Gentlemen,

Your Committee presents for your consideration and approval the 75th Annual Report, Statement of Income and Expenditure and Balance Sheet for Season 1953.

<u>MEMBERSHIP</u> - The Season opened with 37 teams entered in Premiership contests arranged for the five Sections, whilst again 5 teams from High and Technical Schools competed in the mid-week competition.

Each Saturday games were staged, and the total registered players numbered 516, which was a decrease of 20 on the previous year.

The decline in numbers of players over the recent Seasons gives cause for some concern, and strenuous efforts must be made by all interested in the Game in an endeavour to arrest the decreasing numbers and introduce more players and teams into the Game.

The sincere congratulations of all Lacrosseurs go to the successful Clubs, and particular reference must be made to the outstanding performance of the Caulfield Club in being represented in the Final or Grand Final of every Section played, winning two Premierships.

Also, the wonderful performance of the Malvern Teams in A and Under 16 Sections, in not only winning the Premiership but also being undefeated champions as well. This is also the fourth consecutive success of Malvern in A Section.

Camberwell-GlenIris performed very well in B Section to defeat the undefeated leaders in the home and home series to take the Premiership Honours.

The President will tonight present medallions and trophies to the respective winners.

Twelve teams competed in the Under Age Sections and play in the final series indicated that these juniors are developing their game well, but the provision of experienced and capable referees is essential for the full benefit of their early introduction to the game being received.

All Clubs should endeavour to sponsor an Underwage Team to develop their future potential of players, and Club officials are assured of Association support in any step in this direction.

<u>MID-WEEK COMPETITION</u> - As in previous years, a mid-week competition was arranged for play between the various High and Technical Schools each Wednesday, and Mr. T. Leonard is thanked for his organisation and control of these series of games. Only one complete round of games was played, after which Box Hill High School was successful in winning the cup, whilst Melbourne High School was runner-up.

We desire to thank the respective sports masters of the various schools for their co-operation.

BEST AND FAIREST PLAYER - The honour of Best and Fairest Player for Season 1953 was won by A.L. Evans, the Malvern Captain, who polled 22 votes to gain possession of the Vince Healey Memorial Cup. W. Ashton of Surrey Park was runner-up with 21 votes, and our warmest congratulations are offered to these two players on their performances.

<u>AUSTRALIAN LACROSSE CARNIVAL</u> - The Australian Lacrosse Carnival was staged in South Australia during August, when the competing States - Victoria, West Australia and South Australia - contested the Garland McHarg Cup, of which Victoria was the holder.

<u>GYMKHANA</u> - The Annual Gymkhana was again held at the Malvern Cricket Ground on Tuesday, June 2nd (Coronation Day) when an Interstate Trial game, six-a-side games and other field events were held. Players were in the field from 10.30 a.m. to 4.45 p.m. and the comprehensive programme arranged by the Gymkhana Sub-committee progressed well to time, the events providing great interest throughout the day. The Committee is to be congratulated on its efforts, and this day is of great importance to Lacrosse in this State, as it is the only occasion during the Season when all Lacrosseurs can compete together.

<u>AUSTRALIAN NACROSSE COUNCIL</u> — The Australian Lacrosse Council met twice during the Carnival in Adelaide and after discussions on method of play over the past two Seasons it was decided to discuss the subject at a further meeting later in the year.

Rules of the A.L.C. and Laws of Lacrosse became available for distribution during the year and will prove of great value to players.

Our delegate to the A.L.C. this year was Mr. H.R. Balmer, who is thanked for his efforts on behalf of the Game, whilst Mr. Tickner acted as delegate in Adelaide, and he also is thanked for the efforts put forward in the interests of all.

<u>FINANCE</u> - Revenue for this year has proved to be adequate enough to meet current expenditure, although the Association did decide to subsidise Club payments to referees by 50%.

The sound reasoning of the Finance Committee in 1951 became apparent this year as the visit of our team to the A.L.C. Carnival in Adelaide was almost wholly financed by the Carnival Fund, set up for the first time in 1952.

Thanks are offered to our Club officials, especially those of the smaller Clubs, for their efforts in attempting to meet their commitments for the year on time.

In 1954 serious thought must be given by your Finance Committee and the Association in general to the ways and means of obtaining additional finance so necessary for us to implement one of the main ways of fostering our Game in the future \sim i.e. making available equipment for the use in schools and new areas.

EXHIBITION GAMES - On Sunday, August 30th, through the courtesy of Station 3 DB and The Sporting Globe, an Exhibition Demonstration of Six-a-side Lacrosse was staged at the St. Kilda Cricket Ground before approximately 30,000 people.

