It was reported by Mr. Hamilton, from the Management Committee, that as the 3 Clubs, University, East Torrens, & Woodville had not fullfilled their obligations according to the By-Lew, they would be rem required to supply when needed, "B" Grade players 1, 1, & 2 until their obligations were taken care of. It was agreed that this Association & could have a regualr "corner" in the Crosse News, talking about "Bad" play, and various rule problems that might arise. An approach is to be made to the Editor of Crosse News concerning this. The Coach, it was agreed be empowered to write such articles, and Co-Opt help as he feels is needed, from other referees.

THE HAND is part of the body, therefore any such hit is a foul.

A.M/ELBOW, Such use in checking is considered a foul.

LACK OF GOAL UMPIRES. As stated in rules, if none are provided, such duties become the referee's responsibility, and his decisions are final.

FOULINGas time is called. A referee is in charge from when he arrives, and until he leaves the match venue, therefore, he can still award penalties, make a report etc.

NORIZONTAL CHEEKING. This is permitted, so long as there is no body hitting. (Cardinal Rule still applies.)

RULES DISCUSSION. (CONT.)

TEAM FORFEIT. When a team fields LESS THAN 8 Players, a forfeit can be applied to the advantage of its epponents.

FREE ARM. The interpretation of this was explained, and penalties to be applied.

STACKING OF DEFENDING PLAYERS IN GOAL CREASE AREA. There was much discussion on this point. In general it was felt that the interpretation is as follows until further notice. When it is a free shot for goal, there be only the Goal Keeper with in the Goal Urease Area. No other players be permitted within. If they were it was felt that they could only be defending the Goal, and as such would be assuming Goal Keeper priveleges. As only one person can have these priveleges, the Can only be one person in the goal crease area, Ralph Andersen undertook, to seek further clarification of this interpretation from the S.A.A., and reprot back to the next meeting.

A.L.R.A. S.A.L.A MEETING. Malcolm Hamilton raised the point from S.A.L.A that we were invited to attend a special meeting with the S.A.L.A. to talk over the rules, and their interpretation. It was agreed that this was a good idea. Therefore Messis.

RULES INTERPRETATION

FLOW ON GAME.... Whistle Stop -- Whistle start, with as little delay as possible in between when awarding penalty etc.

Referess to be bot so technical (body brushes etc.)

SLOW WHISTLE.... Frees in this instance are to be taken at a spot 20 yds from Goal (not 10 yds. as previously thought.)

WHISTLE..

Referees should whistle twice for any penalties being Given: once to stop play, and again to re-start play. Once the whistle has been blown to stop play, the ball is dead, until play is re-start ed by another whistle.

GOAL KEEPERS DUTIES.... It was decided that our interpretation of this rule be the same as that decided at our last meeting.

Mr. Andersen is still to sort this one out. It was raised too concerning a Keepers stick being checked-- Refer to rules 8,66 & 8,68 .. A check is to be made on the

differences between these two rules. It was suggested, that in rule 8.66 the words " and his cross" be added.

INTIMIDATION.. Interpretation re players hitting deliberately with ball (Rule 9.40)

LANGUAGE & MIS-CONDUCT... See rules 8.107 & 8.112

INJURED PLAYERS.... These players must report, on-field, to the referee through their Captain. A Report at half time, after said player has previously subbed off the field, should not be recognised, therefore there would not be any pairs in such a situation.

SLOW WHISTLE TECHNIQUIE.... Should there be 2 instances, one after the other, it was felt that the more serious, or, the attacking sequence, should take precendence..

BOUNDARY DECISIONS.... Re GoalKeeper. To go back to goal where left handed.

He must go to the spot of the right handed player whose place he took
at the draw.

INCORRECT SUBSTITUTION.... The penalty for this was 30 secs.

8.84 UNFLAYABLE BALL.. This should be more closely watched, that it isn't left in an unplayable state for too long..

<u>PEFFREE</u> (being flattened) Depending on the circumstances he might not be able to continue control of the match. Unless he is completely knocked out, he is in control and the ball still in play. Should he be unable to continue, it would be up to the Home team to provide a person to act a sreferee for the remainder of the match.

HITTING BODY WITH CROSSE.. This is particularly when throwing the ball and contact is made on the follow through. It was considered that this was still a hit on the body and as such the Cardinal rule applied. It was felt that in such circumstances a free throw should be awarded.

NUMBER OF SUBSTITUTES ALLOWED. Upon discussion and reading the relevant By-Lew, it is noted that apart from the "A" Grade who are only allowed tohave 2 substitutes, all other Grades may have the maximum of 5 substitutes.

WILD SWINGING.. If a player were to pick the ball up, and in the same motion, fling in one full sweep back over his head, and in the process hit another opposing player, he would not only be hitting the body, but it would be considered wild swining and be penalised as such.. 9.39

CRASH HELMETS.. (2.8 / 2.9) This was discussed and mention made that no stool was allowed in crosses. Was it allowed in Helmets ? It was felt that any equipment, be it dangerous, should not be allowed. Therefore as such helmets made of steel would constitute dangerous equipment and under no circumstances be allowed.

INJURED HAVES... Some of the decisions of pairing could be left to referees discretion. Perhaps pairing should only be when teams are uneven, but this shouldn't be to the team with the lesser numbers where it would leave them with a shortage on the field. But providing teams are even, such pairing could be used because no team would have an advantage over the other...

OFF-SIDE UMPIRE. Referees should never be used as such. A separate person should always be supplied, and where he is supplied it should be made known to him, that he is to be where he should be as indicated according to the rules.

JUNIOR FINALS.. These matches commence, as noted in the programme book, at 12.45 p.m. sharp. The match is of 4 quarters, each of 15 minutes duration, with 10 minutes at half time, and 5 minutes at three quarter time. Should the match start late, the quarters in general, should be shortened, and warn captains that the match must finish at 2.00 p.m sharp...

DISAGREEGIT IN GOALS SCORED.. If there is any uncertainty in any irregularity that may occur in scores during a match, and no agreement can be reached, the matter should be referred to the Permit Committee for adjudication. To safeguard against this, it was suggested that these goal umpires confer at the end of each quarter to see that their individual scor tallies agree then, so that is a difference occurs, it can be isolated to one quarter and fixed up on the spot.
