OBITUARY

It was with deep regret we learned of the death of Ewan (Scottie) McIntyre on 20th April this year. Scottie served Lacrosse over a lifetime in many offices of the Association. During the war years when our game was at its lowest ebb, he was one of the driving forces who kept a competition going also acting as a regular Referee for several of those years. He was awarded Life Membership in 1951, the highest honour the Association can bestow. Scottie's last official position was that of Returning Officer and he acted in that capacity from 1963 until ill health forced him to relinquish it at the end of the 1979 season.

PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Gentlemen,

The past season has been one of great interest and activity in many areas. I would like to draw to your attention some of the highlights.

The Elimination Cup was conceived to overcome some of the local problems caused by Interstate matches. This event was well received and the Veterans section, which was a first for Victoria, was enjoyed by all. Together with some modifications it would appear that the cup will become a regular event on our fixtures.

The move to 8 Team sections provided some very interesting results with many of the lower teams improving their standing due to closer competition.

I would like to record my thanks to the Melbourne Cricket Club for allowing us to use the Albert Ground on many occasions. Sunday Games drew good crowds and many people took the opportunity to watch State League matches of the day.

The visit by Rutgers University late in the season provided a great deal of interest. The night game held at Olympic Park, despite the weather, has proved beyond doubt what a great spectacle our game is and can be particularly when we are able to use a top class facility such as Olympic Park.

The creation of a building fund this year aimed at developing a headquarters for Lacrosse may seem to be a dream but with the right approach and combined work of many I am confident that we can achieve this goal in the not too distant future.

The development of Lacrosse, in the Junior area, schools in particular is dramatic. The demand for our development officer, Don Miller, and requests for equipment has been at times almost beyond control. Bookings at this time are well into next year. A great opportunity exists for Clubs to capitalise on this development and I urge all Club administrators to make sure that their Club makes the most of these opportunities.

Victoria was very successful in Interstate competitions this year. Juniors — Australian Champions, Seniors win over Rutgers and South Australia, Colts second in Australian Championships. My congratulations to all those players and officials who gave so much of their time and effort.

Once again we have received a great deal of support from the Dept. of Youth, Sport and Recreation, I would like to express our appreciation to the Minister, the Hon. Mr. Brian Dixon and his officers for their help and experience.

Many other areas are covered in this report show the growth and interest that is currently happening in Lacrosse. I take this opportunity to thank everybody who has worked for our Game this year and leave you with this thought:

"For many years we have been regarded as a minor sport — The progress of the past year and a half has given us the opportunity to expand and grow, to prove to ourselves and others, that we are serious in our endeavours to make Lacrosse, in all its forms, A Sport for All."

GENERAL SECRETARY'S REPORT

Gentlemen,

On behalf of your Committee it gives me a great deal of pleasure to submit for your approval this 102nd Annual Report covering the activities of the Association during 1980.

The season under review departed from the normal in that the home and away rounds were shortened, an Elimination Cup round was played mid-season, and competitions reduced to eight teams. The advent of State League title to our senior competition has given Lacrosse a morale boost and probably gained more recognition from the media.

A Victorian team from all sections, Seniors, Colts and Juniors, took part in interstate competition during the year and a visiting team from the U.S.A. Rutgers University, played two games within the State. A Box Lacrosse team which included Victorian players and officials toured Canada and California. These happenings together with four "match of the day" rounds being played on Sundays meant the season was full of interest from start to finish.

These various items are recorded in more detail later in the report.

The Treasurer's Report and Financial Statements are attached together with reports from the two Record Secretaries and the Tribunal.

1. ADMINISTRATION.

(a) Management Committee:

This committee met on eleven occasions during the year and it is pleasing to report that attendances showed some improvement. It cannot be stressed too strongly the necessity for all Clubs to have a delegate in attendance as the policy decisions taken at these meetings affect all clubs, and they should have a say in the decision making.

Would all Clubs please note that it is a requirement of the Victorian/Amateur Sports Club that Association members attending meetings at the Victorian Club are to be dressed in jacket and tie.

(b) Permit Committee:

Once again the dedicated members of this committee gave up their lunch hours each Tuesday during the season to deal with the day to day problems associated with the conduct of our competitions.

The Association has, as it must have, By Laws under which competition games are to be played. Clubs, as members of the Management Committee which adopts these by laws, make the rules and must abide by them. This involves proper completion of match reports, registration of players, submission of registration lists at the correct time, etc. and a scale of fines is in effect to penalise those clubs which do not obey the rules.

Unfortunately the incidents of fines over recent years has been very high and whilst this may create some Association revenue, it is money we could well do without. Every fine levied means that there is extra work for some member of the Permit Committee in chasing up the detail which has been omitted from a team sheet, a player who wasn't registered, a match report not submitted, fairest and best votes not recorded etc. Have a look at your own club's financial statements and work out how many lacrosse sticks could have been purchased with the money you have paid out in fines!

To the various members of the Permit Committee — thanks for another season of great work, without which the Association could not function.

(c) Tribunal:

This committee started the year with only five members and we were fortunate enough to be able to enlist the services of Trevor Campbell to bring the tribunal up to full strength.

Mr. Ed. Spreadborough acted again as Tribunal Secretary and, as usual, provided the Management Committee with regular and accurate reports of the Tribunal's activities.

Thanks are again extended to the M.C.C. Club for making their meeting facilities available.

A detailed report of the Tribunal's activities during the year is appended.

(d) Visits Committee:

Owing to lack of nominations no appointments were made to this committee during the year. However, the work necessitated by the visit of the Rutgers team was extremely well handled by Rob Jackson, Mike Hillsberg, Alan Chiron, Rob Joy and Phil Humphreys. The stay of the Americans in Melbourne was a great interest to those families who hosted them and very much appreciated by the visitors themselves.

(e) Weather Committee:
