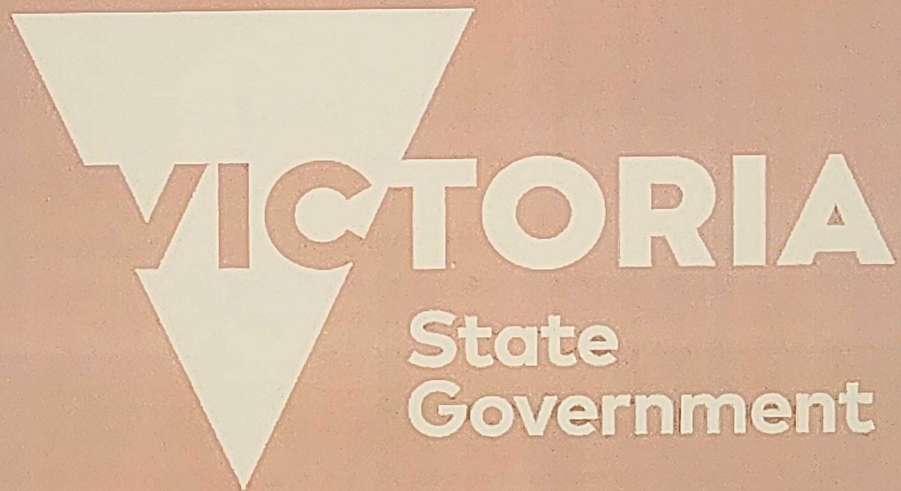
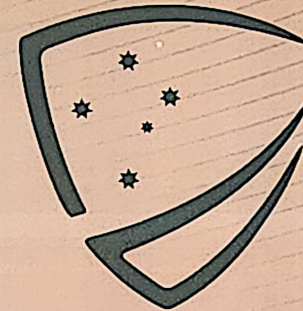

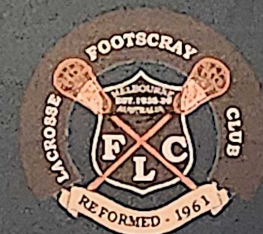

Congratulations to all players who have been selected, we are sure you will represent your states, teams, clubs and yourselves well.

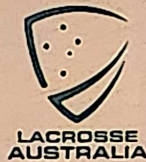

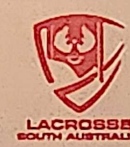

# THE FAIR PLAY CODE

## PRINCIPLES

THE FAIR PLAY CODE OUTLINES A SET OF GUIDING PRINCIPLES ON EXPECTED STANDARDS OF BEHAVIOUR FOR EVERY PERSON INVOLVED IN SPORT AND RECREATION IN VICTORIA.

This includes every player, participant, coach, support person, official, administrator, club member, spectator, parent, volunteer or member of the public involved with sport and recreation in Victoria. All should demonstrate the principles of integrity, respect, responsibility, fairness and safety in relation to sport, recreation, training and club sanctioned activities by:



### INTEGRITY

- being honest, fair, respectful, trustworthy, reliable, open and transparent in dealings with others
- avoiding any real or perceived conflicts of interest
- striving to earn and sustain a high level of community trust and goodwill
- not engaging in or advocating the possession and use of banned performance enhancing substances or methods, or illicit drugs
- not participating in, or encouraging action that may jeopardise the integrity of sport and recreation including match-fixing, illegal sports betting and other corruption.



### RESPECT

- treating everyone involved in sport and recreation in a considerate, objective and courteous manner with proper regard for their rights, dignity and worth
- refraining from any form of discrimination, harassment, bullying, abuse, child abuse, intimidation, victimisation or vilification of others, including on the basis of age, race, sex, disability, sexuality, gender identity or religion
- recognising and valuing the contribution of all to sport and recreation, including volunteer coaches, officials and administrators who give up their valuable time to make sport and recreation happen.



### RESPONSIBILITY

- considering and accepting the consequences of one's actions and decisions
- being a positive role model by displaying self-control, respect, care and diligence towards all involved with sport and recreation
- complying with specified child safe standards of conduct expected of adults when dealing and interacting with persons under 18 years of age
- understanding the possible consequences of breaching the Fair Play Code and immediately reporting any potential breaches to appropriate authorities.



### FAIRNESS

- understanding and playing by the rules and spirit of sport and recreation
- being informed, consistent, impartial, just and reasonable in dealings with others
- being a 'good sport' by encouraging and praising fair play over winning at all costs
- providing a 'fair go' to people of all abilities to be involved in sport and recreation and reach their full potential.



### SAFETY

- providing a safe, welcoming and inclusive environment that places the health, welfare and well-being of participants above all else
- taking all reasonable steps to ensure equipment, facilities and programs meet health and safety standards and are appropriate to the age and ability of participants
- being aware of and supporting policies and practices in relation to injury management, return to play, adverse weather and child safe standards
- showing concern and caution towards others who may be sick or injured and immediately reporting any safety issues to appropriate authorities.

## Sport of Lacrosse Adopting New Policies

As a sport Lacrosse will be adopting and moving to a new integrity framework and dispute resolution process to ensure our sport operates and offers a safe, clean, inclusive and welcoming sport environment, and fair and efficient complaint handling processes.

In the coming months Lacrosse will adopt the [Sport Integrity Australia \(SIA\) National Integrity Framework \(NIF\)](#)

### SIA NIF

The SIA NIF takes a proactive approach to mitigate integrity threats to sports and provide a safe, fair and healthy environment for participants at all levels of sport. The Framework is a streamlined suite of policies (5 policies) that sets out the broad expectations for the conduct of all participants in sport. These expectations relate to (1) safeguarding children, (2) member protection, (3) competition manipulation and sports wagering, and the (4) misuse of drugs and medicines.

The Framework also includes the (5) Complaints, Disputes and Discipline Policy. This policy outlines the procedures for managing, reporting, assessing and determining potential breaches of the integrity policies contained in the Framework. Under this policy, Sport Integrity Australia will undertake the independent complaint assessment and review process.

The Framework is designed to reduce the administrative burden on sports and provide better outcomes for sports and their members when disputes arise. This means this new framework will replace the old Member Protection policy and ensure there is a national approach and consistency moving forward.

### NST Dispute Resolution Policy

In addition, following the transition to the SIA NIF, LA will also be utilising the National Sport Tribunal Dispute Resolution Policy. This policy documents a clear process and avenue to handle disputes that do not fall under the SIA NIF.

If required, the NST hears and resolves national-level sporting disputes in Australia and offers a range of dispute resolution options – arbitration, mediation, conciliation and case appraisal – to help national level sporting bodies and their participants resolve disputes efficiently and affordably.

## Sport Integrity Australian Lacrosse Education Plan.

Sports Integrity Australia (SIA) is the organisation that now manages combined functions of the previous Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority, the National Integrity of Sport Unit and the nationally focused integrity functions of Sport Australia.

Education is key to protecting the health and wellbeing of athletes and upholding the integrity of Australian sport. SIA have established Education Plans with all NSOs regarding integrity matters.

As such, Players, Coaches and Team Staff attending LA National Events are now required to completed additional education courses. There is a tiered approach to the education requirements for each event (U15, U18 and Seniors (field/Box)) and courses only need to be completed once apart from the Annual Update course.

All courses are designed and managed by SIA and are accessible via their E-Learning platform.
