B. QUEENSLAND LACROSSE.

This matter is the subject of a separate report, however, deep regret must be recorded that, after the wonderful work done by Mr. Harold Evans in reviving Lacrosse in Brisbane, the Game has lapsed for want of support and enthusiasm on the part of players.

C. MURNILLUMBAH PROJECT.

Unfortunately, due to a change in occupation and a move to Sydney by Howard Michalski, any possibility of furthering this project is now nil.

As the Michalski family have now moved to Victoria, and as the equipment at Murwillumbah was not required in Queensland, in order to ensure the safeguard of the equipment, arrangements were made with Mr. Cleve Weatherill to have the equipment picked-up and safely stored. This was done at no cost to Council. Council's direction will be sought on the destination of the equipment.

D. CANBERRA PROJECT.

This matter is covered in a separate report, however, it can be recorded that the N.S.W. equipment previously held by

Mr. Phil Dadd, is now in Canberra to undergo checking and repairing. This equipment was also moved at no cost to Council.

E.GENERAL

(i) S.A.L.A.

The S.A.L.A'S. War Memorial Pavillion has now been completed, and was officially opened on May 31st.

It is proposed to claim an Australian and World record for M. Raggatt in scoring 204 goals in the one season.

(ii) V.A.L.A.

D. Fox of the Surrey Park Club won the Australian Fairest and Best Award at the recent A.L.C. Senior Championships, and he was named as Captain of the Australian Team.

The Williamstown Fearon "Al" grade team went through season 1970 undefeated, making this the second successive year they have achieved this feat.

(iii) W.A.L.A.

The 1970 Annual Gala Day was again a successful event, the winners being Wembley with 123 aggregate points. Nollamara were second with 93 points, and third was Nedlands/Subiaco with 79 points.

3. 1970 ACTIVITIES.

A. LANCERS VISIT.

The visit of the U.S.A. team, the Lancers of Baltimore, was an eminently successful event from all aspects. The match play, the social activities, the friendships formed and the organisation, were all something of which Australian Lacrosse can be proud.

The reaction of the Lancers will be conveyed in the International Liaison Officer's report, and details of activities in the various States will no doubt form portion of each State Association's Delegate's report.

For the first time ever, a foreign visiting International team took part in an Australian Lacrosse Championship series. The Lancers formed the fourth team in the 1970 Senior Championship series, taking the place of the customary second team fielded by the Host State. The matches against The Lancers were played in a wonderful spirit, and valuable Lacrosse lessons were learned by all participating teams.

As a culmination to the Senior Championships held in Adelaide, the Lancers played an Australian team. Whilst Australia won 17 goals to 13, the Lancers were far from disgraced or outplayed.

Among the benefits derived from the Lancers visit should be an added stimulus to all Australian Senior and Colts players to strive harder than ever to be members of the Australian International Overseas team, if a tour takes place in 1972; and to all players, including Juniors, to strive for representation in the World Series expected to be staged in Australia in 1974.
