Executive Officer's Report

2007/08 has been another busy and interesting year.

Perhaps the most significant happening was the creation of Finsbury Lacrosse Field at Finsbury Reserve – home of Woodville Hockey Club and West Torrens Lacrosse Club. This has created a "home" ground for Lacrosse SA where the Velocity Women's League was played on Wednesday nights, and where several Super Saturday double header games were played, along with the Men's and Women's League Grand Finals. It has to be said that some aspects of this move received a mixed reaction from the lacrosse community, and there will be fine tuning in 2009, but Board is committed to our future at Finsbury Lacrosse Field.

The Association is indebted to the support of Life Member Graham Hobbs and the Eureka Group in making this happen. Graham has committed to building a spectator stand at Finsbury Lacrosse Field, which will further improve this facility.

A brief outline of happenings and events in 2007/08 includes:

(There is a comprehensive list of the personnel who participated in, coached, officiated or managed various representative teams - from International to Zone Tournament teams. Many are also mentioned in the various Director's reports, so I won't repeat all of them here.)

Australian Lacrosse League (2007) - In what turned out to be the last year of this format, we hosted Round 2 – SA v WA at the Pines. The Championship was won by Victoria.

Indoor Lacrosse - at Westminster, managed by Trish Adams, at Windsor Gardens by Bob Hewitson.

LSA U17 Girls Development Squad - An new squad, funded by a grant from the Office for Recreation and Sport, managed by Jurgen Klus and coached by Sarah Falcione and Courtney Hobbs.

National Indoor Tournament – an "unofficial" event held at Blackwood Recreation Centre and managed largely by the Sturt Lacrosse Club.

SLIC (State League Indoor Championship) - held again at Blackwood and also managed by Sturt LC. Won by Brighton LC who defeated Sturt in the final.

Overseas Teams - several teams visited in March (and later in the year), with the coaching programs managed by Trish Adams and the travel arrangements by our sponsor Bunnik Travel

Girl's pre-season Summa League - held at Glenelg LC - a great pre-season competition which happens with a minimum of fuss.

Men's pre-season Super League - a new format of club teams (as opposed to draft teams) was tried. Held at West Torrens Lacrosse Club. Was affected by successive weeks of extreme heat and was cancelled after only one round.

WLA U21 Girl's National Championship – didn't get off the ground this year, with other states unable to commit. However an informal competition comprising LSA U21s, teams from New Zealand and Japan, and two local teams played in an informal tournament at ETP.

WLA U17 Girls National Championships - held at ETP. LSA Under 17s went down to Victoria 16 - 6 in the Grand Final. Thank-you to Judy Aston who coordinated this and the Under 21 event, and to East Torrens Payneham who did a fine job of hosting.

Anzac Day Men's and Women's League – the opening game of the season—a double header, played between the Men's and Women's League grand finalists of the previous year (Woodville and Glenelg, and Wilderness and Glenelg) at Woodville LC. Thank-you to Frank and Deidre Owen and the RSL (SA) for their support and assistance.

Super Saturdays – double header games (men's/women's/U18 boys) played on the artificial surface of Finsbury Lacrosse Field, under lights. The inaugural Super Saturday was sponsored by Hamilton Kennedy.

Australian Club Championship – A new concept, instigated and sponsored by the Eureka group, saw the Men's and Women's Senior Premiership teams from Victoria and SA play off for the title of Australian Club Champion. Played under lights at Finsbury Lacrosse Field. Congratulations to Newport Women (Vic) and Woodville Men who were the inaugural Australian Club Champions.



LA U19 Men's National Championship and U17 Boys National Tournament - played in Melbourne. LSA fielded an U19 team, and U17 team (Eastern Reds) and provided some players for the President's team. The U17s did very well, going down by the narrowest of margins in the Grand Final.

WLA Senior Women's Championship - held in Perth. Regrettably our winning streak came to an end.

U19 Men's World Cup - held in Canada. The Australian team featured six South Australian players, the Coach, an Assistant Coach and a Referee.

Grand Final Day – all finals played at the one day at the same venue – a huge day for lacrosse. Thank-you to West Torrens Lacrosse Club and the Woodville Hockey Club for their assistance.

