Out of Bounds - Team touching ball last loses possession except for a goal shot when the player nearest the ball as it goes O.O.B. gains possession.

Penalties: Technical Fouls - Goal crease interference (see P.2) and Offside where 3 attack and 4 defence must be on either side of the midfield line, Penalty is loss of possession or 30 seconds,

Personal Fouls - Illegal stick check. Hitting a player below knee or from behind or on the helmet or body. Also slashing and tripping count as personal fouls. Penalty - suspension from 1 to 3 minutes. Scores level at end of game - an extra 10 minutes is played. If scores are still tied, a replay is necessary. This applies to Finals only.


SOME HINTS ON THE GAME

Teams of 13 players are normal, but in finals, 15 may be played if both sides agree. Ten players from each team are on the field at any one time, leaving 3 to 5 on the bench. There are generally 3 attack (A), 6 midfield (M), 3 defence (D) and one goalie in a team of 13.

Goals are six feet square. A circle nine feet in radius designates the goal crease. Attacking team members incur a penalty for stepping in the goal crease or defenders for taking the ball into the crease.

The ball is solid rubber about the size and weight of a cricket ball. The match is played over 4 quarters of 25 mins. each. At the start of a game, and after a goal is scored, play is recommenced by a "face-off" or "draw" in the centre. Only the 6 midfield players are allowed in the midfield area until a player actually obtains possession of the ball in his racquet.
