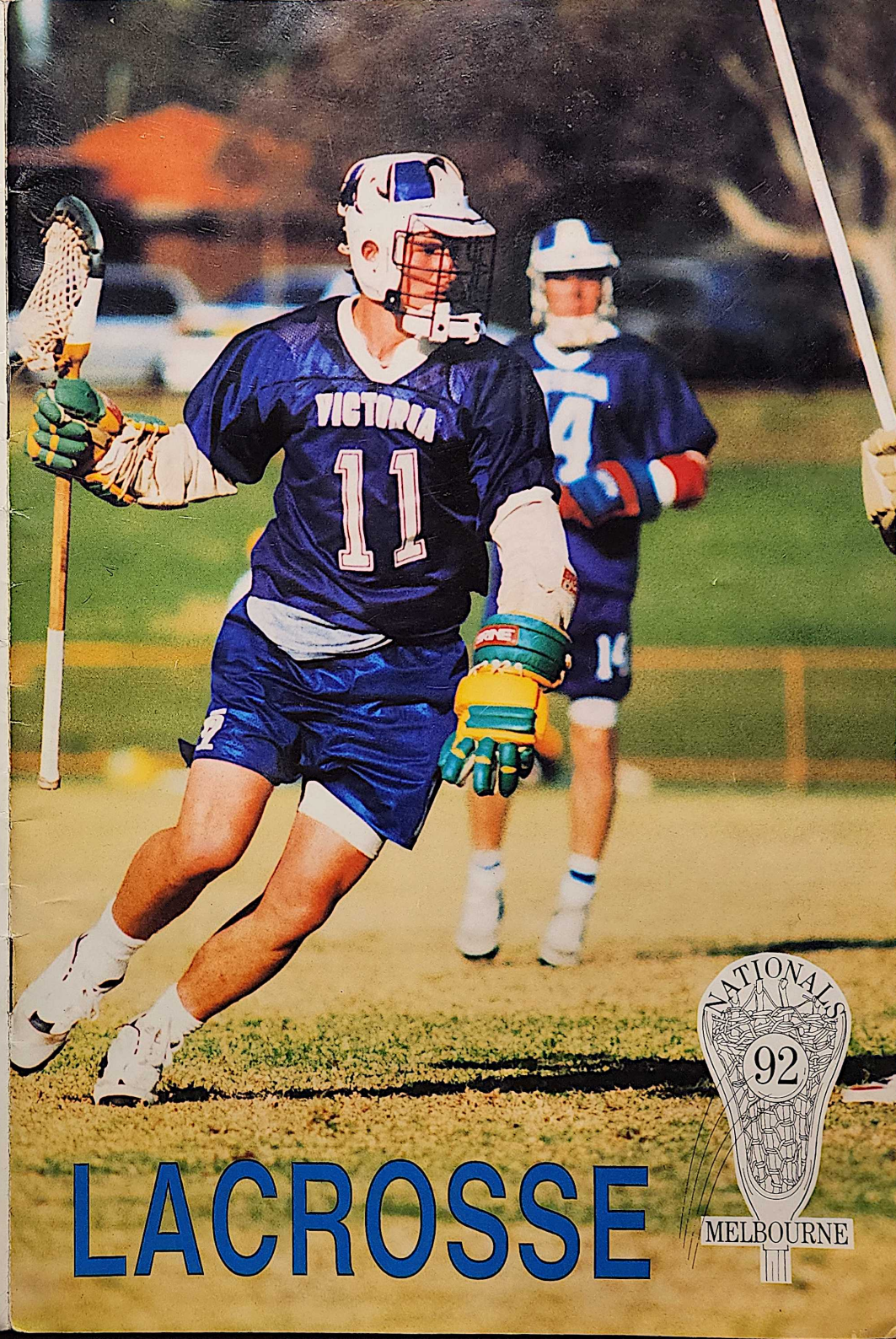

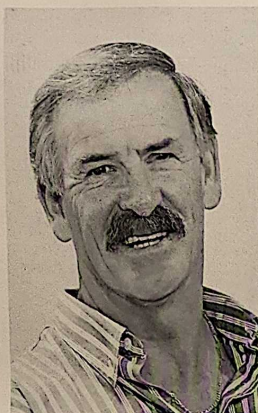
South Australia, Victoria and Western Australia compete for the Championship title within the Tournament competition.

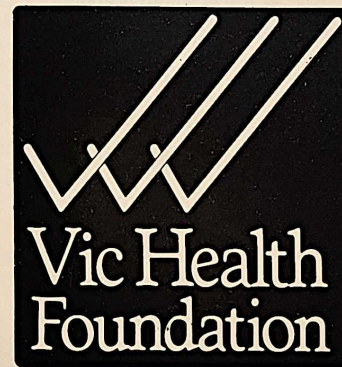

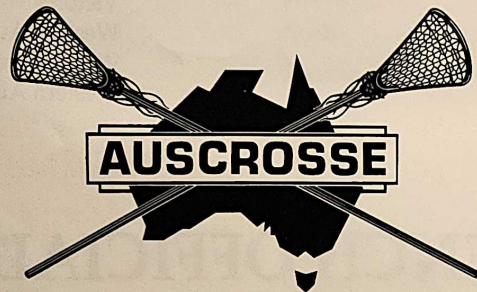

Lacrosse

MR. P. SHAPPERE,
President of the Victorian Lacrosse Association.