LA U15 Boys and WLA U15 Girls Tournament – played in Perth. A valuable developmental experience for this age group. Sending a touring party of nearly 80 players and officials away is a big exercise!

LSA Presentation Dinner – a new venue this year – "The Highway," for our Senior Medal counts and presentation of trophies to individuals and All Star teams. Ably MC'd by Eric Freeman.

Yes, it's been a busy year.

Thank-you to all our sponsors, in particular our Corporate sponsors, Graham Hobbs and the Eureka Group and Fosters (Stavros Tsogas), and our Competition sponsors Velocity Lacrosse (Trish Adams and Mark Mangan) and Auslax SA (Tim Dickson).

We continue to receive great support from the Government of SA via the Office for Recreation and Sport and gratefully acknowledge their commitment to us and to sport in SA in general.

All of our sponsors are featured on the cover of this report and you can access their websites from our web site. Please give them your support.

As always I am indebted to the many people who continue to support and assist me in my role; all of the Board Members, and in particular outgoing President Bob Hewitson – he will be sorely missed, the Club Secretaries, Women's Registrar Margaret Pallant, and our Administration Officer and my right hand, Tiffany Smith.

Enjoy the coming Festive Season, and remember, next season is just around the corner!

President's Report

Welcome to you all to the 2008 Lacrosse SA Annual General Meeting.

My time on the Lacrosse SA board has been a very rewarding. While working with the clubs administrators I have made several new friends and met many interesting people along the journey.

My thanks go to all the board members who have worked so hard during 2008 to keep Lacrosse in our state alive and vibrant, often under some very demanding time restraints on their personal, and family time.

The board again worked through this year with a shortage of board members, particularly considering the absence, (until July), of a Director of Administration, (formally Secretary). We were most fortunate in eventually filling this position with Mr. Andrew Harris.

We were forced to increase our office staff this year so that Lacrosse could keep up with all the added demands that are currently associated with running sport in this state, and to service our clubs to the level they demand of the office. We were very fortune in retaining Tiffany Smith who is qualified in sports administration and is a "lacrosse person".

Again there were several overseas teams from Japan and USA which visited SA during the year and along with the 11 state representative teams that play either here in SA or interstate added a huge amount of administration work onto the office that was not there in the past. Thanks to all of the coaches and managers of these representative teams as well as Tiffany and Helen Lewis for their work in making these teams all work.

2008 saw the introduction of what was called Super Saturdays - nights of lacrosse on the West Torrens LC's new "Turf" surface - Finsbury Lacrosse Field. This concept needs some fine tuning with games times and junior involvement, but the lacrosse community and clubs must embrace these nights as the "game of the round" and make them the show case of our sport where the men's and women's games come together for a super night of lacrosse.



Our State/representative teams were again struggling to win games, which is a direct reflection of our club competition standard.

I have pleaded with clubs in the past and do so again—please make every effort to appoint accredited and as experienced coaches as you can, for your junior teams. The standard of coaching here in SA is at an all time low and this reflects on the players who represent our state/. Without exception they all display great endeavor on the playing arena only to be let down by poor skill levels due to not being correctly taught the basics of lacrosse, which can only be taught club level.

While lacrosse playing numbers are reasonably stable, there is a trend that does bother me at the moment and which needs to be monitored closely. That is our senior men's player numbers which were significantly down this year, the reason why needs to be addressed by the Men's Competition Committee before the start of the new season.

I would like to say a special thanks to the board members who worked with me this year, all of whom were very dedicated to working for our great sport,

Deputy Pres. Greg Hamilton - Greg has put a tremendous amount of time into his portfolio this year and has been a great sounding board and assistant to me during the year, and will make a very good President.

Director Finances Alan Carr - Alan has a great knowledge of the game and its people and has been a great mentor for many years.

Director of Administration Andrew Harris - Andrew has recently joined the board in this position but has already approached his role in a most professional manner.

Director Junior Competitions Nathan Aston - Nathan has possibly the hardest portfolio on the board which he manages with enthusiasm and competency and is very popular with all the club delegates.

Director Women's Competition Mark Basham - Mark joined the board this term in this position and immediately applied himself with enthusiasm and flair. Mark's personality will be missed at future board meetings.

