#### **Executive Officer's Report**

Last year I said that some aspects of the past year had been very positive, others not so. 2006/07 has been no different. Like most organisations, and especially "minor" sports we are constantly presented with challenges, changes, differing ideas and viewpoints, frustrations, demands and difficulties. But that is interspersed with wonderful highlights, fun and camaraderie, and evened out by the love of the game and the commitment to it exhibited by the lacrosse community.

It is finding the balance between all these things, which is the most difficult challenge of all.

Happenings and events in 2006/07 included:

(There is a comprehensive list of the players, officials and volunteers who participated, coached, officiated or managed in various representative teams—from International to Zone Tournament teams. Many are also mentioned in the various Director's reports, so I won't repeat them here.)

LSA Indoor Lacrosse—at Westminster, managed by Trish Adams, at Windsor Gardens by Bob Hewitson and a new competition was run at Croydon by the West Torrens Club.

LA Australian Lacrosse League—the last year of the first 3 year cycle of this new style of National Championship. In 2006, we hosted Victoria here, and travelled to Perth twice.

LSA Under 17 Boy's Development Squad—a new concept saw a group of under 17s under the guidance of Andrew Young, Mark Southwell and Jurgen Klus train over the off season.

LA National Indoor Tournament held at Blackwood Recreation Centre and managed largely by the Sturt Lacrosse Club. Several SA players were named in the Australian Indoor team.

LSA State League Indoor Championship—SLIC, also held at Blackwood and managed by Sturt LC.

Overseas Teams—several teams visited in March, with the coaching programs managed by Trish Adams and the travel arrangements by our sponsor Bunnik Travel.

LSA Girl's Summa League—held at Glenelg LC—a great pre-season competition which is managed with a minimum of fuss by a group led by Courtney Hobbs

LSA Warrior Super League—a new Men's pre-season competition which provided the opportunity for combined teams to play and to try some experimental rules. Is currently being assessed.

WLA Under 21 and Under 17 Girls—travelled to Melbourne for the National Championships. Under 21s— 3rd, U17s—2nd.

ASPAC—Several SA players were in the Australian Under 21 team to the 2007 ASPAC event in New Zealand in April

Anzac Day opener—played between the grand finalists of the previous year at the home of the winner—a great initiative, and planned to be an ongoing event. Thank-you to Frank and Deidre Owen and the RSL (SA) for their support and assistance. The beginning of a shorter season of games for the Men's League in 2007.

LA Under 19s and Under 17 Boys—Under 19s went to Perth, and disappointingly we were unable to field an Under 17 team for this competition.

WLA Senior Women's Championships—held in Sydney—our girls organised most aspects of this trip themselves, led by Sascha Newmarch, and once again came home victorious. An amazing run of victories!

IFWLA Under 19 Women's World Cup—held in Canada. The Australian team featured five South Australian players, an Assistant Coach and an Umpire. Silver Medal to Australia.

Joint Men's and Women's Grand Final at Port Adelaide Hockey Club—a great night of lacrosse and a programming initiative certainly worth consideration for the future

Split rounds for the finals, with the Reserves, B Grade and Junior seasons and finals being played after the League Grand Final. Subject to review at the moment, but well done to all clubs who hosted finals this season

LSA Men's and Women's All Stars Games, played at East Torrens Payneham Lacrosse Club.

WLA and LA Under 15 Girl's and Boy's Tournament held at Brighton—this event actually falls into our "next" year's activities, but all the planning happened this year, and it must be mentioned here as an extremely well run and successful event, managed by Bec Hakendorf as LSA Tournament Coordinator and Ben Pridham as Brighton's Event Manager.



Clinic and Development Activities—thanks to the hard work of DO Bec Hakendorf, her team of coaches and the clubs these clinics spread the word of lacrosse far and wide, but are the subject of great debate as an effective recruitment tool.

Yes, it's been a busy year.

