President and Gentlemen.

This the 58th Annual Report of the Australian Lacrosse Council is presented for your consideration and approval. Directors reports received and that of the Historian are attached as part of the report. Further reports if received will be forwarded under separate cover.

1990 as for 1974 must be regarded as one of the most mementous years in Australian Lacrosse history when Australia hosted the second World Championships to be held in this country. For the first time teams representing five nations participated - U.S.A., Canada, England, Iroquois and Australia. In addition a team from Japan took part in exhibition matches held in conjunction with the World Championships.

Maintaining it's great record the U.S.A. team was clear winner of the championships with Canada taking second position and Australia third. England for the first time won a match at World Championship level by defeating the Iroquois Nationals. Australia could perhaps be regarded as being unfortunate not to have finished in second position but it was obvious that overall the general standard of lacrosse played was superior to previous championships. Australia perhaps suffers the disadvantage of a small population and distance from the World Centre of lacrosse (U.S.A.).

Under a franchise arrangement negotiated by Council, the organization and conduct of the championships were in the hands of the W.A.L.A. who organized under the chairmanship of Don Rudderham a series of committees and sub-committees to handle the many associated matters. The excellent contribution of the members of these bodies and the choice of the WACA as the venue earned the praise of the large numbers who attended or participated in the championships.

The thanks and appreciation of Council must also be expressed to the players and officials of the Australian team. Their behaviour and sportmanship were exemplary and a credit to Australia. Congratulations are extended to Murray Keen who was selected in the ALL STARS team selected at the conclusion of the series.

Of course their were many others who contributed to the success of the series - volunteers not on any particular committee, clubs and hosts who entertained visiting teams. The grateful thanks of Council is expressed to each person who was so involved.

Once again it brought home that lacrosse has created a fraternity of close knit friends around the world. The motto of the Japan Lacrosse Association "Lacrosse Makes Friends" is very appropriate.

Although financial and other reports have yet to be finalised on the championships it is clear that an excellent grant of \$50,000 from the Australian Sports Commission helped to ensure its ultimate success.

Australian Championships

Conducted under franchise arrangements with various WALA clubs these championships provided an interesting lead up to the World Championships.

Again Western Australia won the titles in the Senior Championships by defeating South Australia by 13 goals in the final. Western Australia matched its seniors team success in the U17 Championships by emerging clear winners. Victoria defeated Western Australia by two goals to take honours in the U15 Championships.

The scores and other data for the Senior and Under 15 Championships are detailed in Appendix "A".

The National Championships provided an excellent opportunity to witness the Japanese players in action. Competing against teams comprising players from the U17 teams, the Japanese demonstrated their enthusiasm, energy and sportmanship in several matches. The skill of their players was creditable having regard to their comparative recent introduction to our game.

Also of interest was the participation of a team comprising representatives of the newly formed Queensland Lacrosse Association and the Northern Territory Lacrosse Association. Should the current enthusiasm and drive of these Associations be maintained the entry of new teams into regular national competition should not be too distant.

State of the Game

The popularity of SOF-CROSSE through-out Australia is without question—this mode of lacrosse is ranked in the top eight of the modified sports played. A spokesperson for the Australian Sports Commission claimed that sales of SOF-CROSSE equipment ranked second in AUSSIE SPORTS. It is disappointing to note therefore that so far this popularity is not reflected in the statistics provided for SA and Vic. Figures given for WA suggest a near static situation although open aged registrations decreased by approx 10 per cent. On the other hand registrations fell in the open and under age groupings for SA and Vic. With Mod-crosse lesson and videos introduced in all states during the last few months it is hoped that this unfortunate trend will be reversed. The employment of paid Sports Development Officers in WA, SA and Vic is expected to help this to be achieved. Not-withstanding clubs should make every effort to utilize and capitalize on the services of these officers.

International Matches

During the year Associations SA, WA and Vic played host to visiting teams from overseas. Included were Kingswood Oxford and Connecticut Valley clubs from the U.S.A. and as reported above a team representing the Japan Lacrosse Association.

Associations are aware that the Australian Lacrosse Council has accepted invitations to participate in the Under 19 Friendship Games in Japan during 1991 and the World Lacrosse Under 19 Championships during 1992. "Registrations of Interest" have been sought for players and officials for both series. Mr Peter Hobbs, Team Executive Director for 1991 reports that responses are very encouraging. Several persons have also registered their interest for the 1992 Championships.

Having regard to the heavy international program during 1991 and 1992 Council decided against participating in a Tournament being organized by the Stockholm Lacrosse Club.

Isaachsen Trophy - 1990 - Fairest and Best Player

Congratulations are extended to Paul Cook of the Malvern Club, Victoria for winning this trophy with an excellent percentage of 55.6 percent, the best for eight years.

Fellows Award

At a magnificent function organized by the WALA during the World Series period Mr Harold Balinski was inducted as a Fellow of the Australian Lacrosse Council. Harold has given many years of service to lacrosse and was a most worthy recipient of the most prestigeous award of the Australian Lacrosse Council. It is worthy of note that a previous recipient, Mr Harold Horner also was awarded a Member of the Order of Australia award during the year.

Certificate of Merit

Congratulations are extended to L! oyd Morley WA who was the only nominee and recipient of this award during the last 12 months.

In announcing these grants the Commission has emphasized the need to investigate the practicality of a closer liaison between the A.L.C. and A.W.L.C. - a trend which appears to be happening in other sports with separate Women's and Men's organizations.

Again the Commission has advised that a condition of the grant is acceptance of its doping policy.

Finance

The attached Financial Statement reflects a satisfactory state of affairs.

Coaching

The Commissions reaction to the lack of coaching activity for the 12 months ended 30th June 1990 is reflected by the absence of a coaching grant for 1990/91. With the appointment of Ray Trevaskis as Coaching Director a revitalization of activity is apparent with Accreditation courses (Levels O and I) already held in WA and SA and courses planned in Victoria during November.

Development Contract L.D.A.

This contract under the supervision of the Director for Development has two years before expiring. A broad level Development Plan prepared by LDA formed the basis of a comprehensive plan presented to and accepted by the Australian Sports Commission.

Confederation of Australian Sport

Council has retained its membership with the Confederation, the major lobbying Sports Organization in Australia.

In recognition of his contribution to the game of lacrosse, Council has nominated to the Confederation that John Buutkiewicz be admitted to the Australian Sports Hall of Fame.

Nominations have been made for the presentation "Certificate of Outstanding Performance" to winning teams and coaches of the recent National Championships.

Mr C.R. Carr a previous ALC Director and President is currently President of the Federation. Both Clive Carr and George Tillotson retire as President and Secretary/Treasurer of the Federation after four years of service in these positions. It is worthy to report that the four years under the Presidency of Clive Carr has seen an unsurpassed international growth of lacrosse. The appreciation of Council to the Federation is therefore recorded.

Appreciation

I express my thanks to the ALC President, Phil Humphreys for his leadership during the year. His contribution over many years and his support for the Board of Directors concept is very much appreciated. Council wishes him the very best on his retirement.

It is hoped that concept created some 7 years ago will continue to be endorsed and supported by Associations and Board members.

Obituary

It is with considerable regret that I record in the report the passing of Frank Lansbury of the Victorian Lacrosse Association. Associations will recall that Frank was inducted as a Fellow of the Australian Lacrosse Council during 1989.

Frank occupied many important positions in the V.L.A. organizations over a large number of years. His service to the Malvern Lacrosse Club was unparalled.

Frank had the respect of all who knew him. He is sadly missed.
