA Challenge competition between the three SA universities featured lacrosse for the third time on 15 July this year. Played at Flinders University's gym, there were four teams, each university again being represented, and Adelaide Uni entering two teams. There were 18 participants this year, down from last year's 28, with several potential participants unavailable to take part, or not responding to invitations. In any case, those who took part enjoyed the day's event, with UniSA winning the tournament for the first time.

In addition to the SA Challenge, a national intervarsity 5-a-side tournament was organised on 12 October, to coincide with the traditional Intersarsity (field lacrosse) matches between Adelaide and Melbourne University Lacrosse Clubs. For enrolled students only, the three SA universities entered, as well as Melbourne Uni and a combined NSW universities team also came over to add some interstate flavour. The team from New South Wales won the tournament final in a tight contest against UniSA to take the inaugural trophy.

Monash University were to compete but pulled out at the last minute, and James Cook University in Cairns, with a newly formed lacrosse club this year, were keen to compete but by the time they were committed to participate the airfares to Adelaide had become excessive. We hope to see these two universities and hopefully a couple of others take part in a larger tournament next year. The ultimate aim is for lacrosse to be included in the Australian University Games, which will significantly raise the profile of the sport and growth the game across the country, both in established and developing lacrosse centres.

"Comets" – IGSSA Representative Team at ALA Under 15 Nationals

By far, the highlight for the development portfolio this year was the formation and subsequent success of the IGSSA representative team – the "Comets", who debuted in this year's ALA Under 15 Nationals, and won every match to win the tournament!

The idea for the creation of an IGSSA representative team to compete in the U15 Nationals was taken to the board last year. The motivation behind it was to provide IGSSA with the opportunity to field a representative sports team to compete at a major tournament – something not offered by other sports in IGSSA's programme – thereby giving lacrosse a unique opportunity to students at IGSSA schools. By being able to offer to IGSSA what other sports do not, I hope to raise the profile of lacrosse among IGSSA schools, and give more weight to the case for adding lacrosse to IGSSA's sports programme.

IGSSA – the Independent Girls' Schools Sports Association – is a group of ten independent schools who provide regular Inter-school sports competitions across different sports. Being a group of only ten schools makes IGSSA a small target, one which lacrosse can use its limited resources on which to make a maximum impact. With Wilderness having an established lacrosse programme, St Peter's Girls well on the way towards matching Wilderness, and Seymour entering a lacrosse team in the winter competition this year, we now have 3 of the 10 IGSSA schools taking part in the winter competition, with a further three (Immanuel, Walford and Westminster) involved in the high school competition. It is my goal that lacrosse establishes in the majority of IGSSA schools such that lacrosse can make a case to be officially added to their sports programme, helping entrench lacrosse as a school sport. By targeting the school sports association, in addition to the individual schools, ensures the long term establishment of lacrosse at the member schools, as well as opens doors to setting up lacrosse at other member schools.

With three IGSSA schools fielding teams at the U15 level and a handful of other players attending IGSSA schools, and the 2013 tournament being held in Adelaide, I believed that this year was the ideal time to form this team. Girls from Wilderness, St Peter's Girls, Concordia, Immanuel, Seymour and Walford tried out for the Comets, with the final selected team naturally consisting a majority of players from Wilderness, with several from St Peter's Girls, and one each from Concordia and Immanuel.

Many thanks to Tim Dickson for his unqualified support in the concept from the outset. His firm belief in the development of lacrosse as a school sport has kept up my determination and made my work so much easier. Thanks also to the LSA board for putting their faith in a radical venture, including Lyndal Dinning and Mark Basham who convinced the sceptics where I couldn't. Thanks to Courtney Hobbs and Sarah Falcione who came on board and with Tim did a brilliant job of coaching the girls, and to Judy Thurgood as team manager, who also convinced several Wilderness girls who otherwise would not have participated in the tournament, to take part and ensuring the Comets would be at full strength.

While I believed the Comets would be competitive, they defied everyone's expectations (except Mark who predicted early on that they could win the tournament – I will seek his advice for next year's footy tipping competition) to go through the Nationals undefeated. Thanks to the support of everyone involved, this will make it much easier for lacrosse to convince new schools to set up lacrosse programmes of their own.

