If they do it will be their first win over SA in Adelaide since 1953.

South Australia have dominated the senior contests for the past 10 years, in which Victoria's only successes were in 1956 and 1961.

The South Australian team is about the same as last year's, but Victoria have made several changes for a good blending of youth and experience.

Key to the match could be young midfield players Graham Minniece, Mickey Orr and John Martin.

With their pace and skill they should hold the dangerous SA trio Aldenhaven, Fred Nell and Don Gomer.

They should also gain vital breaks through the defence area where Victoria have broken down in other years.

With new tactics being employed by coach Terry Allington, Victoria's defence composition is vastly different this year.

Star goalkeeper Allan Chiron is in top form and can be relied on to produce his best.

This week's "A" grade matches in Melbourne will carry no premiership points.

A record number of players and officials are visiting Adelaide for the interstate game.

But matches in all other grades will continue as usual.

# Sir John Latham lived for work

Sir John Latham summed up his philosophy of life in 12 words on his 80th birthday, nearly seven years ago.

"I am determined," he said, "to keep living as long as I am alive."

Everyone who knew Sir John would agree that he did just that.

He was a man of almost superhuman with a range of inventive kept half a dozen occupied.

Court of Australia, he rarely smiled from the Bench.

But he had a fine sense of humor. He once told a photographer: "I never smile, professionally. It's the job of actresses, glamor boys and people seeking votes to smile — but judges never smile."

Until the last few weeks of his life, Sir John remained ramrod-straight, alert and active.

# NOTED AUST. JUDGE DIES, 86

MELBOURNE, Saturday: Sir John Latham died today, aged 86.

He was a former Chief Justice of the High Court, and a former Deputy Prime Minister.  
Sir John was born in the Melbourne suburb of Ascot Vale and was called to the Bar in 1904.

**In Navy**  
Sir John served with the Royal Australian Navy during World War I, and was a member of the Australian delegation to the Peace Conference in 1919.

He entered politics in 1922 as the Federal member for Kooyong. Sir Robert Menzies' present electorate—and served as Attorney-General and External Affairs Minister.

Sir John was Leader of the Opposition from 1929 to 1931 and Deputy Prime Minister from 1931 to 1934.  
He was Chief Justice of the High Court from 1935 to 1952.

Apart from his legal and political interests, Sir John had a lifetime keenness for sport. He was president of the Amateur Athletic Association for 14 years and had a long association with lacrosse.

for most of the 20th century, fame seemed foreign to his nature.

He was a naturally quiet, shy, serious-minded man, who took years to overcome a fear of public speaking.

During 17 years as Chief Justice of the High

Sir John Latham served in a great number of spheres during his long and constantly active life, and to his every endeavor he brought, unsparingly, his outstanding talents and tireless energy," Sir Garfield said.

"He did this as Parliamentarian, a Minister of the Crown, a diplomat, and as Chief Justice of the High Court, to which office he added dignity and lustre.  
"Many important community activities have profited by his wise counsel and energetic support."

### Outdoor man

He had a house at Ferny Creek in addition to his Jomain Rd., South Yarra, home, and he used to delight in hard, physical exercise, even moving heavy logs around his hills property.

He also loved trout fishing. Sir John was born in Scot Vale on August 25, 1877, the son of the secretary of the Society for the protection of Animals, who referred doing good deeds as being paid a big salary.

Thomas Latham, who died in Melbourne in 1938, was proud of the fact that he never earned more than £300 a year.

He sent young John Latham, eldest of four brothers, to the George St. State School in Fitzroy, where he later won a Government scholarship to Scotch College, then in East Melbourne.

He won exhibitions at Scotch which carried him on to an outstanding career at Melbourne University. He graduated Master of Arts and Master of Laws.

He was also a successful sportsman. He represented Victoria at lacrosse and ran 100 yards in 10 secs. at the peak of his athletic career.
