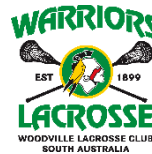

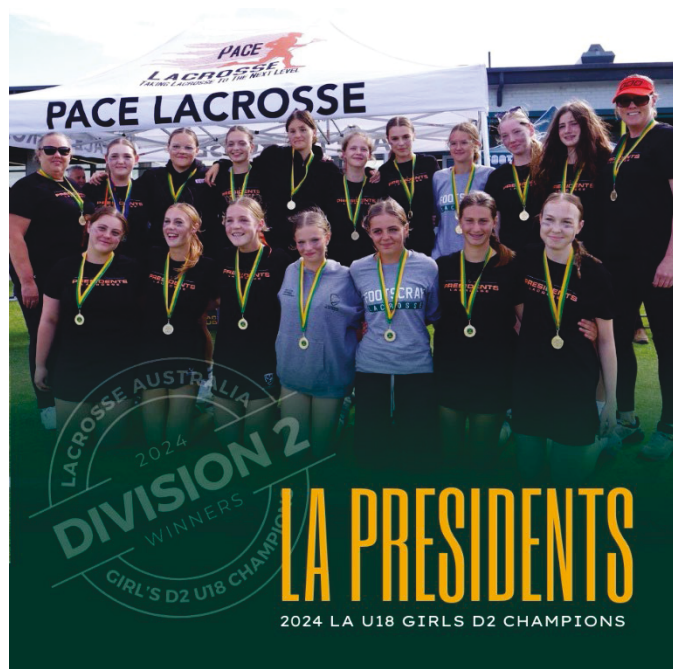

Such conduct is not tolerated in any professional environment, and it is crucial for everyone to be reminded of this.

A heartfelt thank you and congratulations to all the clubs, volunteers, officials, referees, and players for embodying the spirit of lacrosse and making significant contributions that have helped our vibrant lacrosse community thrive. Your dedication, along with that of coaches, managers, trainers, and all club staff, truly represents the heart of our sport!



Director Report - Acting Chair

On behalf of the Lacrosse South Australia (LSA) Board, it is my pleasure to present the 2024 Annual Report.

This past year, despite extensive efforts to recruit, we have been unable to fill several key board positions. In response, the executive team and I have explored potential adjustments to the board structure to reduce the portfolio burden on existing members and create a more inviting environment for prospective directors.

Despite these challenges, the board has worked diligently alongside the LSA office to meet organizational goals and support our community.

The 2024 LSA Board of Directors consisted of:

Nathan Twisk – Director (no direct portfolio)

Felicity Evans – Director of Marketing (resigned mid-year)

Traci Mathwin – Director and Acting Chair

The LSA office, led by Giulia Marion, has continued its committed work to fulfill the needs of our sport and community. This year, we welcomed Jarrod Brimble as Sport Development and Event Coordinator, and he has shown commendable enthusiasm in this role, positioning us well for growth. Additionally, Rachael Boys joined LSA as Sport Administration and Finance Assistant, bringing valuable experience and efficient club support, her positive energy and growth mindset is positive addition to the team.

Our Secretary, Sue Hogan, has been instrumental in managing board administration and offering grounded insights on recurring issues. Nathan Twisk brought a fresh perspective and continued to champion lacrosse growth in South Australia. Recently, he represented Hungary at the Box Lacrosse World Games in Utica, NY, proudly showcasing his skill and dedication on an international stage.

Reflecting on my 1.5-year tenure, I have been fortunate to work with a dedicated team that consistently strives to balance the needs of our community, players, and staff. As Acting Chair, my priority this year has been to enhance staff support, promote professional development, and establish regular performance reviews with our Executive Officer every two months, alongside updates outside of board meetings. These sessions facilitated strategic discussions around club relations, feedback management, and office performance.

I also recognise that, at times, Giulia took on tasks beyond her job remit to meet essential compliance requirements. Her willingness to go above and beyond to support the board (or lack of board members) has been invaluable in ensuring that our operations remain compliant and effective.

