## THE SOUTH AUSTRALIAN ASSOCIATION.

The annual report of the South Australian Lacrosse Association, which will be presented at the annual meeting to-night by the hon. secretary (Mr. H. W. Hodgetts), states that the period under review was most interesting, and taking everything into consideration, very successful. Not the second successive year did inter-State contests took place in Adelaide, as expected, but unscrupulous foot, as the great event of the year (the carnival) was held in Melbourne, and superseded all other engagements. The association team was strong though perhaps not equal to the South Australian teams of few years ago, when P. M. Newland, L. Humphries, A. S. Mann, R. Kell, L. L. Jones, C. V. Hughes, and W. D. Taylor were in the team. The team never reached a second time in the triumphs of Victoria. Although a great surprise to South Australia it was generally conceded that the women played finely and thoroughly deserved their success. The South Australians were victorious in the remaining matches and gained second position. They succeeded in establishing a record for inter-State matches by scoring 27 goals to 5 against Tasmania. During the coming season Victoria will win. Adelaide is just too young since we proved victorious upon the Adelaide Oval, and the fact that South Australia has never been beaten on her home ground should inspire players with determination to keep up the records. The local competition was again keenly contested, and the committee congratulate the Sturt Club upon having annexed the premiership for the second successive year. This result was obtained by first-class all-round play and judicious attention to practice. Captain W. Noblett worked toward this end, and it is regretted that this fine player has decided to leave the field. He has for many years been a leading figure in club, inter-State, and international lacrosse, and will be missed. Several old and promising players reappeared, and, aided by some excellent jimmies, brought their clubs rapidly to the front. The University students did not in the first place show as well as in 1911, when they were runners-up, but taking into consideration the fact that they had several unused juniors they came out with credit. Captain Campbell was the right man in the right place, and maintained his status as the crack goal-keeper. South Australia.

North Adelaide dropped from second to fourth on the list owing to several leading members having retired, and others being unable to play until late in the season. The waders compiled the fifth position. East Torrens again took the list.

The semi-final system was again an unequalled success, and caused the interest to be sustained up to the last match. The competition in the B grade received itself into a contest between University and Sturt. A special line is due to Goodwood Club for their courage in entering in this grade where for a first-year combination they acquitted themselves capitally. The most promising players of each team are mentioned as follow—E. Yuill (the best goalkeeper seen in junior ranks for many years), G. Abbot, Joanson, J. Klose, L. Whittington, P. Fornason, Varley, Swift, H. Henly, K. Godfrey, and N. Abbot. Sturt—T. Tomlinson, J. White, W. Rodens, Ken, S. Smith, D. Gordon, C. Wood (a most capable secretary), P. Lucas, C. Russell, C. Lucas, and D. Searle. East Torrens—J. Lord (goalkeeper), F. Hubbe, E. Hollis, J. Varley, and F. Davidson. North Adelaide—J. Walter, Pawsey, K. Wilkinson, Phillips, J. Gordon, and Matthews. Port Adelaide—F. Williams, Thomas, McDonald, C. Boys, Abbot, P. Ragot, and J. C. Grimes. Y.M.C.A.—Ditmar Daison, and K. Fry. Goodwood—Kew, (in goal), Maclean, Babbage, Foster, Hestwell, Hirvey, L. Croft, and Tronowth.

The Sturt representatives gained the premiership in the C grade, and thereby retained the gurnd. Out of fifteen matches played they won 13. University were runners-up. The sport is well established in the country districts, as was shown by the display given by the Norrie team in the match with the State crack twelve on the Unley Oval. The average attendance of delegates at the ten meetings of the association was 16 per meeting.

## LACROSSE.

SECRETARY'S ANNUAL REPORT.  
The 4th annual meeting of the South Australian Lacrosse Association will be held this evening at the Exchange Hotel, Hindley street. The Secretary (Mr. H. W. Hodgetts), who has compiled a most comprehensive and thoroughgoing report dealing comprehensively with all grades of the sport during last winter. From the following points are taken—Taking everything into consideration the carnival was a most successful. For the second year in succession there was no interstate contest with Adelaide. This was inevitable, but unavoidable, as the carnival in Melbourne superseded all other engagements. South Australia's team was strong, but not equal to the teams of a few years back, when those giants of the game, P. M. Newland, L. Humphries, A. S. Mann, F. Keith, L. L. Jones, V. Hughes, and W. D. Taylor were in their prime. The carnival ended for the second time in the triumph of Victoria, who defeated us by 11 goals to 2—a most decisive victory. Although we surprised the South Australians by successfully concluding the carnival, we played magnificently, and thoroughly deserved their success. Our players were victorious in the remaining matches and gained second position, which enabled us to obtain a record for interstate matches by scoring 27 goals to 5 against Tasmania. During the coming season a Victorian side will visit Adelaide, and the committee trust that all players will train hard and make a great effort to represent our province. It is just five years since we proved victorious upon the Adelaide Oval, and the fact that South Australia has never been beaten on her home ground must inspire us with a determination to break up the record. That record was again started by keen competition, and the committee congratulates the Sturt club on having won the senior premiership for the second year in succession. In each grade results obtained by first-class all-round play and judicious attention to practice. The captain (W. Noblett) worked toward this end, and it is regretted that this fine player has decided to leave the field. He has for many years been a leading figure in club, interstate, and international lacrosse, and will retire with the best wishes of all with whom he came in contact. The B grade premiership was obtained by University for the second year in succession, with 15 games won out of 17; and in C grade the Sturt representatives were successful. The O grade games were contested in a spirituous manner, but were hampered by military regulations regarding alcohol, but as it will be for the ultimate good of the country we must be prepared to forego something for this important object. The more is well established in the interior and the northern towns, a magnificent display agrees. The State crack twelve on the Unley Oval. The north has a strong association, and the committee will have to send my thanks and congratulations in June. Every effort will be made to return the visit of last year. The report concludes with words of appreciation for the continued interest manifested by the President of the South Australian and other supporters of lacrosse in the sport, including the honorary referees (Messrs. Fisk, Nicholas, and Larmer).

