## VICTORIAN AMATEUR LACROSSE ASSOCIATION

Gentlemen,

Your Committee presents for your consideration and approval the 76th Annual Report, Statement of Income and Expenditure and Balance Sheet for Season 1954.

It is considered that definite progress has been made during the year, to be in a position early in the new 1955 Season to embark on a drive to secure new Clubs and added Members, as satisfactory equipment is now available in quantity.

### MEMBERSHIP --

The Season opened late in April with teams entered in Premiership contests arranged for the five sections, whilst again 5 teams from High and Technical Schools competed in the Mid-week Competition.

Each Saturday games were staged, and the total registered players numbered 536, which was an increase of 20 on the previous year.

This slight improvement in numbers, whilst an increase on last year, is not pleasing, and strenuous efforts must now be made to arrest the recent drift, and each Club should endeavour to secure the support of a School team to compete in the Under Age sections, as such action would provide a steady flow of recruits each year for the Open Age sections after such players cease to qualify for the Under Age teams.

### RESULTS --

The sincere congratulations of all Lacrosseurs go to the successful Clubs, and particular reference must be made to the outstanding performance of the Malvern Club.

In winning the Premiership of A, Under 16 and Under 14 Sections, the Malvern teams were also undefeated, and this remarkable result is given added emphasis when it is remembered that the A and Under 16 Section teams were also undefeated Premiers in 1953. This victory was the fifth consecutive win for the Malvern Blacks in A Section.

Camberwell-Glen Iris also repeated their success of last year in B Section and this year were also undefeated Champions.

Caulfield were again successful in C Section for the second year, and their team deserves full credit for their victory as after the home-and-home game they finished in fourth place and to win the honours had to defeat the three teams then ahead of them.

The President will tonight present medallions and trophies to the respective winners.

Eleven teams competed in the Under Age Sections, one less than for 1953, but keen competition was enjoyed in each section, notwithstanding the superiority of Malvern.

As previously stated, all Clubs should endeavour to sponsor an Under Age team to develop their future potential of players, and Club officials are assured of Association support in any move in this direction.

MID-WEEK COMPETITION --

As in previous years, a mid-week competition was arranged for play between the various High and Technical Schools each Wednesday, and Mr. T. Leonard is thanked for his organisation and control of these series of games.

After the completion of games played, Melbourne High School were successful in winning the Cup, whilst University High School were runners-up.

It is desired to thank the respective Sports Masters of the various schools for their co-operation. It must be the endeavour of the Association next year to provide every assistance to these gentlemen and schools to ensure the proper coaching of the boys, and with the hope of adequate equipment available the introduction of Lacrosse into new schools seems opportune, and here the support of Old Players and Association Officials will be necessary if the required results are to be obtained.

BEST & FAIREST PLAYER --

The honour of Best & Fairest Player for Season 1954 was won by Noel Jeffrey of Malvern Blacks, who polled 22 votes to gain possession of the Vince Healey Memorial Cup. R. Reddaway, also of Malvern Blacks, was runner-up with 16 votes, and our warmest congratulations are offered to these players, and the Malvern Club, on their performances.

INTERSTATE VISITS --

South Australia visited Melbourne late in July for the annual contest between South Australia and Victoria for the Bob Symonds Cup.

The game was staged at the Albert Cricket Ground, where, after an excellent exhibition of combined play, South Australia won 12 goals to 6.

We congratulate heartily South Australia on their success and also thank the members of the Victorian team, Mr. Tickner and Mr. Evans, for the efforts in the interest of Lacrosse in Victoria.

JUNIOR INTERSTATE VISIT --

Victoria journeyed to Adelaide in September, to play South Australia for the Schulz Cup in the Annual Junior Interstate Contest.

Mr. P. Shappere was the Manager, whilst the Coach was Mr. F. Gray.

A keenly-contested game resulted in a draw -- 16 goals each -- and each State is to be congratulated on the conduct of the players and the manner in which the game was played.

The South Australian hospitality was excellent, and the S.A.L.A. is to be sincerely thanked for making the visit so enjoyable; also those members who arranged the billeting of the members of the Victorian party.

Our sincere thanks are conveyed to Messrs. Shappere and Gray for the efforts made to ensure a successful visit.

GYMKHANA --

The Annual Gymkhana was again held at the Malvern Cricket Ground on Monday, June 9th, (Queen's Birthday) when an Interstate Trial game, six-a-side games, and other field events were held. Players were in the field from 10.30 a.m. to 4.40 p.m. and the comprehensive programme arranged by the Gymkhana Sub-committee progressed well to time, the events providing great interest throughout the day. The Committee is to be congratulated on its efforts, and this day is of great importance to Lacrosse in this State, as it is the only occasion during the Season when all Lacrosseurs can compete together.

FINANCE --

As a result of the following two proposals being accepted during the year, viz --

- i. The cost of sending the Junior Interstate Team to Adelaide this year should be met by the Clubs
- ii. The guernseys to be used by the Interstate Teams this year should be loaned from members of previous teams

the Association has been able to at least maintain its financial position of 1953, even after partially subsidising the purchase of a quantity of new sticks for junior players.

However, some method other than the use of general revenue will be necessary in the future if we are to fulfil our endeavour to foster the Game among the juniors.

