1. Gentlemen. I am pleased to present for your consideration and approval the 58th Annual Report of the Australian Lacrosse Council.
2. General. During the period under review the Board of Directors met on three occasions- twice in Melbourne and once in Perth. Out of session discussions also took place between Directors on matters relating to their portfolios.

Experience continues to justify the Board structure with each Director having his own field of responsibility. One side benefit is the Australian wide recognition of lacrosse in its modified forms as a prominent sport, particularly in the School's system.

Unfortunately this has yet to be reflected in over-all registrations and suggests that in some areas clubs have yet to capitalise on the growth of awareness of our sport. It will be noted that only in Victoria was there an increase in both open-age and under-age registrations. Figures supplied suggest a decrease in both areas in Western Australia and no change in South Australia.

It is pleasing to report that for the first time in many years a new Association was admitted as an affiliate of the Australian Lacrosse Council. Formed in 1988, the Northern Territory Lacrosse Association was granted affiliate status during the year. A team has competed against composite teams from the existing lacrosse states with creditable results. Indications also point to the possibility of a re-formation of the Queensland Association which was disbanded just after World War II.

Australia continues to contribute to the development of lacrosse at the International level and in June sent a team to take part in the highly successful "Friendship Games" with teams from Japan and the USA competing. The Board recognises that Australia has an important role to play in the further development of lacrosse in Japan and will be supporting further visits between the two countries with the first visit by a Japanese team possibly taking place to coincide with the 1990 World Championship series.

### 3. International

- 3.1 Team Visits. Requests by overseas teams wishing to visit Australia continue to be received and referred to State Associations prior to approval. Under this arrangement a team of high school age players from Kingswood-Oxford School, USA, will visit Victoria and South Australia mid 1990 for a series of matches. This is of course the second time in recent years that a team from this College has visited this country.

A request from the Eltham club (Victoria) for ALC approval for a team to tour USA and Canada in 1991 is being processed.

- 3.2 Inter-Crosse Youth Games. Australia has received an invitation from the Federation International Inter-Crosse (FIIC) to participate in the first "World Inter-Crosse Youth Games in Italy in mid 1990. Targetted at boys and girls aged 13 and 14. Inter-Crosse is similar to Sof-Crosse. The invitation has yet to receive Board consideration.
- 3.3 Players. Several requests were received from players from USA and elsewhere to play in Australian domestic competitions. Successful placements were made in Western Australia, South Australia and Victoria.

3. 4 International Lacrosse Federation. Australia is represented on the International Lacrosse Federation by Messrs C.R. Carr (President), D. Rudderham (Vice President) and G. Tillotson (Delegate and Secretary / Treasurer). Mr P. Humphreys was granted "leave of absence" as Vice President for six months with effect from July 19, 1989.
4. National Championships. Details of results, All Star selections and Best & Fairest player are contained in Appendix A. Congratulations are extended to the WALA who hosted the U19, U17, and U15 Championships and to the VLA for the Senior Championships. Reports indicate that each event was well organised by the host Association. Congratulations to the teams and players who achieved honours, in particular to the WALA for its winning back-to-back the Senior Championship.
5. Isaachsen Trophy. The winner of this Trophy for the 1989 season was John Hill of the Sturt Club, South Australia, with 19 votes from 14 games and an excellent percentage of 45.23%. John narrowly outpolled Kevin Humphrys from the Brighton Club by 1 vote. Honours in Victoria and Western Australia were shared jointly in each instance by Tim Murphy and Ken Nichols (17 votes, 31.48%) and Klay Johnson and Steve Murray (25 votes, 39.7%) respectively. Congratulations are extended to each of these players for their excellent performances.
6. Fellow Awards. At a function organised by the VLA Inc., Mr Charles Franklin (Frank) Lansbury and Terence Allington were inducted as Fellows of the Australian Lacrosse Council. Each have provided outstanding service to lacrosse far in excess of fifty years and were worthy recipients.
7. Certificates of Merit. No ALC Certificates of Merit were awarded during the period under review. Three submissions received from the WALA will be considered with any others received at the next meeting of the Board.
8. Grants. Advice of the following grants under the Sports Development Program have been received from the Australian Sports Commission.
- \$15,000 - part time Executive Director
  - \$ 5,000 - general administration
  - \$ 3,000 - conducting NCAS Level 1 & 2 courses
  - \$20,000 - Sof-Crosse and Mod-Crosse general program
  - \$20,000 - World Championships, Perth (final payment)
  - \$ 1,000 - ILF meeting, Vancouver
  - \$ 5,000 - Participation Program (World Championships) - Sof-Crosse
- It is important to note that one of the conditions of the grant is that ALC abides by the ASC/AIS doping policy.
9. Australian Sports Aid Foundation. An application for registration with the Australian Sports Aid Foundation as an Approved Organisation was successful. As a consequence it is possible for donors wishing to support the Australian Lacrosse Council or Member Associations to receive tax reductions for their donations.
10. Finance. The attached Financial Statement reflects a satisfactory state of affairs.
11. Coaching. It is disappointing to note that little if any activity took place in this area during the year. No reports on coaches receiving accreditation have been received and must reflect on the overall performance level of coaches and indirectly players.
- Level 0 instructional material referred to in the 57th Annual Report is now approaching completion and will be utilised for the benefit of those involved with Mod-Crosse both at school and club levels.