The absence LSA TV team this year left a notable gap in our broadcasting efforts of Marty, Craig, Tony and broader team. While Scott Gill from the Australian Lacrosse Network stepped in for some games, the lack of a dedicated Marketing Director has limited our promotional efforts. We recognise this gap and will prioritise it in 2025 finding support to revive broadcasting efforts or identify alternative means to connect with clubs, especially those implementing their own video setups. The finals were well supported, and we saw some new faces hit the waves and make a great event.

The lingering effects of the pandemic have posed challenges, including reduced player numbers and difficulty in fielding teams. Efforts to expand our presence in schools, initiated by Marty Baker in previous years, require further action to align with our goals for the 2028 Olympics.

Additionally, this year we saw a significant number of inter-club transfers, particularly within senior grades. Our approach in 2024 was to work with clubs and understand the impact early, ensuring a fair process while addressing concerns. Giulia Marion and the team managed these transitions thoughtfully and with great perseverance.


Alongside day-to-day responsibilities, the LSA team and I have been updating and aligning our policies and procedures with current standards, which include 45 core policies and numerous sub-policies. This year, we focused on Board Diversity, Board Charter, Strategic Planning, and EO performance criteria—based on audit recommendations. Further strengthening of director roles and board structure is planned for 2025.

Regrettably, we observed an increase in behaviour that would not be acceptable in any workplace, posing a challenge to any office staffs' psychological safety. The board and I are committed to fostering a positive, respectful environment where all employees feel safe and supported, with the aim to ensure that this occurs both ways. If members encounter issues, I encourage open communication with me to ensure we uphold our shared values of respect and collaboration.

Working closely with Pete Unwin, General Manager of Australian Lacrosse, and Chair Abbie Burgess Bryce has been invaluable. Their initiatives supporting high-performance lacrosse across states provide a strong foundation for continued growth. With expanded options like sixes, iLax, Summer Lax, and Box Lacrosse, the year-round nature of our sport presents new demands and opportunities for development along with volunteering pressures for clubs and officials. We aim to review 2024 and work with local, and state government to increase funding opportunities.

In closing, I would like to thank the Board, LSA staff, member associations, and volunteers for their dedication and contributions. Looking forward, our continued success depends on community support, and I invite everyone to join us in championing the growth of lacrosse in South Australia.

It was a very challenging year with a lot of requests for loan, transfer etc and a lot of exemptions being applied for near finals. The Board with the limited number of Board members have really tried hard to be consistent across the lacrosse community. Giulia certainly does not have an enviable job with the number of Phone calls, emails outside of her working hours and I would like to extend a big thank you for all the hard work she puts in.

Sport Development & Event Report

In 2024 I began a new role as the Development and Event Coordinator for Lacrosse SA. My duties shifted from a general administration assistant to a more specialised role, overseeing, as the title suggests, events like carnivals and the presentation dinner, as well as development such as clinics. The events side of things I had gotten my feet wet over the past couple years, particularly last year with the work I did as part of my university placement. Thank you to Trish Adams who assisted with the handover of the development side of things and answering any questions that I had.

The South Australian Catholic Primary Schools Sports Association Lacrosse Carnival continues to be a success, with likely north of 1,500 students and 197 teams attending across the five days. Again, a big thank you to all who helped at this event, to the Glenelg and Woodville Lacrosse Clubs for their job hosting, to all the volunteers from all clubs who came out to help officiate, a special shoutout to Dani Fitzpatrick and the large contingent of Sturt helpers who really stepped up this year. We've confirmed the dates for 2025, running from the 19th to the 23rd of May, again hosted at the Glenelg and Woodville Lacrosse Clubs.

Club carnivals were a bit tricky this year with the timing of NAPLAN and Easter causing a bit of a logjam in our calendar. With 3 carnivals in 11 days, it was an action packed two weeks trying to organise fixtures, first-aid and everything that goes along with a carnival. Thankfully there's a bit more time between NAPLAN and Easter in 2025, so fingers crossed the organisation of our carnivals will a little less chaotic.

