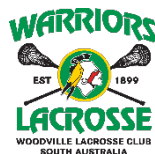

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

Over the past two years we have seen many interruptions to our participation opportunities in Lacrosse, with many events being cancelled.

With Marilyn commencing the year on personal leave, then taking long service leave, we advertised for a Sport Development Officer to fulfill her role, and unfortunately did not find the 'right' person amongst those applications, therefore did not end up employing anyone and utilised the experience of our overseas cohort who arrived in Australia earlier than usual. Whilst I do not feel like we reached anywhere near the number of participants that we would have liked to, we managed to get several carnivals up and running along with managing the Quick Stix program and delivering clinics as much as possible. At the end of the year Marilyn resigned from her position and I would like to sincerely thank her for her ongoing dedication and support over the last 12 years.

In 2022 the National Tournaments/Championships returned, even with a slight reschedule of the Lacrosse Australia (LA) Under 18 National Championship to July. Lacrosse SA (LSA) nominated Zone/State teams at all National events with fantastic participation and results from all representatives. I would like to mention the Under 18 Boys State Team (National Champions after a 20-year hiatus) and Girls Team who finished second, both teams keeping us on the edge of our seats during the finals, great team effort by all. Our senior men's and women's teams continue to fluctuate during years of a World Cup event, with many Australian players taking the field this year for SA – great to see. Our Under 15 Boys and Girls teams proved dominant against our interstate rivals showing some great potential for years to come. Another special mention to the Comets who were also named National Champions.

All State/Zone team coaches have now undertaken the coach education and development opportunities as part of the mandatory coaching framework provided by LA. The coach education and development offerings continue to grow the number and quality of coaches ensuring participants, players and athletes receive the best coaching, teaching and experience within lacrosse no matter what level of competition or experience. This Coaching Framework provides in-depth details regarding the different education opportunities, their purpose, curriculum, assessment requirements, current pathway and how the accreditation level link back to the LA Participation Framework.

The LA Coaching Framework is underpinned and linked directly to the LA Participation Framework. The LA Participation Framework utilises the Foundations, Talent, Elite & Mastery (FTEM) framework which has been endorsed by Sport Australia and widely adopted by other National Sporting Organisations. Each phase for the FTEM Model is critical to the development and growth of a participant, player or athlete. LA's coach education courses focus on three major areas of Coaching: The Coach, The Player, The Environment. Under each major area of coaching the LA has outlined key elements to design and program our education offerings. This allows the LA to provide a targeted, thorough, and progressive development process for all coaches.

Midway through the year, Lacrosse in Australia adopted the National Integrity Framework which came into effect on 11 July 2022. This framework was an important and great step forward for our sport to help us ensure lacrosse is a safe, fair environment for everyone who participates.

The National Integrity Framework is a suite of new integrity policies surrounding issues like child safety, member protection, illicit drugs, competition manipulation and others. As of 11 July 2022, all members of Lacrosse were bound by these policies.

In addition to the new policies, Lacrosse also adopted a new independent complaint handling process, run by Sport Integrity Australia. This meant that all members could raise any integrity concerns directly to Sport Integrity Australia, who will review each complaint, and make any disciplinary decisions.

As we commence the new year, we will be working with our Historian to facilitate digitisation of our collection to preserve the history of Lacrosse in South Australia, an area where we have not budgeted for previously.

Thank you to the many volunteers who continue to contribute to Lacrosse in many ways, without you we could not survive!

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On behalf of the Lacrosse South Australia Board, it is my pleasure to present the 2022 Annual Report and this Presidents Report.

The Board this year consisted of Stephen Mortimer – Director Men's Competition, Addie Cunningham – Director Womens Competition, Sue Hogan – Director Administration, Martin Baker – Director Promotions, Tim Guyatt – Director Officiating and Craig Schicker – Director High performance/Development.

Addie Cunningham continued to contribute while juggling participation in the local competition and the 2022 Australian Womens World Lacrosse team. Her contribution during this busy period while maintaining good connection with the club representatives is to be commended. Addie has advised that she will not be seeking reappointment to the Board for 2023.

Stephen Mortimer has continued to positively engage with the lacrosse community and has been proactive in taking on some of the more challenging tasks. His proactive and positive approach was most recently evidence by securing a significant quantity of quality artificial grass at nil cost as part of the longer-term goal to develop an outdoor box lacrosse venue.

Tim Guyatt has provided valuable input to the Board this year and continues to advocate for the unsung heroes of the sport, the Officials. Tim has advised that he will not be seeking reappointment to the Board for 2023.

Sue Hogan kept the Board administration matter under control and provided the Board with valuable and pragmatic advice when continuous topics were being discussed.

Craig Schicker maintained an excellent connection with the lacrosse community while commentating on LSA TV and through his involvement with club and state teams.