12. Development Contract. The contract with Lacrosse Development W.A. to act as the development arm of Mod-Crosse and Sof-Crosse in non lacrosse states has been renewed for a period of three (3) years commencing July 1, 1988. The contract also requires LDA development activities for ALC in the present lacrosse states and to prepare for ALC approval a broad level Development Plan covering the three years of the contract.
13. Technical. In conjunction with the Technical Director, ALRA has now finalised a Referee Accreditation Manual and with the recently published Interpretations Manual will be a valuable aid to improving refereeing standards nationally.
14. 1990 World Championships. Reports from the Organising Committee for the Series suggest that despite some problems with venue selection, plans are well advanced for an outstanding Series. Indications point to high interest by supporters overseas. Good attendance appears to be assured. The WALA has an excellent and well structured Organising Committee planning the event and is to be congratulated on the progress made so far.

At the present time England, USA, Canada and the Iroquois have accepted invitations to compete in the major events. It is hoped a team representing the Japan Lacrosse Association will be able to participate in Exhibition Matches against representative National teams.

Approval has been received from the US Lacrosse Foundation for an Australian squad to tour USA during 1990. It is understood that the Australian team management will use the tour as a lead up to final selection for the World Series.

15. 1988 Under 19 World Championships. Aspects concerning team matters for the championships are unfortunately still outstanding. Efforts to finalise matters to the satisfaction of the Board and the SALA are continuing.
16. Confederation of Australian Sport. Council has retained its membership with the Confederation of Australian Sport. It is worthy of note that Gene Moore, previously of the Australian Sports Commission, has been appointed Executive Director of the Confederation and with an almost completely restructured Board of Directors is revitalising its lobbying interests on behalf of its member bodies.
17. Appreciation. I express my thanks to the ALC President, Phil Humphreys, and Board members for another year of support. Their contributions are adding significantly to lacrosse development in their respective portfolio areas.
18. Obituary. It is with considerable regret that I advise in this report of the passing of Mr. W.G. (Don) Hobbs. Inducted as an Inaugural Fellow of the Australian Lacrosse Council in 1988, Don served lacrosse at all levels in a span of fifty three years. His direct involvement with ALC goes back to 1959 when he served as the SALA delegate to ALC. Subsequently he occupied many positions including President ALRA (SA) 1970-78, ALC International Liaison Officer 1972, Delegate to International Lacrosse Federation 1974-83, ALC President 1979-83 and more recently, Patron of the SALA. His service to lacrosse has been recognised by the International Lacrosse Federation naming a Permanent player in his honour.
- Above all Don was a gentleman, respected by all who had the good fortune to be associated with him. He will be sadly missed by the lacrosse fraternity throughout the World.
