M President and Gentlemen,

I present for your consideration and approval the 40th Annual Report of the activities of the Australian Lacrosse Council.

### 1. STATE OF THE GAME

It would have been pleasant to report a considerable number of players introduced to our sport during 1971 and examination of the numbers of Junior registered players does reveal an increase of players amongst our Juniors, but on the other hand it is obvious that too many of our older players are leaving the game. Only a close analysis can reveal the trends concerning these older players and this information is not in the possession of the A. L. C.

Two States have shown a decrease in the number of Member Clubs Which along with the decrease in number of teams entered in Senior Competition, and the decrease in the number of Senior Registered players gives some cause for alarm.
