In view of the fact that 1936 was South Australia's Centenary year and as a special feature in that respect Mr Harvey said he desired to move a motion that the 1936 carnival players be permitted to retain their uniforms and no charge be made. This was seconded by Mr Hale and carried unanimously.

Junior A letter was received from Port Adelaide teams club in regard to junior walkers and Committee a discussion followed in connection with the prospects of getting the game into the primary schools.

W. B. Seltz and Mr. Steele were eventually appointed a deputation to wait on the Superintendent of Primary Education (W. Martin) to obtain his views on the question.

Picture Slides It was stated that Mr. Owen Gellert had agreed to design slides for picture theatres inviting recruits for the game at cost of 7/6 each.

Resolved that the cost of slides be borne by the clubs in whose district the slides are shown and that the Association Secretary write to Club Secretaries advising them to intitiate to Mr. Plaisted or Mr. Newland of the Junior Committee the numbers of slides required (Taylor - Newland).

Ways & Means W. A. Taylor reported that the Ways & Means Committee had met but although the Committee had several schemes in mind it was not prepared to make a recommendation at this stage. A scheme which would require discreet handling was mentioned by W. Taylor and it was decided to leave same in his hands to discuss further with his committee.

W. Kirkwood (Victorian visitor) gave an outline of the Victorian Associations efforts to raise funds per medium of a Gymkana.

W. B. Seltz stated that he would be visiting Melbourne later in the month and would obtain full particulars of the idea from the Victorian Secretary and report back at the next meeting.

Obituary The chairman W. Abbott referred briefly to the recent death of W. G. B. Otto, a vice president of the Association and East Somers Club.