Thank-you to all our sponsors, in particular our Corporate sponsors, Graham Hobbs and the Eureka Group, Fosters (Stavros Tsogas), Roger Attenborough (and now Trish Adams and Mark Mangan) from STX, AUSLAX SA (Tim Dickson), Mutual Community and Bunnik Travel. SA fielded 3 girls teams and 2 1/2 boys teams, all of whom performed exceptionally well. My congratulations go to Bec Hakendorf who was our Tournament Coordinator, and Brighton club's "ARMY" for the magnificent job they did in running this event, you all did South Australia proud, again congratulations and well done.

The 2007 STX season culminated in a very exciting and high scoring game, won by Glenelg over Wilderness in extra time. Congratulations to Glenelg on securing the premiership as well as the other finalists for a very tightly fought final series. In a new innovation for the sport, a combined men's and women's league grand final night was held at Port Adelaide. It was a fantastic night of lacrosse and it was wonderful to see a good crowd turn up to support the event.

Team Eureka continued in 2007 however on a modified program due to a drop in numbers of players willing to be involved. This is a great opportunity for developing players in A Reserve and B grade or fringe league players to play at the STX level and I encourage clubs to support it continuing in 2008. With the advent of an U17 girls development program over summer, it is hoped that this will provide a pathway for players that may feed into the Team Eureka program.

Our other senior women's grades were held on Saturday afternoons at Park 25. These competitions continue to provide development opportunities for up and coming players as well as a recreation focus for other players. Well done to Brighton and UniSA for taking out the premierships in the A Reserve and B grade competitions respectively. Congratulations and thank you also to the clubs hosting the finals days for these senior grades and the juniors, West Torrens and North Adelaide.

Congratulations to our Senior State Women on winning another National title at the Senior Women's National Championships held in Sydney in July. Well done to all the players and coaches on their success, despite a limited preparation. Well done also to all players selected in our underage State teams and a thank you to coaches and officials involved in all of these championships.

I would also like to take the opportunity to recognise the efforts and commitment of the South Australian members of the Australian U19 team that competed at the World Championships in August. Well done to the five SA girls (Hannah Nielsen, Bonnie Wells, Sarah Marshall, Kelly McMahon and Cassie Cursaro) along with assistant coach, Trish Adams, who returned home with silver medals after going down to the USA in the final.

The Women's competition relies on the work of many people. I would like to thank all the club representatives that comprise the Women's Competition Committee, along with other contributors, Margaret Pallant, Kathy Benger and Judy Aston. I remind everyone that it is through this committee that clubs have, not only the opportunity, but also the responsibility to have input into the rules or other issues facing our sport. I encourage all clubs to take advantage of this opportunity and share the workload.

Further, I wish to acknowledge and thank Helen Lewis for all her work and support throughout the year as well as President, Bob Hewitson. Finally, a thank you to Graham Hobbs and the Eureka Group for their ongoing support to the STX competition as well as thank you Roger Attenborough for his support over the years.

#### Men's Competition

Firstly I would like to congratulate all the clubs for supporting and adopting the proposed changes to Season 07. I believe that from the point of the League competition it proved to be the most equitable draw for many years.

Season 07 included the State League Indoor, second year in its current format, the new Super League and Field competitions, this year also saw the introduction of the Grand Final replay on Anzac Day, this needs to be continued and encouraged and the League finals played as stand alone fixtures. The scheduling also enabled the finals to be hosted by 5 clubs in lieu of the traditional 3, I believe this to be a positive for the game.

The Indoor competition was well supported, but more players/teams would enhance this form of the game even further and there is the possibility of an U15/U17 competition being introduced down the track. Sth Aust also hosted the Aust Indoor tournament and many thanks to Tim Dickson, Chris DeMello and the many Sturt volunteers who organised and helped with the event.

The Super League was a great success although not all clubs fully supported the concept and the innovative rules need further refinement but I see this form of the game as a work in progress. The introduction of a junior competition to this concept could provide the perfect platform for State, Zone teams and coaches.

