Mr Abbott gave notice that he intended to move at the Annual Meeting to suspend Rules 25 & 32 dealing with the Playing of Premiership Matches and registrations of players, for the ensuing season so long as the state of war exists.

Mr A W Hodgetts presented on behalf of the Doctors & Gentlemen, the latter's presentation Premiership Fennant to Mr A Holmes, representing the Start A Team. Mr Holmes responded suitably supported by Mr Delder.

Lieut J R Gordon who had returned from the front gave a description of the Lacrosse Club that was formed in Egypt and also of the Matches played there.

Mr Fish moved a vote of thanks to Mr Evans which was carried by acclamation.

Mr Mostyn Evans asked to be permitted to present a Roll of Honor Board to the Association to record the names of the members who had enlisted. Mr Evans offer was greatly appreciated.

## LACROSSE ASSOCIATION.

Regd. 11.11.1916  
A meeting of the committee of the South Australian Lacrosse Association was held at the Exchange Hotel on Tuesday evening. Mr. H. J. Hodgetts occupied the chair. In regard to the gift of the President of the Association (Mr. G. M. Evans) of an honour board, on which would be the names of all the players who had been serving, and surviving, their country, it was decided, "That in the opinion of this committee all players and officials of the association from 1913 onward be placed on the roll of honour. Some seven hundred men had been playing during the winter. There had been no official programme. The games had been between soldiers and civilians, and the civilians had won by five games. One was drawn. The Hon. Treasurer reported a balance in the bank of £11 17/-.

## LACROSSE PLAYER KILLED.

Regd. 3.12.1916  
A telegram from our Port Pirie correspondent in The Register of Monday recorded the death in action of Cpl. Roy Flett, the well-known lacrosse player. He joined the Australian Army in August, 1915, and left for Egypt last January. He was supposed wounded in August, but returned to the firing line. Cpl. Flett started to play lacrosse in Port Pirie, and in 1913, when he came to the city, he joined the Start club, and played throughout that year and the two following ones. He started as a centre player, but was later placed in attack, where he proved a big success, as he possessed splendid stamina and pace. In 1912, he joined the Port Pirie Club, he visited Adelaide with a selected northern team for the purpose of a practice match, with a team chosen from the metropolitan clubs, so that a team could be picked to represent South Australia at a lacrosse carnival in Melbourne. He was chosen with Eric Mitchell, from the northern players, to go to the Victorian capital. He opened extremely well in Melbourne, but had to come off play because of an injury to a leg. Perhaps Cpl. Flett's finest game was against Broken Hill in a match on the Norwood Oval, in 1914, when he threw six goals, and was described as the best man on the field. He was a really fine fellow, both on and off the lacrosse area, and his associate players did regret his early death. Three other followers of the game have laid down their lives in the war, namely, T. A. Whyte, J. L. Gower, and A. C. Sandland.

Rejected players were now eligible. Several lists have yet to be returned from certain Clubs to the Secretary.

Resolved to place on record the Association's deep regret at the death of one of its champion players Phil Newland. A floral wreath was laid on his grave from the Association.

The Treasury reported a credit balance of £11. 17. 0 in the Bank Accounts passed for payment.
