motion was seconded by Mr. Batchelor & carried.

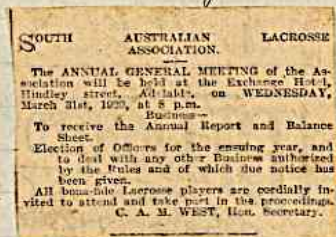
