Gentlemen.

Your Committee presents for your consideration and approval the 74th. Annual Report, Statement of Income and Expenditure and Balance Sheet for Season 1952.

MEMBERSHIP

The season opened with 41 teams entered in premiership contests arranged for the five sections whilst again 5 teams from High and Technical Schools competed in the mid-week competition.

Each Saturday games were staged and the total registered players numbered 536, which unfortunately was a decrease of approx. 100 on the previous year.

This no doubt was due to the disbandment of the Power House Club, together with the revised playing conditions on trial for the season when teams comprised of only 10 members a side whilst in previous years they were 12-a-side.

Coburg and U.H.S.O.B. Clubs are deserving of warmest congratulations on their successes in B and C Sections respectively as in Coburg's case they were promoted from C Section this year and suffered only one defeat for the season whilst U.H.S.O.B. displayed outstanding form in the final series to convinceingly gain the honours and both Clubs should benefit materially by their success.

The President will present Medallions and Trophies to the respective winners tonight.

Again the Under-Age section were well supported by Clubs and the play in the final series indicated that these juniors are developing their game to a high degree which should be of great value to Lacrosse in future years and it is to be hoped that next Season there will be sufficient experienced and capable referees available to officiate these games.

All Clubs should endeavour to sponsor an Under-Age team to develop their future potential of players and Club Officials are assured of Association support in any step in this direction.

BEST AND FAIREST PLAYER

This season a Best and Fairest award was re-introduced and the Malvern Lacrosse Club generously provided a trophy to perpetuate the memory of the

late Vince Healy and the trophy is for perpetual competition and bears the title of the Vince Healy Memorial Cup.

The first winner of the trophy is D.H. Lee of M.H.S.O.B. Clubwho polled 27 votes whilst S.Quigley, Malvern, with 22 votes was runner-up.

Malvern Club also provided a permanent memento of the award whilst your Association is providing a framed colour photograph to the winner.

Our warmest congratulations are conveyed to Mr. Lee on his success whilst the Malvern Club earn the sincere thanks of all Lacrosseurs of this State.

MID - WEEK COMPETITIONS

As in the previous years a Mid-Week Competition was arranged for play between Schools each Wednesday and Vice President Mr. T. Leonard is thanked for his organization and attention to these series.

After a round of games, Melbourne High School were successful in winning the Cup with University High School runners pup.

Our sincere thanks and appreciation for the co-operation and help of the respective Sports Masters of the Schools is expressed to all.

INTERSTATE VISIT

The annual Interstate contest between Victoria and South Australia for the *Bob Symonds* Cup was played in Melbourne this season when the game was staged on the Albert Cricket Ground, which was in perfect condition and the the weather was good.

Players were in the field from 10.30 a.m. to 4.45 p.m. and the comprehensive programme arranged by the Gymkhana Sub-Committee progressed well to time, the events providing great interest throughout the day. The Committee is to be congratulated on its efforts and this day is of great importance to Lacrosse in this State as it is the only occasion during the Season when all Lacrosseurs can compete together.

Clubs were divided into two divisions according to size and points were awarded for the various events, the grand total aggregate providing the respective *Champions of the Day*.

METHOD OF PLAY

During the 1952 Season play was conducted under the amended conditions of the A.L.C. that is 10 men aside, ground length of 90 yards and centre circle of 10 yards diameter.

Much discussion has ensued on the conditions of play and the innovation has improved certain aspects of the game, but no decision has yet been determined on play for 1953 Season, but it is most likely that the A.L.C. will introduce certain amendments after their keen study of play during the past year as each State has analysed this conditions.

FINANCE

This year your Finance Committee recommended a change in policy, which was subsequently ratified by the General Committee, in connection with the meeting of the Association's financial commitments.

The provision of a Carnival Fund will make the financing of Carnival trips much more satisfactory.

Although clubs had heavier commitments to the Association Registration Fees, as well as a Carnival Fund Levy, they have maintained the previous year's efforts of all clubs being clear of debt with the Association at the end of the financial year.

Your Hon. Treasurer's thanks to all concerned is hereby penned. Your Association finishes this year in one of the best financial positions it has yet experienced.

EXHIBITION GAME

On Sunday August 24th. through the courtesy of Station 3 DB and The Sporting Globe, an Exhibition game of Lacrosse was staged at the St. Kilda Cricket Ground when two teams of prominent players were fielded and played before a crowd of over 35,000 people.

This exhibition should give the game a filip in this State and our

sincere thanks are expressed to Mr. E. Selth and his Sub-Committee for their fine work in presenting the game in such a spectacular manner.

STICKS

The continued lack of imported sticks is causing grave concern and this season a South Australian stick was introduced but early supplies were not satisfactory.

However after a visit to the factory of P.J. Brady of Adelaide prospects of an improved and superior quality stick are good and the matter is under the guidance of the Developmental Sub-Committee.

An initial order for 30 sticks has been placed with the manufacturer and it is hoped that these sticks will be available early in 1953 when they can be tested and further supplies obtained should the quality be satisfactory.

SOCIAL

During the visit of the South Australians in August a Dinner and Dance was arranged at *The Gables* East Malvern, through the courtesy and generosity of our Vice President. Mr. H. Wood.

Although not as well supported as hoped, over 140 were present and the finances of the Association benefited materially, mainly through the fact that Mr. Wood provided the amenities except liquor refreshment gratis and this very generous gesture is deserving of all members' warmest appreciation. To both Mr. and Mrs. Wood we express our grateful thanks for their tangible support, an action which was a repetition of Season 1951.

OLD PLAYERS AND REFEREES ASSOCIATION

The Old Players and Referees Association was active early in the season when a Social gathering was held at *The Gables*, but again the support was meagre and Old Lacrosseurs are very remiss in their support.

This reflects on Clubs and past members who appear only too content to enjoy the opportunity of playing for years, but cannot appreciate the fact that present-day players need their support just as much as they had support in their early days of playing.

It is with regret that we have to record the passing of the Hon. Secretary of the Association Mr. H.J. Hewett and his duties for the time being are in the care of Mr. P. Shappere who solicits the support of all Clubs and Old Players.

PUBLICITY

Again as in recent years we have been accorded good support by the Press and results and articles have appeared regularly each week.

Through Station 3 AW. we have also recorded the scores each Saturday and this courtesy extended to our Association is greatly appreciated and our thanks go to the Broadcasting Station, Press and Press correspondents for their efforts during the year on our behalf.

AUSTRALIAN LACROSSE COUNCIL

Mr. H.R. Balmer was again our Delegate to the A.L.C. and we thank him for his efforts on our behalf and wish him and his fellow members of the Council every success in their endeavours in the interest of Lacrosse in Australia.

The Australian Lacrosse Carnival will be staged next year in Adelaide and

a suggestion of a Colts Carnival in conjunction with the main events is being considered.
