The net cost of the Sydney trip after allowing for the contribution of £5 from each Member of the team amounted to £28 qs. 6d.

Your Committee wish to place on record their high appreciation of the valuable services rendered by the Hon. Secretary, Mr. F. A. Hughes, whom pressure of private affairs now compels to relinquish the position. His efforts have always been most energetic and zealous in the interests of Lacrosse.

In conclusion, your Committee desire to thank the President and Vice-Presidents for the assistance accorded the Association during the year, and also to acknowledge the courtesy of the Press in giving publicity to the game when occasion required it.

In retiring, your Committee commend the interests of the game to your enthusiasm during the coming season, and trust that every Member will do his best to introduce new players to the game, and use every effort to advance Lacrosse in Queensland.