Congratulations to clubs that hosted finals, State team representatives, coaches, premiership teams, club and association award recipients, players and officials who achieved milestone games.



As stated in last years report all forms of the game must be reviewed and developed, this is where all clubs, players and officials need to become proactive, this includes rules, promotion and marketing, we are all involved with this great game so let's work together to keep it great.

#### **Junior Competition**

The ongoing commitment and dedication by club members and junior coordinators in the implementation of successful recruitment and retention strategies has again delivered an increase in junior playing numbers.

The 11.13 rule continued to dominate discussion during the season and I congratulate those clubs whose strategies ensured their compliance with this rule. With Lacrosse SA holding firm on its position and vision to see a junior team in each grade—boy and girls, from each club (non school/tertiary) in the future, I hope that clubs continue to support Lacrosse SA vision to ensure the future of the game in South Australia.

I see the transition of juniors to seniors as a continuing problem for the lacrosse community as a whole, and this issue taking on greater importance as South Australian continues to have poor success at national championships and 'average' national representation.

It was bitterly disappointing that Lacrosse SA was unable to send a team to the U17 tournament in 2007. I hope that in future year the competition receives the support from all clubs and players. Whilst every effort should be made to support and develop individual players, I believe this can not be at the expense of the lacrosse community.

Whilst not seeing ultimate success by our state & tournament teams in 2007, the results achieved are a credit to coaches and players, in particular our four U15 teams. It was pleasing to see new coaches in 2007 and I would like to acknowledge and thank Sarah Falcione & Courtney Hobbs (U17 Girls), Andrew Young (U17 Boys), John Fuss (Western Reds), Keith Little (Eastern Reds), Hayley Tucker (Red Storm), Bec Hakendorf & Gwyn Elson (Red Lightening). With the U15 tournament held in Adelaide this year, we were able to establish a third girls team and provide 16 girls with a great opportunity. Thanks to the three coaches, Sophie Molyneux, Mark Basham, Neil Parker, and to the manager Allyson Oakley.

Whilst fantastic that clubs are seeing younger children take an interest in lacrosse, we have again seen an increase in the number of children aged under 8 commence playing. With this, increased duty of care and a younger aged competition need to be considered in the near future to ensure we are providing a safe and enjoyable playing environment.

Member Protection again has taken a back seat, but with the introduction of new state laws in 2008, Lacrosse SA and its clubs will need to adopt new procedures to be compliant with these laws.

In closing, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of the Junior Competition Committee. It was pleasing to see new faces on the committee and whilst a challenging year, I hope they continue in 2008. I also thank my fellow Board Members who have had to take on an increased work load given the absence of both a Secretary and Deputy President in 2007.

#### **Development**

2007 saw a number of new ideas trialled in response to an ever changing world. Lacrosse, and our community is not immune to these changes and it is important we continue to look to the future in our efforts to keep our game alive and well. Many of the changes will be discussed in other areas within this Annual Report and I will not repeat them other than to impress upon us all the need to Plan, Do and Review. Often.

The statistics provided by clubs this year in relation to their junior development and recruiting shows just how much work is being done. This work produced a 4% conversion of children attending lacrosse clinics into registered club players. Regardless of how many clinics and children we work with, 4% is hardly worth the effort. This level of return against effort clearly shows something is not working.

It is looking at our game with new eyes that will bring us to fresh ideas and to challenge the paradigm that we currently operate under. We will have met to address one of these challenges by the time this report is published; the structure of our junior competitions, the recruiting and retention of new players to lacrosse and how we move to, and beyond 2008.



This current situation talks directly to club / association development, and in the worst case scenario, club survival. We must all attack the development of our game, supported by the tried and proven club structure that supports most sporting organisations across Australia, with enthusiasm and the understanding that we carry the responsibility of our past and the vision for the future.

The ILAX competitions are continuing through the summer with good support from teams and clubs, and a number of clubs trialed the Fiddlestix concept again this season with younger players under 9 competing at ½ time through senior matches.

