Mr. President and Gentlemen,

In my last Annual Report to the Council I called attention to the serious falling off in the number of players as compared with previous years, stressing the feet that the game had lost over two hundred players for the season 1950.

of players as at July 1st this year and I regret to report that a further of 23 teams and 300 players is revealed.

From what I can gether New South Wales have coased playing while the Queensland Association is struggling along with a handful of players to keep the game alive.

The serious loss of players in Western Australia reported this year is most clarming, as no Association can suffer such a loss and remain an effective body unless steps are immédiately taken to stop the drift.

The losses reported from Victoria and South Australia are not so serious, but nevertheless are such as to cause grave anxiety as to the future. The reported loss of the Port Peri Association to the game is deeply regretted.

I submit the following suggestions as a means of helping restore the game to its former prestige.

- (1) Carnivals. Should these be suspended or reviewed?
- (2) Interstate visits to Sydney, Brisbene and Perth in 152.
- (3) Alteration to Laws to provide 10 players and smaller ground