Independent Schools Junior Girls' Sports Group (ISJGSG)

This year Marilyn Fuss and I met with representatives from the ISJGSG with a proposal to conduct a lacrosse competition for member schools. ISJGSG is a school sports association for primary school girls up to Year 6, and consists of 15 schools, including all IGSSA (senior) schools, with a few other independent and Catholic schools. It was resolved that Lacrosse SA will run a

lacrosse competition for ISJGSG for girls in Years 4-6 on Wednesday afternoons in Term 4, beginning in 2014.

The fantastic outcome from this is that there will now be a school lacrosse competition that has official sanctioning from a school sports governing body, with all member schools being encouraged to take part. A co-current but separate competition for boys, particularly targeting the ISJGSG schools who are coeducational, will also be organised. The lacrosse community will be required to provide coaches and umpires, and club representatives will be contacted shortly to recruit coaches and umpires to help run this competition.

A big thank you to Lacrosse SA's Development Coordinator Marilyn Fuss, who has done so much for our sport, and has been responsible for bringing so many new players to lacrosse. Without her energy and passion we will not have seen the addition of school teams that is bringing optimism and belief that lacrosse can indeed succeed as a school sport in South Australia, and is the way forward for growing our sport in our state. Thanks also to Helen Lewis and Tiffany Smith at the Lacrosse SA Office for the assistance they have provided, responding to my many requests, and to Bob Hewitson and the LSA Board for its continual support, advice and help on various projects.

I will be stepping down from my role at the AGM as I take a break to enjoy the next phase of my life, with a child due in the new year. I hope that someone will willingly and enthusiastically take on this role and help take it forward along a similar path.

My main shortcoming while in this role is that I have not properly set up a Development Committee, one which will be crucial to ensure that the programmes that have been set up will continue, prosper and grow. By identifying priorities and various development programmes, the workload can be shared, with projects allocated to a number of people, to ensure that these programmes can be safeguarded and continue uninterrupted. I hope that my successor will make the establishment of such a committee one of their first tasks!

Lacrosse is a fantastic and unique sport with something to offer for everyone. With belief in our product and innovation to provide maximum exposure of lacrosse using our resources at hand, the future of our sport is assured.

Development Coordinator

As Development Coordinator, two of my achievements for this year were the running of our annual SAPSASA event at Park 25 where we had 450 students in 68 teams from 13 schools and Woodville's Carnival where we had 200 students in 25 teams from 3 schools. We ended up recruiting a whole team of U11 girls from Star of the Sea and Grange Primary from this event.

These events are paramount in getting lacrosse out into our schools and it's at schools where our future lacrosse players will come from. ACHPER also run sporting carnivals each year during PE week, involving lacrosse. Here we get to showcase our sport to 10 or more schools, and from this I have formed friendships with PE teachers and have been given the opportunity to revisit their schools to run lacrosse clinics.

The other big lacrosse event for the year is the Tea Tree Gully SAPSASA sporting carnival – during this week I run lacrosse clinics for 600 kids from 14 schools in an area which is a gold mine for recruiting. I hope this coming year to tap into this area and recruit whole school teams.

Along with all this exposure of our game to large groups, there are the many clinics run at schools during the year. Thank you to all those who have assisted me at these clinics.

We had a record number of U13 girls teams again this year with 7 teams in each of the two divisions. This grade will continue to grow with the increasing number of colleges we have on board. The College teams who played this year were Wilderness, St Peters, St Aloysius, Cabra, Loreto, and Seymour.

We have cemented our position with IGSSA and ISJGSG with the entering of the IGSSA (Comets) team into our U15 tournament. The fairy tale ending of them winning the tournament has opened up the biggest recruitment tool we could have hoped for. All schools, and especially the independent colleges with their existing rivalries love to win trophies. The Junior ISJGSG commission will almost certainly sanction the running of a Junior lacrosse comp in 2014 – once this happens that side of our sport will grow exponentially. There are quite a number of co-ed schools in the IGSSA group so at the year 4/5 level we will be encouraging these schools to enter boys' teams as well.

