To mark this occasion the Australian Lacrosse Council has invited the other Lacrosse playing nations to send teams to compete in a World Series in Melbourne and as a result teams from England, the United States and Canada will be travelling to Melbourne.

Our Association is particularly pleased that the team from England is staying with us for a few days and will take part in several matches in Adelaide against State teams before travelling to Melbourne.

We all trust that each member of the visiting team will find his stay with us happy and enjoyable and that he will make many friends here among South Australian lacrosseurs.

We are all looking forward to witnessing some good games and also to the pleasure of meeting all our visitors.

THE GAME

Lacrosse is played by two teams of ten players. The object is to score by placing the ball in the opponents' goal. The ball is kept in play by being carried, thrown, hit or kicked in any direction.

The game is of four twenty-five minute quarters played on a field divided into three main areas which are the attacking zone, the defending zone and the midfield. No attacking player may enter the goal crease which is an 18 ft. circle around each goal. The ball is out of bounds when it passes over the end or side lines and the team forcing the ball out of bounds loses possession unless it was a goal shot.

An offside situation will occur when a team has less than three players in their attacking half or less than four players in their defending half. It is legal to bump an opponent from the side or front provided that the feet remain on the ground.

The goalkeeper is the only player permitted to touch the ball with his hand and contact on the body of an opponent with the Lacrosse Stick is not allowed at any time.