Mr. Shappere, the well known president of the V.L.A., a position he has held for many years, is one of the oldest and most enthusiastic Lacrosse followers in Melbourne. He has always been a generous patron of the game, and for many years donated annually the A Section premiership medals.

The lacrosse season of 1908 opens tomorrow under very bright auspices, and nothing is wanting to make the season a record one. Nine additional teams have been entered for competition, making the total 37. This is the largest number of teams which has yet competed under the V.L.A. rules in any year, and it is a striking instance of the impetus given to the game in this State by the Canadian visit.

The success of the Canadian visit is very gratifying to the several associations concerned. The undertaking was a huge one, and the successful issue of the tour reflects the greatest credit on the honorary executive officers of the several associations, who, at great sacrifice of time and convenience, worked so hard and with such happy results. The committee of the V.L.A., in its annual report, referred to the tour as follows:—

"The season" under review has been marked by an event of great moment in the history of lacrosse in Australia—the visit of a Canadian lacrosse team to these shores. Large attendances were attracted to the several matches, and great public interest was aroused, and as a practical result of the visit a considerable addition to the ranks of lacrosse players is expected during the forthcoming season. Four games Canada v. Australia were played—2 each in Melbourne and Adelaide—the first game being won by Australia by 5 goals to 3 goals. The succeeding games were all won by Canada by small majorities, i.e.: 6 goals to 3 goals, 4 goals to nil, 6 goals to 4 goals. This State was represented in these games by Messrs. C. M. Graham and V. Steet (Essendon), F. T. Delves, W. Bryning and B. Bryning (Hawksburn), and A. Box (Melbourne Cricket Club). A sum of £1500 was asked for as a guarantee by the Canadians, and this amount was jointly raised by the Victorian Lacrosse Association, South Australian Lacrosse Association, Queensland Lacrosse Association, West Australian Lacrosse Association, the Melbourne Cricket Club and the South Australian Cricket Association. Your committee desire once again to express their high appreciation of the untiring efforts of the hon. secretary and treasurer, Mr. W. W. J. Forster, throughout the last year. The visit of the Canadian lacrosse team entailed an additional amount of work, and the success of the tour in Victoria was largely due to Mr. Forster."

"The visit of the Canadian team provided a very big advertisement for the game. It was brought prominently under the notice of thousands of persons who were previously strangers to it, and, more, it made a highly favourable impression. None who were present at that memorable first test game, played on the M.C.G., will ever forget the enthusiasm displayed by the great crowd when the final bell rang out Australia's triumph by 5 goals to 3 goals.

That the interest thus created was not merely a passing whim is evidenced by

the largely increased interest in club doings this year, shown by players and public alike.

The number of teams in the A Section has been increased to nine. Elsternwick have once more dropped back to the B grade, leaving six of last season's competitors—Essendon, Hawksburn, M.C.C., University, Hawthorn, and Malvern—to compete with the new aspirants for senior honors—Kew, South Yarra, and Fitzroy, the latter being a new club. Kew have twice previously essayed their strength in the A Section, but their experiences have not induced them to continue in senior lacrosse. It is to be hoped that, having once more been admitted to the highest grade, they will make a strong endeavour to stay there. South Yarra and Fitzroy are to be commended for aiming high, and deserve success.

Considerable changes will be found in many of the senior teams. Hawksburn, who are losing F. Delves and the three Brynings, are probably the heaviest losers. It is a big loss for any club to lose in one season two men like Delves and W. Bryning, each of whom is acknowledged to be unequalled in his respective position to say nothing of B. Bryning, who ranks as an Interstate representative. These players will form the backbone of the new Fitzroy combination.

Essendon are losing F. Dunn, W. Howieson, G. Gay, and C. Thrussell. The two former players will be seen in Coburg colors. Gay and Thrussell, it is stated, are retiring from the game. A. Lampard, from Hawthorn, will be found in the Essendon team. It will be very difficult to find substitutes for the men who are leaving this team, as they have been for many years instrumental in assisting to place Essendon in the high position occupied by that team. Like Hawksburn, Essendon are likely to be weaker than they have been for some time. They will still, however, be a hard team to beat.

University will be composed largely of last year's players, strengthened by recruits from their B team. They anticipate a successful season, and are in the happy position of having all last year's players available. A bold bid for premiership honors by this club would be popular amongst followers of the game.

M.C.C. expect to place a strong team in the field. Last season's men are mostly available, and they will be strengthened by the inclusion of several recruits from the B team.

The new teams, South Yarra, Kew, and Fitzroy, are hopeful of justifying their inclusion in the senior section. The latter team particularly, with their tried senior men, should give a good account of themselves.

The Hawthorn City Lacrosse Club start this season with an additional team, the number of teams now being three, viz., A, B, and D. Great interest is being manifested by the players, and in a practice match against Malvern on Saturday last, at Malvern, good form was shown by all. The most prominent were B. Dawson, R.
