

The Men's Game

There are 16 players on a team; 10 of these players take the field and the remaining 6 are substitutes who go on to the ground to replace one of the original players during the game. Substitution of players is made at any time during play. The ground (similar in size to a hockey ground) is divided into two halves by a centre line and at all times each team must have 3 players in the attacking zone and 4 players in the defending zone otherwise the team is deemed off-side and receives a penalty. The game is played in four quarters of 25 minutes duration with ends changed at the end of each quarter. To start the game the ball is placed between the backs of the centre men's Lacrosse sticks and faced-off. This face-off occurs at the beginning of each quarter and following every goal. A player who fouls an opposition player is sent to the penalty box and his team must play one man short for the duration of the penalty. Fouls are called for striking an opponent on the head or body with the Lacrosse stick, in the act of checking the opponent's stick to dislodge the ball. This is a fast, physical sport with a lot of body clashes and a great deal of skill in the use of the Lacrosse stick.

The Women's Game

The team in Women's Lacrosse consists of 12 players all of whom are on the field during the game. The ground does not have any set boundary dimensions, but the distance between the goals is between 90 and 110 yards. There is no division of the ground into zones as in Men's Lacrosse and all players may move up and down the field during play. Playing time is two periods of 25 minutes with ends changed at the end of the first period. Body contact is kept to a minimum by the rules and position play is a feature of the game. When the whistle is blown to cease play for any reason all players must stand still, which is different to the free movement allowed in Men's Lacrosse. Checking of an opponent's stick is allowed, but rough play or wild checking will result in a free throw against the player infringing the rules.
