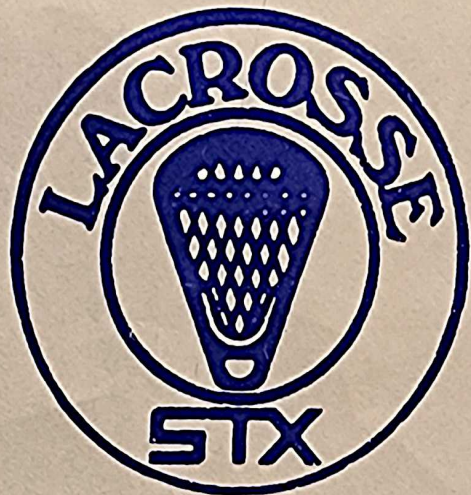

Man in Profile

TOM HAYES, Head Lacrosse Coach

Tom Hayes, who also serves the University as Athletic Promotions Manager, enters his sixth season this spring as head coach of Lacrosse at Rutgers, The State University. In his five previous seasons, the Penn State graduate has compiled a 36-25 record against the nation's stiffest competition.

Hayes took his Scarlet Knight squad to the NCAA play-offs in 1975 and while the team is consistently among the country's top ten teams, Rutgers has just missed the national post-season competition for the past three seasons. Rutgers posted a 9-4 record in 1979.

Hayes played his high school lacrosse at Sewanhaka High School and the New Hyde Park, Long Island native earned All-American honors as a midfielder as an undergraduate at Penn State. He holds the record of goals scored by a midfielder in one game (8). During a four-year stint in the Air Force, he was named to the California All-Star team and was the recipient of the Helms Foundation Award for Sportsmanship in 1966.

He returned to his alma mater in 1967 as assistant lacrosse coach and assistant trainer and was named head coach of lacrosse at Drexel University the next year. At the Philadelphia school, Hayes built a program that produced four straight winners, the final three of which earned play-off births in the USILA tournament. His six-year mark at Drexel was 44-27, including 10-2 and 10-3 marks in 1972 and 1973, respectively.

Hayes chairs the USILA International Games Committee and is also secretary of the International Lacrosse Federation. The recipient of the Man of the Year Award in 1975 for his work as chairman of the International Games Committee, Hayes is also a past member of the Lacrosse Hall of Fame's Board of Directors.

In 1974, Hayes headed a U.S.A. delegation which played in the world championships in Australia. Again in 1978, he led a United States lacrosse squad which competed in the World Lacrosse Tournament in England.

An active clinician at lacrosse camps, Hayes also directs the Summer Lacrosse League centered at Rutgers.

Hayes and his wife, Gretchen, live in Piscataway with their three children, Shannon, Shawn and Thomas.