#### ANNUAL MEETING OF ASSOCIATION.

The annual meeting of the South Australian Lacrosse Association was held at the Exchange Hotel, Hindley street, on Monday evening. The President, Mr. G. M. Evan, was in chair, and there was a large and enthusiastic attendance. The report of the Secretary (Mr. H. W. Hodgetts), which has already been published, was read. Mr. W. B. Lang (Treasurer) presented the balance sheet, which indicated credit of £6/6 in hand on the year's operations, and the value of assets over liabilities amounted to £13.

The Chairman in moving the adoption of the report and balance sheet, referred to the fact that the Treasurer had been put to a lot of unnecessary trouble, largely, no doubt, to forgetfulness on the part of some members. Lacrosse was a game well worth paying for. Every one who took part in it was a pure amateur. Mr. Lang had done good, energetic work, and it was to be hoped that next year they would endeavour to have more difficulty to balance sheet to present. They were proud of the report which Mr. Hodgetts had put before them. It was most thorough and comprehensive. South Australia ought not to be beaten by Victoria. The Central State had just as good material as in the past, and if they would only stick to their efforts, he was sure they would again beat South Australia. He had been in the Commonwealth Games Committee in the Commonwealth. He congratulated the Sturt Club on having won the premiership. They had a remarkable record, as in 11 years they had been premier six times, runners-up thrice, and unplaced only twice. Last year he had presented a shield, to be won three times by any club, but now asked the committee to alter the work, and let the trophy become the property of a team after success in two years. (Applause.) He would take the keenest interest in their doings, and trusted that they would have a really good season. The association would like to have made a presentation to Mr. Hodgetts at that meeting in recognition of the valuable work he had done, but unfortunately he was late on the balance sheet, and so could not do it. They appreciated the fact, however, that in him they had an ideal Secretary. (Applause).

The motion was seconded by Mr. A. S. Mann, and agreed to.

Mr. Hodgetts, in responding, said the only reward he wanted was to see results from his work. During the first season he had been Secretary, and had not beaten Victoria, and he hoped a special effort would be made to do so this year. (Hear, hear.)

#### ANNUAL MEETING OF THE ASSOCIATION.

There was a large attendance at the annual meeting of the Lacrosse Association at the Exchange Hotel on Monday night. The president (Mr. G. M. Evan) was in the chair.

Mr. W. B. Lang (treasurer) presented the balance-sheet, which showed a small credit balance on the year's operations, and a balance of assets over liabilities of £13. The President, in moving the adoption of the report and balance sheet, details of which have already been published, said the report was of a comprehensive nature. They were bound up with the secretary, Mr. H. W. Hodgetts (cheers). He regretted the result of the carnival games, as South Australia had no right to be beaten by Victoria. (Hear, hear.) He gave Victoria every credit for the progress of the game in that State, but unfortunately the game had been going back in South Australia, and this ought not to be so. (Cheers.) There were still champions in the field if they would only bring themselves out, and he trusted that the coming contest with Victoria, the South Australian team would uphold the honor and prestige of this State as they used to do in former days. (Cheers.) In the enthusiastic meeting that night there was sufficient evidence of the splendid class of men playing the game. They had only to stick to it to come out on top. He congratulated Sturt on the position they had occupied for the past 11 years—six times winners, three times runners-up, and twice unplaced. (Cheers.) He could not conclude without a reference to their hon. secretary, who deserved recognition, but what could they do with 16/6? (Laughter.) (Mr. Hodgetts—“It is quite unnecessary.”) He assured Mr. Hodgetts, however, that if he would take the position for another year they would not fail to recognise the splendid services he had rendered the association. A good secretary was the backbone of an association. (Cheers.) Referring to the balance-sheet, Mr. Evan explained the heavy losses incurred of those clubs that had not forwarded subscriptions, would do so without fail in the future.

Mr. A. S. Mann seconded the motion, which was carried.

Mr. Hodgetts, in reply, said whatever he had been able to do for the association was done for the love of the game, and the only reward he looked for was to see South Australia on top. (Cheers.)

It was decided that the season should open on April 1, with the first match in May, and that the association A and B grade contests be arranged on the final round system. The secretary reported that the Victorian team would be visiting South Australia this year, and that a trip to Jamestown would be arranged in June. On the motion of Mr. Lang, it was resolved that the committee be instructed to take some steps to recognise the work of the referees.
