Mr. President & Gentlemen,

The following Report is submitted for your consideration and approwal.

Details are not available but indications are that the strength of the Game appears much the same as last Season. The position of Queensland appears to be in doubt as no advances were made in that State during the year.

The 1968 Season saw the introduction of A.L.C. Junior Championships, the details of which are set out later in this Report.

The V.A.L.A. has advised that they have formed a Committee to stage Box Lacrosse matches and Council will watch this experiment with great interest.

YEARS ACTIVITIES In July the 1968 Senior Championships were conducted in Melbourne and the Series proved the best for many years. For the first time since 1910 a Chempionships match was drawn.