LSA welcomed Bec Hackendorf to the Development Officer role this year, a role she has pursued with great enthusiasm and commitment. Bec has directly supported clubs with numerous clinics, provided additional people to conduct clinics and has helped with equipment for clubs to run clinics. I wish to thank Bec for her energy, enthusiasm and passion for her role in the sport she loves. Much of what we discuss at the Junior Summit could inform this role, and support Bec in her work.

I again thank Helen Lewis for her work and support through the year, and to the board as a whole for the work through a difficult and testing year.

#### **Development Officer**

Lacrosse SA visited a variety of schools throughout this year, to run both in-curriculum programs and AASC programs. The schools listed below participated in clinics that were organised by Lacrosse SA and run by Lacrosse SA coaches together with, in some instances, club coaches. Each Club also organised their own clinics at schools not listed here.

#### Schools visited:

William Light R-12, Heritage College, Woodcroft Primary, Highbury Primary, Mt Carmel College, Torrensville Primary, Hawthorndene Primary, Brompton Primary, Reynella East Primary, Wirreanda High School, Bellevue Heights Primary, St Marys College, East Adelaide Primary, Colonel Light Gardens Primary, St Margaret Marys Primary, Reynella South Primary School, Direk School, Glenunga International High School, Ridgehaven School, Surrey Downs Primary, Ingle Farm OSHC, Pooraka OSHC & Para Hills OSHC.

It is estimated that over 2,000 children were involved in Lacrosse Clinics run by Lacrosse SA this year.

Other Development/Recruitment opportunities that Lacrosse SA were involved in this year: Wiltja Residential Program, Catholic School Sports Expo, Achper PE Week, Be Active Expo, Living Loud Festival, Life Be In It Come 'n' Try Lacrosse Month

One problem we faced this year was organising appropriate coaches to run school clinics. Next year we would like to focus on better coach education so that the programs we run are of a higher standard so we are able to make the most of our recruitment opportunities.

#### **SAPSASA and SASSSA Lacrosse Carnival**

The SAPSASA and SASSSA Lacrosse Carnival was held on March 31<sup>st</sup> 2007 at Henley and Grange Memorial Oval, home of the West Torrens District Cricket Club. 47 teams from 21 schools were entered into this year's competition and the feedback from the day was very positive.

This year was the first year the Carnival has been held in Term 1 of the school year. This was changed from 2006 to allow for more opportunities to recruit potential players. Following the success of this year's carnival, it is recommended that next year we try to re-implement 2 district carnivals. This year we were at capacity in regards to the number of teams and schools involved, and there were many more schools that were unable to participate because of the location of the Carnival. Next year, we would like to hold the carnival back at Barratt Reserve (this was unavailable this year), with an additional carnival held North/North-East of the city.

#### Life Be In It

Most clubs this year took the opportunity to be involved in Life Be In It Come 'n' Try Lacrosse month in April. This is a free program run by Life Be In It, where clubs organised Come 'n' Try days in a hope to recruit potential players. While there were no huge successes reported by any clubs, this was a great opportunity for free publicity and promotional material. We will need to reconsider our involvement in this event next year.

#### **Blackwood High School**



Lacrosse SA supported the organisation of a promotional day at Blackwood High School in term 3. Ross Hamilton (Brighton) organised for a full field men's lacrosse game to be played at lunchtime between players from the local area. Brighton and Sturt representatives attended and distributed flyers etc. This was a great opportunity to expose the community to a 'real' lacrosse game and we will be looking into more events like this next year.

#### **Coaching Report**

Thanks to all State and Zone coaches, assistant coaches, managers and support staff for donating their time, effort, knowledge and patience to help our athletes compete at Nationals. The endeavor and application shown by the athletes on these teams is also to be commended.

Thanks to the valuable people within our coaching community who applied for coaching positions but were not successful in 2007. It represents a healthy state of affairs that the board had a choice of coaches, showing a high level in interest in coaching at a state level.

