

## LACROSSE.

### SOUTH AUSTRALIAN ASSOCIATION.

#### ANNUAL MEETING.

Mr. G. M. Evans, presided over the twenty-first annual meeting of the South Australian Lacrosse Association which was held in the Exchange Hotel on Monday evening. In moving the adoption of the report and balance sheet the president referred to the achievements of the past season, and congratulated members on the keen interest they displayed in the game.

#### Annual Report.

The annual report presented by the secretary (Mr. Hodgette) stated:—"The period under review covers only a little over four months of actual play, but was most interesting. From the inter-State team to the lowest "C" Grade all players appeared keen and enthusiastic, and as all desired, and we trust that the game will always be played in as thorough a manner. There were no inter-State matches in Australia as it was our turn to visit the Eastern States. A strong side left here in August to play in Melbourne and Brisbane under the able management of Mr. W. Fisk. The first and most important match of the tour was played against Victoria in Melbourne on Saturday, August 12, at the Melbourne Cricket Ground. The scene of a very memorable match between the two States, and resulted in victory for the home team with 6 goals to 5, an extremely close game, in which the honors were well divided. Our representatives played a magnificent game, and were really unfortunate in losing. I am pleased to be able to conscientiously chronicle that as true sportsmen they gave their opponents every due credit for their success. South Australia must live up and endeavor to again occupy that high position held by lacrosseurs for so many years.

#### The Local Competition.

"The competitions were again most highly fought out, and the honor of the Champion Team goes to Sturt, a club that for many years was almost invincible. No one will begrudge them the honor. Throughout the season they played as one man, the combination in the forward line, led by Captain Noblett, assisted by E. Farrell, J. Moffat, P. W. Searle, R. Hill, and H. E. Wickes, was the secret of their success. "Absolute unselfishness" was their motto, and well was it adhered to. Strange to say the only match lost was to the bottom team, Port Torrens. To the Sturt Club the committee and all lacrosseurs extend their sincere congratulations. The Sturt players have the honor of being the first club to win the pennant so generously donated by Dr. K. J. Counter. University here gained second place, an advance on the previous season, when they occupied third position. At one time they threatened seriously to replace the premiers, but in the latter part of the competition were not playing as well as during the early games. In G. C. Campbell they had the champion goalkeeper of Australia, and in L. Pinch and C. Yeatman two excellent forward players. North Adelaide, after two very successful years, had to be content with third place. The loss of many of the giants of former years to a large extent accounted for this. At times they showed fine form, but were not as good a combination as in 1910. With the proposed return of several of the older members the committee will have to try some new blood during the ensuing season, and we trust they will prove successful. Holdfast Bay played well, and promised to make a bold bid for the championship, but the old complaint, "lack of the necessary time for training," was heard, and became very evident as the season went on. With a very enthusiastic secretary at the head of affairs in Mr. Cooper we trust an effort will be made this year to overcome the difficulty and that Holdfast Bay will be very near the top of the tree. East Torrens for the second successive season occupy the last line on the racing table. The season was started with an almost new team, and at times a most encouraging exhibition was given.

B Grade.  
"The B grade premiership was won by University B for the second year in succession with an excellent record, and I now have pleasure in conveying to them the congratulations of the association. Their play was an outstanding feature of the B grade matches all of which were played in a most experimental manner. The Deaf Mutes were second, followed by Port Adelaide and Holdfast Bay. Space does not permit of separate reference to each club, but I would like to state that the committee is fully aware that the B grade is the recruiting ground of the association for future inter-State players, and are anxious to do everything possible to make the competition interesting for them. I would like to record the names of the most prominent B grade players:—University—G. Vuill, C. H. Hains, Millhouse, E. Geddes and Lawrie. Deaf Mutes—W. Barnes, Abbott, Rankine, J. and G. McDonald and Langley. Port Adelaide—M. J. Naughton and A. Connolly (both "old" Juniors, who are doing good work coaching beginners), H. Blackburn, K. Brock, Briar, J. C. Grierson, and Webb. Holdfast Bay—F. Vuill, B. Cooper, T. Bennett, J. Hill, and J. Wheeler. North Adelaide—J. Walker, J. Brown, H. L. Bowen, Dittmar, and L. Browne. East Torrens—A. Lill, F. Lill, F. Hughes, D. H. Richardson, and R. Gepp. Sturt—R. Croft, West, G. Smith, and Schultz. Y.M.C.A.—Fry and C. J. Mee.