I would like to thank Marty Baker and the LSA TV team for their ongoing commitment to providing the lacrosse community with a great quality product which allows the opportunity to regularly watch the South Australian competition. From a personal perspective relocating to Canberra early in the year has meant a continuation of meetings via video conferencing platforms and LSA TV allowed me to stay connected with how teams were progressing. Marty has also been successful in securing a number of sponsors throughout the year which have assisted in offsetting some of LSA's costs.

2022 has continued to throw all of us challenges as we adapt to living with Covid 19 and seek to return to a new normal.

Following a number of years of consideration LSA moved from a per team to a per player approach to the recovery of the base costs that the Association incurs for running the competition. While initially this has caused some challenges in the longer term this approach is considered to be fairer.

I would like to recognise the LSA staff, in particular Giulia Marion. Again in 2022 Giulia spent many weeks trying to lock down the fixtures and on an almost daily basis clubs were advising of changes to the teams that they would be able to field. I would strongly encourage all clubs to consider the impact that this has and to use their best endeavours to seek to improve in 2023.

Unfortunately, this year, it was also observed that there was an increase in what can only be described as poor sportsmanship. Again, the LSA office was fielding multiple complaints and reports of incidents each week following the weekends games. As members of the Association, I asked that while encouraging enthusiasm for participation as a player, official or spectator that there is equal measure of respect also displayed.

As noted, I have relocated to Canberra and so will not be seeking re election to the Board in 2023. In closing I would like to thank the Board, all of the staff and volunteers for their support and contribution to the great sport of Lacrosse in South Australia for the five years that I have been involved at the state level.

NOTES TO THE FINANCE REPORT

Development Events: Deficit in income is due to the 6NLS competition not going ahead and purchases made prior to cancellation along with refunds.

Gate Takings: Significant reduction of income, difficult to determine if it was due to combination of teams participating in finals or the move back to Club hosting.

Team Nomination Fees and Levies: Adelaide University's senior men's fees have been deferred until a team is entered as they did not have a team this year.

Under 15 State Team Income: LSA used credit from Virgin to purchase airfares, hence a profit in this area.

Indoor Box Lacrosse Expense: in 2021 LSA purchased the boards, therefore significant decrease this year in expenses.

Long Service Leave Provisions (LSL): LSL was decreased as Marilyn was paid out in full following her resignation.

Wages and Superannuation: In the original budget provided to Club's the wages and superannuation expense included payments to employ a person to fulfill Marilyn's role while she was on leave, which did not eventuate.

Development Expenses: In the original budget provided to Club's the development expenses were higher, the decrease from this was primarily due to Trish offering to work at 50% of the normal rate given the current environment and significant increase of costs to Clubs.

DIRECTOR, ADMINISTRATION/FINANCE REPORT

This is my second year on the Board as Director, Administration and my main duties continued to be contributing to decisions of the board as well as taking the minutes; logging receipt of scoresheets.

Logging of scoresheets remains a challenge and time consuming for the following reasons:

- some scoresheets continue to be incorrectly filled in. This has been slowly but steadily improving
- some clubs on occasion send in several weeks' worth of scoresheets at once which creates quite a backlog. This is more harmful than it may seem as suddenly we need to sort a month's worth of sheets and file them across many rounds. We'd much prefer scoresheets be sent in every week
- delayed sending in of scoresheets also creates pressure on staff who enter in votes for end of season awards. This effect is pronounced towards the end of the season when there is a time crunch to tally all votes before ordering awards/trophies

This year we sent clubs a weekly reminder about missing scoresheets. This has improved things but is not something we should have to do as all clubs are already aware of their duty to submit the week's scoresheets.

HISTORIAN REPORT

As Lacrosse SA Historian I am aiming to have Lacrosse SA's collection of historical items digitised. This includes photographs, pamphlets, programmes, scoresheets, annual reports, minute books and any other item of historical interest.

The reasons for this are twofold. Firstly, preservation of the items so that they can be catalogued and safely stored away to prevent damage from exposure or excessive handling, and secondly to democratise our history by creating an online digital museum that can be accessed by anyone with an internet connection who may wish to research their sport, their club or players and officials. Our sport has such a rich history that needs to be preserved but also shared and celebrated, and on occasion I will publish photographs or articles of interest to the Lacrosse SA History Project Facebook page, which can be found at www.facebook.com/LacrosseSA.History

Earlier this year I applied to the History Trust of South Australia for a grant to fund the digitisation project, but was unsuccessful. I subsequently submitted another grant in the middle of this year and am currently awaiting the outcome of the application. Fingers crossed this one will be successful and the digital museum will become a reality!

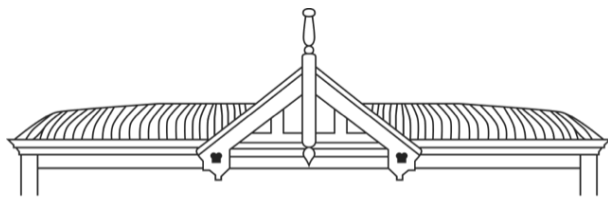
