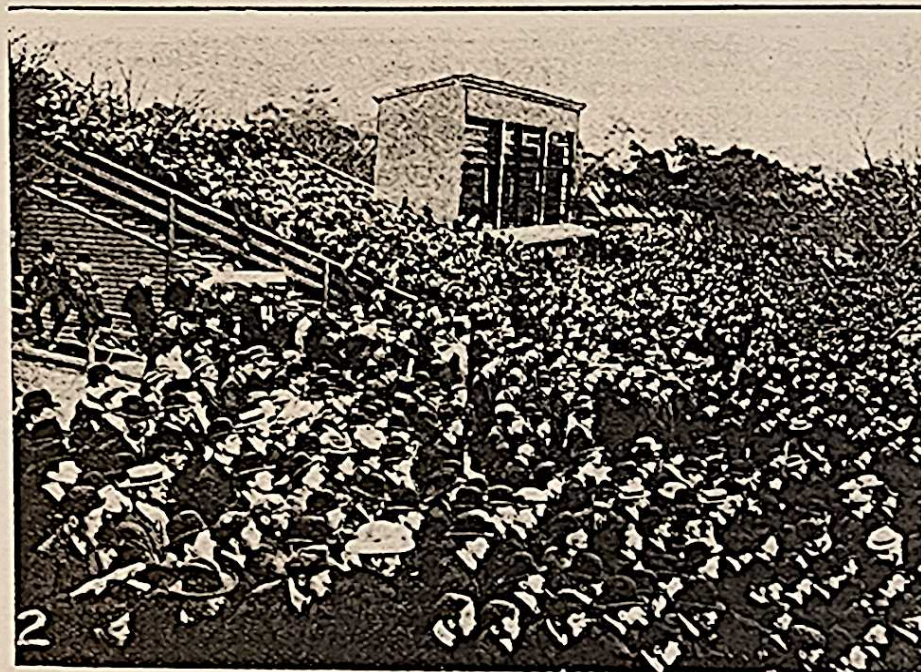

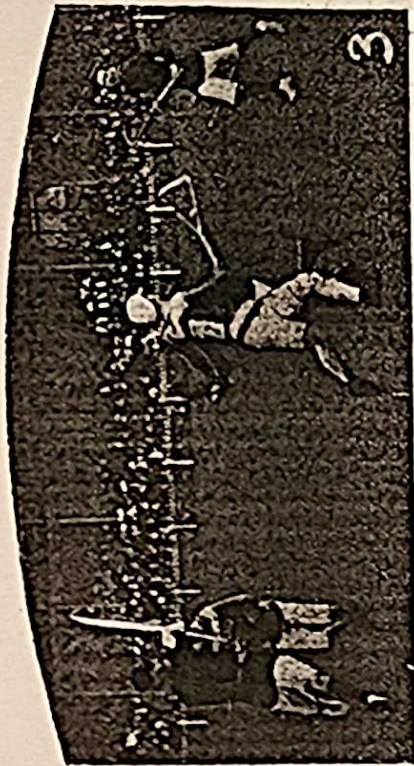

LACROSSE.

At the Hawthorn Lacrosse Club's ball, at Hawthorn on Monday night, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor (Sir John Madden), in responding to the toast of his and Lady Madden's health (proposed by Councillor Dureau), and in proposing at the same time the health of the Canadian team, spoke as follows:—

"The little aid I have been able to give the excellent game of lacrosse has been given from pure admiration of it. We have now come to the parting of the ways, when a game of that sort becomes highly desirable. There are other games played too vigorously sometimes, which give every possible opening for manly effort, but none the less, even in the most strenuous of manly games, there is a place for refinement of a very energetic and active kind. I have always seen that in this game. When I spoke of it some time past as a game for thoroughbreds, I felt that it was so. It is a game for the man deep of chest and swift of limb, in which he who carries over-much brawn or muscle is of very little value except to fill the goal, so that the ball may rebound from his ample person. In all else the game is for the man who is lithe of flank and sound of limb, well balanced, swift of eye, and quick of purpose. Surely a game that encourages those qualities is one well worth cultivation. I am very glad it has now taken hold in Victoria to such a degree that those who are the masters of it, and of whose country it is eminently the chief pastime, have honoured us by coming here as champions to meet our men in the spirit of sportsmen. After reading Mr. Hanley's speeches in the papers on this tour, I was struck with their incisiveness and felicity of expression, and I was not surprised to learn to-night that he was by profession one of ourselves. (Laughter.) It is a wise thing to send us a man of his spirit and powers from Canada, because we want to know a good deal more of one another than we have had the

good luck to do hitherto. We have scarcely anything Canada wants, except lacrosse and ladies. (Laughter.) Those are commodities for which they have a big demand. (Laughter.) I hope this brisk young team will not make any serious gaps in the ranks of the latter, for we have not more than enough for home supply. (Laughter.) Seeing that commerce cannot tie us together as speedily as we could wish, although Canada could supply us with heaps of goods, I hope that visits of this kind will be repeated until the time does come when we exchange goods in due form and quantity, and then I suppose we shall have lacrosse in excelsis. (Cheers.) It is a fine trait of British people that when they have nothing else to do they will play one game or another, even to punching one another's heads for love. (Laughter.) All these things bring out qualities which make the race hum round the world. We are thus always able to respect our brethren from other parts of the world, like those who come to us in the guise of this lacrosse team, playing the game in a way that is a lesson and a revelation to us, and although beaten, taking defeat with all the spirit and nonchalance of sportsmen. (Cheers.) They can easily understand the supreme joy it is to us to have met something like a champion team from Canada and beaten them at their own game; and they will appreciate the fact that in our rejoicing there is no false pride or empty self-sufficiency. (Cheers.) When they beat us, as I am sure they will before they leave, we shall accord them all the cheering, and not begrudge them any of the gratification." (Cheers.)

Mr. W. J. Hanley, captain of the Canadian team, replied in a neat speech, and was warmly cheered.