If the suggestion as recommended by the Finance Subcommittee of approaching past players and supporters of the Game for loans, repayable over a period of three years, is adopted by the Association, then we shall be able to carry out our programme in its initial stage.

#### AUSTRALIAN LACROSSE COUNCIL -

The Australian Lacrosse Council met twice during the year, when items relative to the conduct of the game were discussed and Certificates of Merit approved for South Australia.

Our Delegate to the A.L.C. was Mr. J.M. Dobbie, who is thanked for his services, whilst our President, Mr. H.R. Balmer, was a Vice-President, and was valuable with knowledge and guidance in debate.

#### EXHIBITION GAMES -

On Sunday, August 29th, through the courtesy of Station 3DB and The Sporting Globe, your Association sponsored an exhibition demonstration of Lacrosse at the St. Kilda Cricket Ground before approximately 20,000 people.

It is to be hoped that this exhibition will have given the Game a fillip in this State, and our sincere thanks are expressed to Messrs. E. Selth, K. Waite, R. Ponton and K. Buchanan, together with the players, for their zealous support and interest in this feature.

During the Season trial games with different numbers of players a side were staged, for experimental purposes, and the information gained was valuable.

#### STICKS -

The supply of satisfactory sticks during the year was much improved, and the South Australian manufacturer, P.J. Brady, is deserving of our sincere thanks and support for the effort he has expended to provide a hickory stick comparable with that previously imported.

Earlier in the year our prospects of an adequate quantity were small, but a visit to Adelaide by Mr. A.L. Evans on behalf of the Association was most beneficial and satisfactory, and we must express our grateful thanks to the South Australian Lacrosse Association for their unstinted and practical support of our efforts to secure sticks early in the Season.

The Hickory Sticks have given quite satisfactory service, and your Association has placed an order with P.J. Brady for a further supply of 150 frames to be delivered before February 1955, and therefore we should be assured of adequate equipment to sponsor more Clubs next Season.

Clubs and Old Players are to be approached for assistance in meeting the anticipated cost of this parcel of sticks.

It will be the policy of the Association to distribute these sticks where practicable to schools and junior players, and during the year a method of distribution satisfactory to the High and Technical Schools was formulated and it is hoped that this system will prevail next year also.

#### COACHING -

This year for the first time a State Coach was appointed, and Mr. A.L. Evans carried out his duties with credit not only to himself but also to the Game, and his enthusiasm and knowledge, together

with the Lacrosse Film, was in keen demand by Clubs throughout the Season.

It is intended to continue the system of lectures next year, and all Clubs are urged to avail themselves of the opportunity of educating junior players into the Game correctly, through the guidance of the State Coach and other approved lecturers.

#### SOCIAL -

During the visit of the South Australians a Buffet Dinner and Dance was held at "The Gables", East Malvern, and we must record our grateful thanks to our Vice-President, Mr. Hugh Wood and his wife for their wonderful hospitality and the opportunity of entertaining our visitors in such congenial surroundings, and at the same time benefiting Association funds.

Also, during the year the State was visited by H.M.C.S. Ontario from Canada, and the Association invited members of the crew to play a game of Lacrosse at the University, after which the players were entertained at refreshments.

#### RULES AND BY-LAWS --

Early in the year the V.A.L.A. Constitution and Rules were revised and circulated to Clubs for their guidance. The Permit Regulations were also circulated, and the Developmental Sub-Committee has submitted a Report which is now under consideration, and various items, if supported by Clubs, would necessitate further amendments to the Rules.

The Executive Committee has also submitted for consideration at the Annual General Meeting a proposal dealing with the future administration of the Association generally, with the suggestion that it be put into force for twelve months for trial.

These items have been referred to the Clubs for consideration, and Club officials are urged to ensure their earnest consideration by members and Club executives.

#### PUBLICITY --

Again as in recent years we have been accorded good support by the Press, and results and articles have appeared regularly each week.

Through Stations 3AW and 3DB we have recorded the scores each Saturday, and this courtesy extended to our Association is greatly appreciated, and our thanks go to the Broadcasting Stations, Press and Press Correspondents for their efforts during the year on our behalf.

We express our sincere thanks to Mr. R. Goslin for his very valuable assistance in collating the scores each Saturday for the Radio and Press, and his unselfish support of the Game contributed largely to the general publicity afforded Lacrosse throughout the year.

#### INVESTIGATION COMMITTEE --

It was necessary to call this important Committee of our administration together only once during the year, and the members of the Investigation Committee are deserving of this Association's sincere thanks for their interest and careful deliberations on our behalf.

Mr. Dodgshun represented Victoria in 1953 and 1954 and in 1953 at the All Australia Carnival was selected in the Australian Team. His passing late in August was a shock to all Lacrosseurs, who mourn the passing of a fine gentleman and sportsman, and this was emphasised by the large assemblage of representatives of Clubs at the Memorial Services.

To all Members of Sub-committees your Association expresses thanks for their diligent attention to their various tasks, which assist to foster our Game.

RETIREMENT --

During my term of office for six years I have enjoyed my association with Members of the General Committee and Club Officials, and would like to express my thanks for their co-operation and help. May I also say a sincere "Thank you" to the Members of the Executive and Permit Committees, with particular mention to Mr. Tiokner and Mr. West, who have been most helpful and ever ready to co-operate fully in an endeavour to ensure the smooth functioning of the various aspects of our Game.