Director of Officiating Robin Stevens.- Robin has a good working knowledge of all Refereeing and Umpiring matters, and is a good representative of these bodies.

Director Development David Swaine - David is currently working on a new model for the Development Officer role that will hopefully assist clubs with their recruitment of junior players.

Director of Coaching Jurgen Klus - Jurgen works to a standard that lacrosse players find very difficult to obtain but if we are to progress to a higher playing level then we must continue to support Jurgen in his endeavors. He is also currently working very hard on an U17 girl's development squad.

Director of Men's Competition Bob Carter - Bob has again found it difficult to get the backing of club representatives at the men's competition meetings.

Director of Promotions was performed this year by the Deputy President Greg Hamilton.

Executive Officer Helen Lewis - Mrs. Luee (that women in the office) has again represented Lacrosse to the sports community in a very professional and competent manner. We are very fortunate to have a person of Helen's ability in this position and I thank her for her support of me while in the President's position.

As I will not be seeking election for any future board position I would like to say thank you to all the Lacrosse people with whom I have worked with over the years. I have enjoyed your company and friendship and wish you all the best as you work for the future of our great game.

I have always considered the position of President of Lacrosse SA a privilege that can only be obtained by very few people, and I am most great full to the lacrosse community for allowing me that privilege.

Deputy President's Report (inc. Promotions Director)

I first played lacrosse when I was eight years old and like all of us, fell in love with the pace, accuracy and dynamic nature of this wonderful sport. My life and my families life rotated around lacrosse and with successes at Club and State levels, I quickly learnt that my skills would come from the experience and knowledge that surrounded me.

I was fortunate to play both with and against some of the world's best lacrosse players. I now find coaching junior boys lacrosse rewarding and assisting State teams exhilarating.

So how do I assist to ensure the continuation and growth of this game that I love?

Coming back to Lacrosse as a parent not a player after almost twenty years, I found that there was little growth, which was truly a shock. Recruitment numbers at clubs are way down and like many amateur sports, lacrosse is struggling to maintain its grip in slippery conditions with funding low and costs continually rising. We must be prepared to look inside our systems, to study and review what we all know, both within the association and at our own clubs. If we continue to do what we have always done it is fair to say that we will get what we've always got, which in this day and age may prove to be limiting.

Are we prepared and willing to change? We may be required for example to review age groups or even playing times, so consider the options. Yes it may be a lot of work and there are no guarantees, but I know one thing, it will be worth while. My life experience would be less without lacrosse. My family is now a 3rd generation lacrosse family and I thank my father Malcolm Hamilton for his efforts and input, for his support of my playing career and his support now of his grandson Ross. I thank all those involved throughout past years, for their vision and individual input and I congratulate the members of the current Board for the steps taken this year in presenting the new and untried format, "Super Saturday Nights".

Some of you did not like the format, others loved it, either way it is proof that we must all be prepared to embrace change and try new ventures. The first two rounds were promoted in the Saturday Advertiser taking specific advertising space in the sports section and paid for through sponsorship. We invited guests, journalists, Members of Parliament, business leaders, officers and heads of other sporting organisations, to spread the word "Lacrosse." Posters marking the events were prepared and distributed via the internet and club members and parents including juniors, who may not normally attend senior games were encouraged to attend. Whilst I see that there is plenty of room for improvement I believe the opportunity of double header games on the artificial surface provided an entertainment spectacle that we have not yet fully explored.

The Board has also undertaken a review on how we promote lacrosse to the potential junior members that all clubs are trying to target. Time was against us in 2008 however in 2009 we will all have access to promotional brochures for both the Under 15 and under 18 age group. Our newly developed theme, "Live It, Love It, Play It, Watch It, Lacrosse" will be carried into 2009 with much more emphasis.

Much time was devoted to our Junior Tournament and State Team selection and training processes. Simplified, consistent uniform detail prepared for all grades with new helmets and uniforms developed for the senior men. Thank you to all parents, managers and coaches who gave their time and were prepared to trial some subtle changes to the Lacrosse SA administration system. I congratulate all players who represented not only their State but also their clubs and themselves.