Thanks to Andrew Young and Mark Southwell for having the foresight to suggest and then help implement a pilot U/17 boy's development squad from November to March. This formed the basis for a successful StEP2 grant application to the Office of Recreation and Sport of \$16,000 over three years, to conduct both a boy's and girl's U/17 development squads over summer.

It was extremely disappointing that we could not send an U/17 boys zone team/s to the 2007 competition. No-one was more disappointed than the athletes who missed out on the opportunity. All stakeholders within Lacrosse SA must work to ensure that this does not happen again.

The new Level 1 and 2 coach accreditation is anticipated to be released before next season. I urge all coaches to value add to their extensive practical knowledge of lacrosse with further sport science principles knowledge to further enhance what we already provide to our athletes.

2008 promises to be a year when the bar of expectation will be raised for coaches and athletes. The separator will be between those who say it has been raised too high and those who ask what they can do to achieve the higher level.

I would like to thank my fellow board members in their support for change in various areas. Change is difficult, but is a required process to ensure our sport moves forwards and continues to provide greater opportunities for our athletes.

The strength of ALRA(SA) has been demonstrated with the development of oncoming referees to the challenges of higher grade officiating and their contribution at Lacrosse Australia Tournaments and Championships and ILF World Events.

I thank the Secretaries of both bodies for their communications with me, which aids in the dissemination of information to the Board and the Lacrosse fraternity in general. It is vital that this communication continue well into the future.

Congratulations go to the Umpires and Referees for their distinguished service and achievements in 2007 on



the field of play as officials:-

I would highlight Martin Kiploks, Women's World Under 19's Canada and David Eyre, ILF Box Lacrosse World Championships in Canada.

I was distressed that we were not able to supply umpires to the Under 17's & 21's in Melbourne this year and we should ensure that this is not replicated in future.

Season 2008 for oncoming referees and umpires will be highlighted by the Office and Recreation and Sport "Coloured Shirt Program," where by new officials will wear coloured shirts to nominate that they are in the process of developing their skills and to encourage all spectators, players & coaches alike to give them a fair go. It is no different than a new player being identified to permit them to learn and hone their skills, for the eventual benefit of that person and the sport.

I have enjoyed (in the main), the responsibilities of Director of Officiating on Lax SA and hope that my efforts have not been in vain. I thank all who have worked with me and for the cooperation extended when the impossible has been requested. I wish ALRA(SA), SAWLUA & Lax SA every success for the future and encourage them to progress with vigour to reach the goals set by their members and their executives.

#### **Promotion**

2007 saw a diverse range of media exposure for our sport. The Messenger Newspapers lead the way with their coverage of lacrosse, and it was great to see clubs making direct contact with the Messenger to promote stories about individual milestones and events that were happening at their clubs. West Torrens was one club who assigned a person to actively promote their new clubrooms and events, along with their teams' results being published on a weekly basis. I would encourage all clubs in the 2008 season to nominate a person to take on a publicity role and have direct contact with their local Messenger paper and any other publications in their area, eg: local council or community newsletters. Roger Wills from the ABC once again helped out with spots on the radio and was instrumental in getting an interview organised on Peter Walsh's sports show with our Aussie U19 women prior to their departure for Canada. It was great to get a 15-20 minute slot on air to promote both the girls and lacrosse.

The Advertiser also ran stories both before and after the World championships, and with the Under-19 men competing in Canada next year, hopefully we can get a similar coverage to promote their campaign.

Channel Seven's Sunrise program was invaded by our lacrosse girls when they were in Sydney for the Nationals and it was fantastic to get lacrosse exposed on a national basis. Channel 31 (community television) also ran a story on lacrosse with an interview with Courtney Hobbs.

It continues to be a struggle to get regular lacrosse stories in The Advertiser and Sunday Mail, but with persistence we did manage a few pieces during the year.

I will not be continuing in this role, and so would like to thank Helen Lewis and my fellow Board members for their support over the last two years, and to the new Publicity Officer I offer any assistance they may need to help them settle in to their role.






