The following recommendations to the General Committee were carried:-

- (1) In the opinion of this Sub-Committee it is desirable to secure greater public interest in the game, and that this may be achieved by playing senior matches at 1:30 P.M. on the Oval prior to League football matches.

Resolved in this connection to write to the Football League asking their approval to our

(8) approaching the Baseball League with a view to dividing the use of grounds for the respective games; and to write to the Baseball League asking whether they will meet us to discuss the matter.

Mr. Parsons to interview Secretary of

Adelaide district

(2) That Clubs affiliated with the Association be urged to secure the services of a Secretary who will display the activity and attention necessary from such Official to advance the interests of his Club and of the game generally.

(3) That it is desirable to create more combined matches in junior ranks annually and that the Programme Committee be asked to leave at least three dates during the season available for this purpose.

(4) That the President and Chairman of the Association or any other executive officer be asked to attend (subject to the consent of the Clubs) at each respective Club's Annual Meeting for the purpose of urging upon the Club members the necessity of enlivening interest and greater action, also for the purpose of securing the services of active referees for the coming season.

(5) That each affiliated Club be asked to appoint a Publicity Officer whose duty it will be to see that the three papers (Register Advertiser and Mail) and other papers if desired, be furnished on Saturday evenings with a brief report upon the matches played by the senior and junior teams of such Club.

Mr. Hodgetts to see Register

Mr. Parsons to see Advertiser

Mr. West to see Mail

for the purpose of getting the papers mentioned to place their Lacrosse column on a more satisfactory basis. Further that the papers mentioned be asked to supply the name of a member of their staff who will be responsible for receiving and dealing with lacrosse reports.

- (6) That it is deemed advisable to make arrangements with a Supplying House to reserve on our behalf 40 or 50 sticks on extended credit, say six months, and that they issue such sticks to applicants upon presentation of an order issued by the Secretary of the Association, debit the Association with the cost which will in turn be recovered from such player on easy terms.

Such privilege is only to be available to new players.

- (7) That the usual semi final and final round be dispensed with in senior grade, the leading team at the end of the remnant rounds to be proclaimed winners of the Premiership. Afterwards all Clubs in "A" Grade and the leading two in "B" Grade to compete in an eliminating round for a special trophy to be presented by - xyz.

- (8) That it be a recommendation ~~in the xxvif Committee~~ that the Permit Committee shall not grant permits generally to players from a defined district where there is no "A" Grade team, to play collectively as a body for any one senior team.

Note. The idea of such resolution is that the Port Adelaide district which has recently supplied the majority of the North Adelaide senior players, should make an endeavor to form a team representative of their own district.

- (9) It was decided to indicate to the Annual General Meeting of the Association that owing to the extreme difference in the strengths of some of the teams competing in senior ranks last year, that in the event of a repetition during the coming season, the Committee be urged to create a senior and junior sections in "A" Grade.

The Advisory Sub-Committee presented its report with the following recommendations:-

- The recommendations were
- (1) In order to secure greater publicity, it is considered desirable to play some senior matches at 1.30 p.m. on the Oval prior to League football matches.
 - (2) That Club Secretaries be urged to increase their activities and that Club Committees should immediately adopt a constructive policy for advancing the game in their respective districts.
 - (3) That provision be made upon the proposed programme of matches for more combined matches in junior ranks.
 - (4) That affiliated Clubs should recognise their responsibility in furnishing the services of match referees and umpires.
 - (5) The indifference displayed by Club Officials in regard to the publishing of match reports, and their culpable negligence in submitting results to the press is deplored, and Clubs are requested to appoint a Publicity Officer who will be responsible for the discharge of these duties.
 - (6) That arrangements be made with a supplying House for new players to obtain a stick upon the Association Secretary's order and to pay the cost by instalments subsequently.
 - (7) That the semi-final and final round be not observed this season, but that the Premiership be awarded to the team in top place at the conclusion of pennant games (2) That thereafter all senior teams and the leading two junior teams participate in an eliminating round for a trophy.
 - (8) That players residing in a defined District which is not represented by a senior team, shall not be granted permits collectively as a body to play for any other single senior team.

These were adopted.

M.W. Abbott moved that it be a recommendation to the Committee, that the position of secretary carry an honorarium to be fixed by the Committee seconded by Mr F.L. Parsons and carried.

M.W. West moved, and M.W. Lublins seconded that it be a recommendation to the Committee that the West Hindmarsh Club be promoted to A Grade. The motion was lost.

M.W. Campbell ^{moved} that the great appreciation of the Association of the services rendered to it by Mr G.W.M. West as secretary since 1914 should be recorded in the Minutes. The motion was carried with acclamation.

M.W. Dowling gave notice that he would move an alteration of the ~~the~~ Constitution, Rule 4.(8) so that the qualification of a player for the University Club should be in conformity with the definition as shown in the rules of the University Sports Association.

"All bona fide members of the Sports Unions of their respective Universities who are proceeding to a University Degree, Diploma, Licence or Certificate conferred by such University, in respect of which they are required by the regulations for the time being of their respective Universities to attend lectures during the period of not less than two (2) years and:-

- (1) Have passed a qualifying examination, entitling them to proceed to such degree, diploma, licence or certificate
- or (2) Have been enrolled on the books of their respective Universities.
- or (3) Are in attendance at lectures at such Universities with the present intention of proceeding to such degree, diploma, licence or certificate.

The following students shall also be deemed to be in attendance at lectures who:-

- (1) For any cause are exempt from attendance at lectures or
- (2) Are doing the course of practical training required to be completed in order to qualify for such degree, diploma or certificate or
- (3) Have passed the Final Examination for such degree, diploma, licence or certificate but in such case only until the first day of May next succeeding the date of such pass.

Provided that in the case of any University having less than five hundred (500) matriculated male students the following shall be eligible in addition to the above, namely - graduates of not more than three (3) years standing, from the first day of May next following the passing of their final examination, who have matriculated not more than eight (8) years prior to the first day of May in the year of such contests, definition,

student who appears on the books of the Adelaide University as a student taking a degree or a certificate or a diploma in law, dentistry, commerce, forestry or music at the Adelaide University.