And not to forget our 2008 Grand Final day. Hosted at Finsbury Reserve, home of West Torrens Lacrosse Club, and what a spectacular day of lacrosse. A very full and very long day for those organising the multitude of games played and again we live, learn and try new formats, with success in many areas and slight losses in others, resulting in a great day that the Lacrosse community should be prepared to embrace together. And wasn't it great to see a full page of lacrosse in The Advertiser, the grand final morning.

So who is responsible for change? We all are, the players, spectators, club management and Lacrosse SA. What we have is a fantastic game, with speed, excitement and physical contact, all the elements that make a sale-worthy, sporting product. It is in the best interest of Lacrosse in South Australia that the profile of our sport is promoted, we must all become proactive and manage our future. It would seem that every second person I speak with, knows of, or is friends with, or is related to some one who plays lacrosse.

Who do you know? Where are the best contacts for distributing information about this fantastic game? Ask yourself, 'how can I help?'. There is no doubt that the promotion of lacrosse is critical, so we must all be prepared to demand attention. This takes time and money so please consider how you may "demand" attention next time you speak about your favourite game.

We had our second successful 'traditional' Anzac Day Grand Final rematch, and again, the previous season's premiers (Glenelg) went down to the previous season's runner up (Wilderness).

Nationals:

- Senior Women. SA lost its hold on the Joy Parker Trophy for the first time in nine years in Perth, going down to the Victorians in the Final. I am sure that SA will be looking to start another decade of dominance as of next year.
- Under 17 Girls. East Torrens Payneham Lacrosse Club hosted this event magnificently. Tournament Director Judy Aston managed this event equally well. I thank ETP and Judy for taking on these duties and performing them so professionally.
- Under 21 Girls. It was a great honour to have teams from New Zealand and Japan here for the week, even though the cancellation of the U21 Championship was very disappointing.

Velocity Women's League:

- The Velocity League moved its games to the artificial turf at Finsbury Reserve, the home of Woodville Hockey Club & West Torrens Lacrosse Club. A major upgrade of the facility's infrastructure courtesy of Lacrosse SA Life Member, Graham Hobbs, and the Eureka Group will commence imminently.

By Laws, Rules and Umpires:

- It was pleasing to see a large increase in umpiring numbers amongst the junior grades with the introduction of the 'green shirt' program for newer umpires to highlight to participants and spectators that a newer umpire was present. There was also a welcome general improvement in standard in women's umpiring this season.
- LSA created a Technical Committee composed of the Director of the Women's Competition, Director
 of Officiating and SAWLUA's President. This Committee recommended successfully to Lacrosse SA
 that IFWLA rules regarding sticks be followed as of 2009 for all Senior games in SA and is currently
 looking at what helmets should be allowed for use in competition.
- LSA is currently reviewing the situation whereby many players from non-league clubs are playing for League clubs and their Reserves or B Grade team too. LSA is currently investigating means to encourage a new club team to the competition whilst retaining the viability of current clubs.

The Australian Club Championship was played in June with Newport (VIC) beating Glenelg (SA) in a fantastic display of women's lacrosse. Thanks again go to Graham Hobbs and Eureka Group who devised this great idea and sponsored its success.

The season culminated in a joint Grand Final day in all Grades for Men and Women playing at West Torrens Lacrosse Club. I think this was a great success and with the improvements to this location it can only get better.

Congratulations to Velocity League Premiers, Brighton; Reserves Premiers, Sturt; and B Grade Premiers, ETP.

I thank and admire the many volunteers who work hard to support the continuation of Women's Lacrosse in SA – the family, friends, partners, umpires, team officials, coaches and players themselves.

I also wish to thank the many delegates and proxies who attended WCC meetings and gave of their time and knowledge to improve the game; Executive Officer, Helen Lewis, who gave me invaluable assistance during the season; President Bob Hewitson for his ever present guidance and advice; SAWLUA President, Kathy Benger, for her support; Women's Registrar, Margaret Pallant, who does so much work for the women's competitions and; finally, thanks to Donna and the kids who suffered my many absences



from home and countless hours at home with me glued to the computer.

The Women's Competition Committee is there for clubs to work through issues. Clubs need to use this tool effectively by ensuring a delegate is in attendance who is knowledgeable about the opinions of their club and is also prepared to work with all other delegates.