#### C Grade.

The C grade premiership was won by Sturt C in a most decisive manner, and they gain also the right to retain the Garland shield for 12 months. A strong combination, well organised by Secretary Ashwin, and captained by Colebatch.

#### Country Clubs.

"It is certain that lacrosse has obtained a strong hold in the country districts, and city teams on off Saturdays need never be idle, as enjoyable games are to be had within a few hours' journey. The hospitality of our country opponents has always been of the most generous nature, and they are always very willing to get visits from leading Adelaide clubs. The following towns have teams:—Jamestown, Crystal Brook, Calloway, Port Pirie, Kadina, Wallaroo, Moonta, Kapunda, and Murray Bridge. Frequent visits were paid during the season to Kapunda and Murray Bridge, and both of those clubs reciprocated the compliment. On the June holiday the Sturt club had a very pleasant game at Jamestown.

#### Referees.

"The duties of referee have again been most thoroughly carried out by Messrs. J. Larmer, W. Fisk, and E. Nicholas.

#### Other Business.

It was decided that the ensuing season should begin from April 1. On the motion of Mr. J. C. Grierson, seconded by Mr. J. McDonald, it was unanimously decided to amend the constitution so as to allow the deaf mutes to amalgamate with Port Adelaide, so that a B grade team may be sent from Port Adelaide in addition to B and C teams.

It was also decided that the B grade have the same system of semi-finals as in A grade.

The secretary mentioned that he had received a letter from Victoria stating that arrangements were being made to bring an English team out to Australia in 1913. Another letter from the Victorian Association drew attention to the carnival, which is in preparation to hold in Melbourne in August in similar lines to the Adelaide carnival of 1910.

The newly formed Goodwood club was admitted to the association.

At the conclusion of the business Mr. Taylor presented Mr. Hodgette with a set of fruit knives in recognition of the services he had rendered to the association in the position of secretary. Mr. Evans followed suit by handing him a case of pipes as a personal present. Mr. Hodgette expressed his deepest thanks to the donors, and assured members that he would at all times be only too willing to help forward the game of lacrosse, the interests of which they all had at heart.

## LACROSSE ASSOCIA- TION.

### ANNUAL MEETING.

Great enthusiasm was displayed at the annual meeting of the Lacrosse Association, which was held on Monday evening in the Exchange Hotel. There was a large attendance. The Secretary (Mr. H. W. Hodgetts) presented the annual report and balance sheet. The review covered only a little over four months of actual play, which was, however, most interesting. From the minute team to the lowest G grade combination, all played with apparent zest and enthusiasm. It was pleasing to note the cordial relations existing between South Australia and all the other States. It was trusted that those who took up the work of the association in the future would endeavour to maintain that satisfactory state of good fellowship. Local competitions had been happily fought out, and the honour of being champion team went to Sturt. That club for many years had been almost invincible and nobody had any doubt that it would be the club to win the pennant given by Dr. E. J. Counter. It was certain that lacrosse had obtained a strong hold in the country districts, and enjoyable games were to be had by city teams after a few hours' journey. The hospitality of country clubs had always been of the most generous nature, and they were always willing to receive visits from Adelaide lacrossers. The referees had carried out their duties most thoroughly. Players were under a deep obligation to them for their continued interest. The balance sheet showed a credit of £11. Carried.

Mr. G. M. Evan (President), in proposing the adoption of the report, complimented the Secretary upon its careful compilation. Mr. Hodgetts was the right man in the right position. He congratulated Sturt upon having gained premiership honours. They had played clean, unselfish lacrosse. (Applause.) He was glad to support the game, which he looked upon as the one which required most skill. The Victorians were to be congratulated upon their victory against South Australia. The strengthening of the game in the other States was pleasing.

A motion to alter the constitution to allow members of the Port Adelaide and Deaf Mute Clubs to amalgamate was carried, on the motion of Mr. J. C. Grierson, seconded by Mr. J. McDonald. It was pointed out that neither of the teams mentioned would be able to place a combination in the senior ranks without amalgamation.

The date for the opening of the season was fixed at May 1. The first match will be played on the initial Saturday in May.

There was a discussion about the desirability of playing off semi-finals in the B grade. It was decided that that system should be followed, and the practice of former years should be the same this year in A grade.

The Secretary intimated that it was hoped an English team would be brought out to Australia in 1913. The announcement was greeted with applause.

A letter from the Victorian Association with reference to the carnival to be held at Melbourne this year, was read. The dates had been fixed between August 19 and 27. It was stated that the Victorians would not be able to send a team to South Australian carnival.

The newly-formed Goodwood Club was granted affiliation with the association as juniors of the Sturt Club.
