COUNCIL MEETINGS

There have been 3 meetings of Council since the Annual Meeting held in January 1965. The first of these meetings was held during the duration of the A.L.C. Senior Championships in Perth in July. Two further meetings, one in Melbourne and one in Adelaide, were also held. The bulk of the business at these meetings was a complete re-write of all the current A.L.C. Laws of Lacrosse. This enormous task is now complete and is on the agenda for the current meeting.

STATE OF THE GAME.

An analysis of the registration figures set out below shows a decline in the total number of him registered players in both South Australia and Victoria. This is a matter of deep concern and Council looks to Member Associations to make every effort to check this downward trend.