To the woman (I hope) who takes over this portfolio, be strong, be positive and good luck!

Men's Competition

The biggest impediment to innovation or change in any team, business or organisation, is the way we think, firstly we need to embrace and support changes, secondly allow them time to succeed.

I would like to congratulate the Lax SA board and the clubs that supported the Super Saturday games scheduled at Finsbury. I believe that from many sectors within the lacrosse community this scheduling drew the greatest criticism.

Season 08 included the State League Indoor, Indoor non contact, the revised format for Super League, Field competitions, Grand Final replay on Anzac day, Club Championship and for the third year the 7 a side knock out cup was run as a fund raiser for the Australian team representatives. The 7 a side game needs further development and could easily be promoted as part of a school based competition, smaller field, shorter periods, innovative rules.

The Indoor competition was once again well supported, but more players/teams would enhance this form of the game even further. I would encourage the introduction of an U15 or U/17 competition being played as there are already a number of younger players involved in various teams.

The Super league just didn't happen, the concept changed to being a club based competition as distinct from the merged team scenario of 07. Many games were cancelled due to the weather and once again the competition was not fully supported. My recommendation is, for this game to advance and the competition to be of a high standard, that it moves ahead to a full draft setup with players registering, coaches appointed, program and venue to be arranged. This would allow State teams coaches to use this as preparation for team selection.

Congratulations to clubs that hosted finals, Australian team representatives, State team representatives/ coaches, premiership teams, club and association award recipients, players and officials who achieved milestone games.

This year many of the Men's comp meetings were poorly attended, I encourage all clubs to seek out reps who will attend meetings and represent their club and views with due diligence. This committee makes recommendations to the board on the information provided by your club reps.

Lacrosse in SA and Aust is currently treading water in terms of our greatest resource, that being player numbers. We need a consolidated push across our State and the country to get lacrosse being played in schools, if our great game is going to survive and prosper.

As stated in my last two reports all forms of the game must be reviewed and developed. This is where all clubs, players and officials need to become proactive, this includes rules, promotion and marketing, we are all involved with this great game so let's work together to keep it great.

Thanks to the other board members of Lacrosse SA for their support during the year.

This competition will cater for the increasing number of children in the 5-8-age bracket playing/looking to play and will ensure players of all ages can play in a safe and enjoyable environment.

As director responsible for junior state & zone teams I wish to thank all coaches, managers and support staff. The success seen this year and in late 2007 can be attributed to the dedication of our coaches and of the players. I would like to make special mention of our U17 Eastern Reds, coached by Keith Little, on making the grand final of the U17s. Congratulations also to our U17 girls for making the finals and to the efforts of Sarah Falcione & Courtney Inge. The steady improvement of our junior boys teams over the years at a representative level is evident by an increase in respect from the opposition and within our clubs locally. It was disappointing that we were only able to send one U17 boys team this year, but with the appointment of a Western Reds coach at a recent board meeting, I'm confident from discussions with the coach recently that we will have two teams participating in 2009.

Lacrosse SA's Member Protection Policy (MPP) was implemented in 2008 and it was pleasing to see clubs understand the necessity for such policies to ensure we have safe environment for all, in particular our children. To the Member Protection Information Officers, Child Safety Officers and Implementation Officers a special thanks for your efforts and contribution. In the off-season the policy will be revised to make it more user friendly and accessible.

In closing, I again thank all the volunteers involved with junior lacrosse and a special thank-you to my family for allowing me to contribute as much time as I do to lacrosse.

Development

Thank you to the lacrosse community for your involvement and support through season 2008. Thank you also to the Board, Helen Lewis our Executive Officer and particularly Bob Hewitson who is standing down as President. Thank you also to Bec Hackendorf for her work in the Development Officer role.

The Board always has as its main objective the health of our game and as such a number of initiatives were trialed this year.

Let's Get Going! – Lessons for Lacrosse. This seminar was held through the 2007 U15 National Tournament. A range of speakers gave their time, experience and knowledge on supporting clubs and junior sports people. Congratulations to the Brighton Lacrosse Club for their initiative for this seminar.

