Australian Lacrosse Council Golden Jubilee

Adelaide, as the venue of the 1981 Australian Lacrosse Championships, is also honoured to celebrate the fiftieth anniversary since the Australian States united in one Lacrosse body, called the Australian Lacrosse Council.

To present day players, the year 1931 would be veiled in the mists of time. On the other hand, there are many spectators at these Championships who will remember this milestone of 1931.

The originally planned purpose of the Australian Lacrosse Council was to control the conduct of the Australian Championships. Little did the officials of those days visualize that this embryonic body would, in 1981, be immersed in a web of far wider responsibilities such as organising overseas tours, arranging trips to Australia by international teams and clubs, controlling three codes of lacrosse in the form of Field Lacrosse, Box Lacrosse and Soft Lacrosse played over the whole calendar year, organising the participation of Australia in the four yearly World Championships, codifying all Lacrosse rules and arranging coaching seminars, controlling Australian Championships at Senior, Colts and Junior levels, maintaining contact with Federal Government Departments for sports/accreditation and development programmes, maintaining official representation on the International Lacrosse Federation and controlling the movement of players internationally.

The officials of the A.L.C. have, by their endeavours over those fifty years, achieved results out of all proportion to the few self sacrificing officers, the limited facilities and the problems of communication and the whole lacrosse community is in their debt.

To celebrate this Golden Jubilee two events have been planned to coincide with the 1981 Australian Championships in Adelaide.

The first is Veterans Lacrosse played under the Lacrosse Rules existing to 1965. The second is a Golden Jubilee Dinner to be held in the East Torrens Clubrooms on Thursday, 2nd July to which all old players and ladies are invited.

I welcome all old players and supporters to join in and support these nostalgic events and by your participation I hope you can revive the pleasures of your younger days.
