Minutes Minutes of committee meeting held on 6th November were read and confirmed, also special committee meeting on June 5th read and confirmed  
Business arising out of minutes  
Baseball League Nothing further to report and deferred until next meeting  
Amateur Sports Club. It was resolved that this Association pay this year's affiliation fee with Amateur Sports Club and the Secretary to report before next year in order to consider the matter.  
Leave of absence The Secretary read out the leave of absence ruling as given by the President Mr B. L. Abbott. Clause 5 is designed to require the attendance of a delegate in person and the fact that his club is entitled to be represented by a proxy delegate is no excuse for the non attendance at Committee meetings of the delegate himself. The proxy delegate is clearly intended to represent the Club on the usually rare occasions on which the delegate himself is for some good reason unable to attend or when his attendance has been excused by the express leave of the Committee. An apology by an absent delegate for his non attendance which is recorded in the minutes is merely an expression of his regret at being absent. It cannot be

construed as in any way expressing the leave of the Committee for his absence. The only way, in my opinion, in which the Committee could express leave of absence is by a resolution granting leave of absence for the future for one or more meetings. Or by excusing the absence of a delegate on one or more previous occasions and granting leave in respect of those past occasions. The express leave of the Committee cannot be a granting of leave which has been definitely and clearly expressed or stated and this can only be done by a resolution of the Committee. As I intimated above this leave may be given for the future or may be extended to past absences if the Committee so desires. It was resolved that no action be taken and that such necessary leave may be granted to the members affected.

Deal Levy The Chairman gave his ruling in this matter that the Amateurs Club be made to pay the amount of 6/- for a mascot that was forfeited.

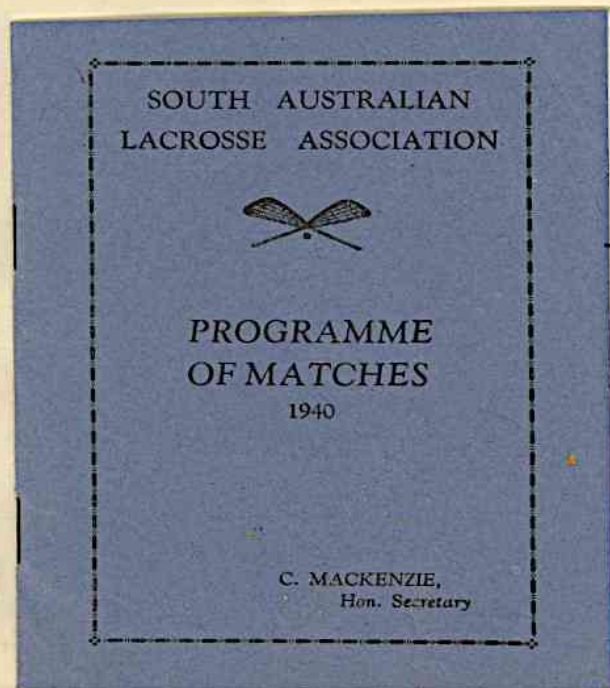
