The 2009 Mens Australian Lacrosse Carnival marks a significant milestone in the history of lacrosse in Australia, with this being the first mens event to be conducted under the auspices of the Australian Lacrosse Association (ALA), the new national governing body for lacrosse in this country. As Chairperson, it is with much pleasure that I welcome players, support staff, umpires and spectators to South Australia for what will be a feast of lacrosse.

This Carnival sees Lacrosse SA hosting three mens competitions, Senior, U19 and U17. It is particularly exciting that there will be two overseas teams competing, Japan and USA West, with the former participating in the senior competition and the latter in the U19's. A Presidents Team will be competing in a series of games, including players from Australia who are currently competing in the USA. This provides a welcome opportunity for all players in the Australian 2010 Squad to prepare for the Australian Squad Camp.

With the Seniors and U19's both being four day events, it is particularly encouraging that at the grass roots youth level of our sport the U17's will hold a seven day event, attracting two teams from Victoria and South Australia, and one from Western Australia and New Zealand. The inclusion of New Zealand particularly augers well for the development of the sport in the land of the "long white cloud" and confirms Australia's commitment to assisting the growth of lacrosse in New Zealand.

The ALA extends their best wishes to South Australia, Western Australia and Victoria as State against State they compete for the glory of being named "National Champions" in the Senior and U19 events.

The ALA recognises and thanks, Lacrosse SA and the 2009 event committee, under the competent and committed leadership of Lynton Arscott, and all those people who have worked on the organisation of this Carnival. The creation of a website specific to this event is a "first" and is of great benefit to the lacrosse community. Our thanks are extended to the members of all the member lacrosse clubs affiliated with Lacrosse SA.

From 9-11 July, the Aussie Sharks will have their final squad try-outs at a training camp for the 2010 Australian Men's team competing in Manchester, England, July 2010. The ALA extends their best wishes to all those trialling for a place with the "Sharks".

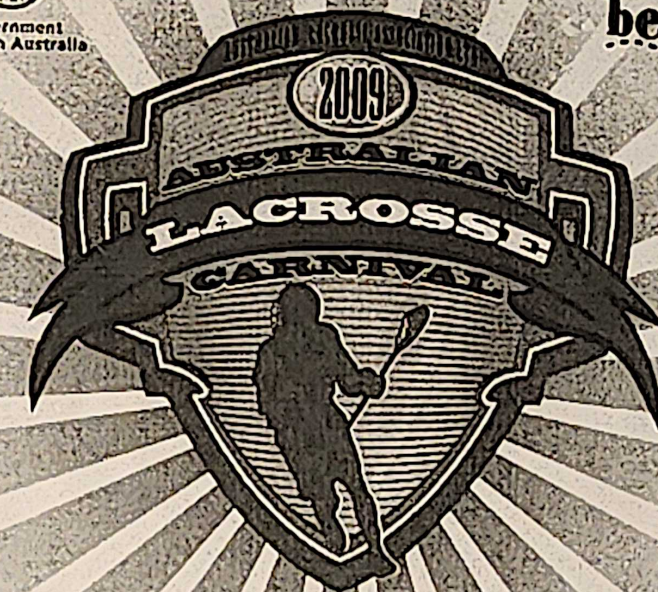