Our Colleges are already preparing for the 2014 season which means they will do the recruiting for us. At this point in time we have Cabra, St Peters, Seymour, Loreto and St Aloysius all adding lacrosse to their curricula which means not only do they offer lacrosse as a school sport but the infrastructure is already there. If every club had one or two colleges that they called their own, their recruitment would almost take care of itself.

I believe that the backbone of our sport is our juniors and I am passionate about recruiting more juniors in 2014.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my role this past year and look forward to the challenges in the year to come.

Promotions Report /Representatives Team Chairperson

This year was a year of change for this position. With the change to the Association's governance structure and the transition of the Board to smaller group, the position of Director of Promotions transitioned to that of Representative Teams Committee Chairperson. The Director of Promotions was not part of the smaller "7 Board" and was therefore not required to attend all Board meetings.

A broad description was developed for the duties of this position and they were as follows:

- Input to and monitoring of Representative Team selection policies and procedures
- Oversee process of team selections and liaise with Coaches
- Appoint Rep and State Coaches and Management in conjunction with committee and the Director, Coaching
- Liaise with Board via the Director of Administration
- Attend 4 Board meetings

Being the first year of this position I did find it very challenging at times. I appointed a Committee which consisted of Cathy Conaghty, Jodi Morton, Lynton Arscott and Tiffany Smith.

This group represented a cross section of roles Cathy as Senior Women's Coach, Lynton as Senior Men's Manager, Jodi as Under 15 Manager and Tiffany as the staff member responsible for much of the administration relating to our representative teams. Unfortunately it took us quite some time to have our first meeting. In hindsight I should have forced it earlier but it was hard to find a time when everyone was available. We were able to look over the selection criteria for the Under 15's and make a change which saw us come into line with the ALA policy which was that Under 13's Girl's & Boy's who were 12 years of age as of the 1st January could trial for the Under 15 Tournament Sides. This criteria change saw us have nearly 60 girls and approximately 40 boys at the trials. It has been many years since I have seen that many Under 15's trialling. With the introduction of the IGSSA girls team this enabled us to have four teams in the girl's tournament and for the first time in a long time two teams in the boy's tournament. We were also able to get new uniforms for all the Girls Under 15's teams which might I add looked absolutely fantastic.

Our appointment of Coaches and Managers this year was taken very seriously. With this in mind it has enabled us to now look at how we appoint these Coaches and Managers for the 2014 season. With the assistance of the Coaching Director Stacey Appleton and Bob Hewitson we are now putting together new criteria on how the positions are appointed. I feel if I am to continue with this position in 2014 I will have a better knowledge of how to fill this position and that 2013 was only a dress rehearsal. If we are to have successful representation at all levels from South Australia we need to have more procedures in place and become more professional in the way we go about things. Our test run for these new procedures will come in to place for the selection on the up and coming Under 18 Tournament to be held in Melbourne next April.

I would like to thank a few people for their ongoing support this year. Firstly of all my committee. Without them I would not have been able to put together any of our teams this year. Two of those committee people really do stand out and they are Jodi Morton and Cath Conaghty. Definitely two people you want on your committee when you want things done.

The other person I would like to thank is Helen Lewis. I don't think anyone really has an appreciation for the work that this lady puts in. She has been my sounding board and without her knowledge and understanding I don't think I could of have carried out my duties for the whole year. To replace Helen is going to take a mammoth effort and I think everyone will start to realise how much she really did do to help the game of Lacrosse in the time she was with us.

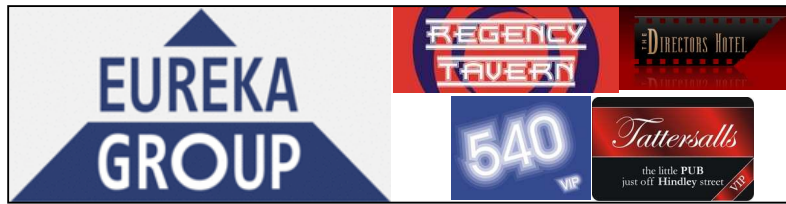