Regarding development in 2025, we are looking at taking a more aggressive approach to organising clinics. I've been compiling an extensive list of primary schools in the Adelaide metropolitan area to contact and have been liaising with clubs regarding any pre-existing relationships with schools and if there are any that they wish to target.

JARROD BRIMBLE, SPORT DEVELOPMENT & EVENT COORDINATOR



Sport Administration & Finance Report

This is my first year at Lacrosse SA assisting with Sports Administration and Finance, with my main duties being inputting MVP and BNF votes, scoresheet data entry and assisting with Zone/State team uniform fittings, ordering and invoicing.

Scoresheets were a lengthy process with a lot of setbacks. A few setbacks that do arise almost weekly is clubs not inputting results into game day, scoresheets not being sent into LSA and players not being registered. Emails were sent regularly to club secretaries to update what scoresheets were missing to ensure there was not a large back log coming through. Some clubs were very prompt at getting them back to LSA while there were a few that would hand weeks in at a time. While some may just see a late entry for a scoresheet, this also delays entries for voting. I do understand they are all volunteers, so it may not always be at the top of their priority list. I am grateful for the support of Jarrod Brimble collecting scoresheets, Sue Hogan and Mandy Arscott for storing the scoresheets. U8 and U11 scoresheets are often not filled out correctly – team names missing for the most part, which can make it very confusing when trying to mark off if they have been returned.

The U15 National Zone Tournament takes up a lot of admin time when it comes time for uniform fittings, invoicing and stock intake. When doing the uniform/clothing, I believe it could be done more efficiently as it was quite difficult having most of the players in the same room at once trying stuff on. This caused some confusion with a few players as they weren't sure what they needed to order etc. While I'm still trying to work out the best way to get this done next year, a grouping system of 10-15 players in at a time to explain what is required to be ordered and an individual order form to then collate on a spreadsheet rather than one piece for each piece of clothing. Finally, when receiving orders from Sports Centre, this is another lengthy process to ensure it is all correct, which often is not the case as there are many errors in the orders from Sports Centre. Thanks to Giulia and Jarrod for their help with this as I was away for most of this time.

Senior State Teams are often very self-sufficient as they are booking their own accommodation, flights etc. I would like to thank Rachel Lawson for being available for uniform fittings for both senior teams and U18s.

With help from Charlotte Whinnen, we have tried to be more present on social media sharing successes from SA players, locally, nationally and internationally.

Thanks to all those who have assisted me this year – especially Giulia and Jarrod for all their assistance training me up and for answering all of my questions.

RACHAEL BOYS, SPORT ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE ASSISTANT

Late last year we were informed that we were successful in our application for a grant from the History Trust of South Australia to fund the digitisation of Lacrosse SA's historical collection.

Over the course of the year numerous documents, particularly minute books, statistics books, fixture booklets, annual reports and magazines, have been professionally scanned, with the digital files recently supplied to us.

I am now working on building a website where anyone will be able to look for and access these documents for any sport, club, personal or general historical research.

This is only the start, with other items, particularly photographs, to be scanned for posterity and made available on the internet for public access.

Many thanks to the History Trust of SA, Lacrosse SA, and the Crows Lacrosse Club for the funding which has allowed these records to be digitised for posterity.

I am interested in digitising any items of historical value, regardless of their perceived significance. Important information found nowhere else can be found in the most unlikely of places. I would welcome anything that is out there to add to our digital collection. Get in touch with me by e-mailing historian@lacrossesa.com.au.

One task I would like to work on, is the building of a database of player statistics. This will be a long-term project and I will invite club historians to collaborate with me on building up the records for players from their own clubs to help spread the load. This will involve typing in information from the scans of old record books from the 1960s to 1990s, as well as from score sheets from more recent years.