This exhibition should give the Game a filip in this State, and our sincere thanks are expressed to Messrs. E. Selth and K. Waite and the Sub-committee for their efforts in presenting the games in such a satisfactory manner.

<u>STICKS</u> — The continued lack of imported sticks is causing grave concern, and prospects of securing supplies in the future seem very slight.

The South Australian manufacturer, $P_{\bullet}J_{\bullet}Brady$, has been granted a licence for the import of hickory, but supplies of sticks will not be available until 1954, and then only in small quantities, and of course the quality is unknown.

The sticks of English Ash are not proving wholly satisfactory, and supplies of Pakistan sticks from West Australia were secured just prior to the close of the Season, and as yet we do not know of the quality and durability of the sticks, although reports are encouraging.

Your Committee is still endeavouring to secure supplies of imported sticks, and steps are now being taken to procure, if possible, a State licence for our immediate requirements.

<u>RULES AND BY-IAWS</u> - The Constitution and Rules of the Association, together with the By-laws, are being examined with a view to bringing them up to date and removing certain anomalies which exist.

The revised Rules and By-laws will be available for use, if desired, for the 1954 Season.

<u>PUBLICITY</u> - Again as in recent years we have been accorded good support by the Press, and results and articles have appeared regularly each week.

Through Stations 3 AW and 3 DB we have recorded the scores each Saturday, and this courtesy extended to our Association is greatly appreciated and our thanks go to the Broadcasting Stations, Press and Press Correspondents for their efforts during the year on our behalf.

<u>INVESTIGATION COMMITTEE</u> - It was necessary to call this important Committee of our administration together on four occasions during the year, and the Members of the Investigation Committee are deserving of this Association's sincere thanks for their interest and careful deliberations on our behalf.

REFEREES - Games during the year were officiated mainly by Referees provided from the Referees' Association, and Clubs were not called on to provide officials to the same extent as they were in the previous year.

It is hoped that the number of competent Referees will increase in the future, and to those members of the V.A.L.A. who officiated in an honorary capacity we convey our grateful appreciation, whilst the Members of the Referees! Association are also thanked for their support.

<u>CIUB JUBILEE</u> - The outstanding performances of the Malvern Club for the year were a fitting conclusion to the Golden Jubilee. of the Club's formation in 1903; and their wonderful record of 24 Senior Premierships in the last 29 years, and a total of 54 Premierships to the Club since its inception is a sterling tribute to the administrators of the Malvern Club, which is such a strength to Victorian Lacrosse today.

<u>APPRECIATION</u> - To all Members of Sub-committees your Association expresses thanks for their diligent attention to their tasks, which assists to foster cur Geme.

* Due to incomplete information on Match Report Cards it is not possible to give details of Best & Fairest players in the other sections.

It is desired at this stage to draw attention to the most unsatisfactory and careless manner with which most clubs and teams attend to the various forms and records required of them by the Association.

This "paper-work" forms the basis of an important part of the administration of the Association and unless information is submitted correctly and promptly the Association cannot function efficiently and the tasks of the various officers is made unecessarily difficult.

This criticism may sound harsh but it is warranted by the fact that in most cases, the records . received are incomplete and inaccurate and usually submitted after due date, and it often occurs that they are not submitted at all.

Perhaps this important facet of our game has not been fully appreciated and therefore all Clubs are urged to co-operate by carrying-out the following suggestions :-

- 1. Return all records, etc., promptly by due date, with all details complete and accurate.
- 2. Registration Lists.
 - (i) Must be in triplicate.
 - (ii) Give correct Registered No., name, initials and address.
 - (iii) In the case of under-age players show date of birth.
 - (iv) Additions or deletions to be on Supplementary Lists (in triplicate) complete with details as (ii) and (iii) above.
- 3. Transfer Applications. (Inter-club and Inter-section.)

Must be complete in all details.

- 4. Match Report Cards.
 - (i) Must be submitted by due time with all information complete and correct. (ii) Such data as date, section, time of starting, winners, final score.
 - ii) Such data as date, section, time of starting, winners, final score, guarter scores and name of Club submitting report are essential.
 - (iii) The recording of players official registered numbers is vital as the case can and does occur where players in the same team have the same name and initials.
 - (jv) Goal-throwers should be listed with correct score of each player.
 - ('v) Wherever possible Best and Fairest players should be shown, listed in order of vote.

(vi) Opposing teams should carefully cross-check to ensure that their cards agree.

If all Clubs will play their part in co-operating with the Association by observing the foregoing, the task of administration will be made so much easier and it will also permit of a more accurate summary of statistics in future seasons.

Owing to the fact that so many of this seasons records were incomplete and inaccurate or not submitted at all, the following summaries are only as complete as available data will permit and are not a true record of performances.
