Message from the President of the V.L.A. (Inc.)

WELCOME : CANADA AND SOUTH AUSTRALIA

To put things into correct perspective I must first mention the undoubted hero of this international and interstate visit: Mr L. W. (Bill) Taylor, the Secretary of the Victorian Lacrosse Association. While the rest of us did what little we could to make the visit a success, Bill did the remaining 90%. While you are at the games look around you at the premier venues, the sponsors (you won't see a lot of their banners because they are facing the television cameras) and the precise organization and co-ordination. We have left it to the coaches and players to provide us with a fine spectacle of Lacrosse in its various forms but the rest of the show is almost entirely due to Bill Taylor. It is unfortunate that Bill was not born a few (no let's face it, many) years later, because with his talent for ball games he would have made a great box lacrosse player. As it is he has had to content himself with refereeing box both in Australia and Canada, adding to his talents as a top field referee. I am sure that everyone who has contributed their efforts to making this visit a success will not begrudge my tribute to Bill.

This visit is an international event and therefore supported by the Australian Government and it is the tribute of Lacrosse in Victoria to the 150th anniversary of the founding of our State. It is worthwhile noting that Men's Field Lacrosse has been played in Victoria since the 1870s thanks to a strong Canadian and American influence after our gold rushes. However during this visit most of the games will be recent forms of the sport in the Victorian setting. The great Canadian version of the game, Box Lacrosse, is the top attraction of the visit and we hope that spectators will find it fast and exciting and a fine spectacle. Before the Field game we will be seeing a game of Women's Field Lacrosse which is notable for its open, skilful play. Indoors the ladies and juniors will be playing games of Soft Lacrosse which is accessible to people of all ages and a great success in the state of our visitors, South Australia and a growing attraction in Victoria.

Canada and Australia have many national similarities. The bravery and success of the fighting men of both countries has been displayed on many occasions in the past in battles fought from the same side because of our similar origins as British colonies. In the modern world both nations have a similar international standing, but one of the closest ties between the two nations for those of us who indulge in lacrosse is the bond forged by our game. I hope that this visit will do much to strengthen this bond and foster the game of Box Lacrosse in particular, and Lacrosse in general, in the States of Victoria and South Australia.

I welcome the Canadian and South Australian teams on behalf of the Victorian Lacrosse Association and assure them that we will do our best to make their stay a pleasant one off the field or box, and a competitive one during all the various games.

BASIC RULES FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE NEW SPECTATOR

When a team obtains possession of the ball it must have a legitimate shot on goal within the 30 seconds as recorded by the digital clock at each end of the floor.

Otherwise possession is awarded to the opposing team. To be a legitimate shot the ball *must go in the net*, hit either the front frame of the goals or any part of the goalie or his stick.

If the team taking a legitimate shot regains possession, the 30 second count is re-started, if the ball goes out of bounds from a legitimate shot a face-off is held.

When a referee raises his right hand and points to a player it means that the defending team have fouled.

On completion of the scoring play; that is, a shot or 30 second count, the referee will stop the game and inflict the appropriate penalty. This prevents the deliberate foul being used to stop a scoring play.

When a team is shorthanded owing to penalties and gains possession of the ball they must get it over the centre line within 10 seconds.

Provided they keep it in their attacking half, the 30 second possession time does not start until they have all players back on the floor. If they are forced back over the centre line with the ball they lose possession.

The goal crease is for the protection and safety of the goal keeper and NO opposing player may cross it or reach into it to obtain the ball.

Usual penalty time for hitting the body, running a player into the boards, rough play and the like is 2 minutes.

A goal against the offender's side ends the penalty time.

Technical infringements when the ball is loose results in possession being awarded to the offended team.

We trust these basic rules give you a further insight into truly a magnificent spectacle.