LAX Ahead Planning Day, November 2007. This workshop was all about moving forward and considering ideas/suggestions for the future, with particular regard to competition structures and development. 8 of our 10 clubs attended the day held at NALC. Jeff Dry, an independent facilitator conducted the day for us and we are thankful for his efforts. A broad range of views and ideas put forward and discussed:

Competition:

Location, Timing, Age Groups, Coach/umpire accreditation, Administration of competition, School or club run. 14 Key Recommendations came out of the Competitions discussions.

Development:

Branding and marketing of the sport, Positioning, Education strategy, Resource development, Zoning, Membership conversion – recruitment. 19 Key Recommendations came out of the Development discussions.

In line with a number of the recommendations LSA;

To further investigate the establishment of a primary school and high school competition. This is currently being undertaken by a sub committee of the Board with a view to establishing a secondary school level competition among IGSSSA and ISSSA schools for 2009.

Develop standardised resources to use at clinics - Provide suggested models on how to present and deliver programs. The Board has taken the decision to re-align the Development Officer role to a Projects Based role where tailored individual projects are established to address specific and detailed issues facing lacrosse.



Currently Noel Speck is undertaking a project to establish a primary schools based competition within SAPSSASA boundaries. The processes, resources and delivery mode are being developed into a package that can be used by all clubs to support their development efforts. Further projects will be established through 2009.

It is hoped this change in our structure will provide many benefits and support for clubs as we move forward.

Super Saturdays provided us with the fantastic opportunity for our players to experience artificial turf, allowing our community to develop their skills on an international standard playing surface.

We got involved in Un SA's practicum program, and two students worked closely with Bec through the preliminary work for the National U15 Tournament. They also supported the tournament through the week.

The two ILAX competitions, Windsor Gardens and Westminster, continue to prosper and provide opportunities for new players to experience our game as a means to enter field lacrosse.

School Clinics were the conducted throughout all school terms this year. As with other seasons an enormous amount of time and effort goes into managing and running the clinics. The conversion rate was better than last, although they continue to have a high participation level but with limited return to clubs. Thank you to Bec for her work with the clinics, and to all those people who supported the clinics over the year.

The South West Lightning Carnival saw 13 local schools participate. This was a fun day for all with great participation and support. Unfortunately the North East Carnival was cancelled due to Hot Weather. A number of schools were ready to join in, and we made a couple of attempts at different dates but the weather defeated us.

U17 Development Squad.

Unfortunately due to a lack of interest from the men's community there was no U/17 Boys Development Squad this year. It was also disappointing that only three clubs were represented at the coaching seminar presented at the conclusion of the development squad, where the squad coaches disseminated their findings. Hopefully club coaches will become more engaged in the learning process as their peers have a lot to offer.

The girls U17 Development Squad will shortly be up and running for 2008/09. It is hoped that this excellent opportunity for the boys U/17 eligible athletes for 2009 is not lost and receives the support from the men's lacrosse community our future champions from S.A. deserve.

State Teams

It was superb that both the competition for and the quality of all the applicants for State coaching positions continued to increase. Several state coaches tried new initiatives this year in both the selection process and in athlete management. I am fully supportive of coaches who try new concepts which will invigorate the process and challenge the athletes. All state teams were coached very well, and thanks to all those who offered their time, energy and expertise.

State teams do not function without competent and tireless managers to support them, and this year Lacrosse SA has been blessed, and I extend thanks to all our team managers.

Our State teams were all competitive and have set a standard for the teams of 2009 to keep pushing higher.

Zone Teams

Clubs, coaches, players and parents as a whole should ensure that Zone teams are promoted and supported. It was disappointing that South Australia only managed to field one U17 boys zone team in 2008, as it meant a number of keen players missed out on a wonderful learning experience.

The U15's however have been a different story, with good support across the whole community. 2009 is shaping up with more promise for the U17 boys, with one coach already appointed.



Processes

New processes have been developed with more in development that should give our coaches more guidance, support and clarity in the execution of their role. These include: a post-selection 'de-selection' process; athlete and coach key performance indicators; separate and revised coaches and managers manuals; standardised quantitative test procedures.

Thanks also to Helen and Tiff for their administrative work that so ably supported my role on your board. And lastly to my fellow board members, for continuing to support change and innovation in coaching.




