## LACROSSE.

## ANNUAL MEETING OF THE ASSOCIATION.

The annual meeting of the Lacrosse Association was held at the Exchange Hotel on Tuesday evening. The President (Mr. G. Mostyn Evan) occupied the chair, and there was a large audience. The game has been in recess during the war, but it was evident that there is to be a determined effort to revive it. The secretary (Mr. C. A. M. West) presented the 1918 annual report, which showed that practically all the affiliated clubs had held their annual meetings, and much enthusiasm had been evidenced in each case for the completion and vigorous revival of the sport. As the clubs represented on the programme in 1919 would again appear, but owing to the absence of many past players the number of teams participating is likely to be considerably reduced. The Lacrosse Association, which had been formed in 1913, had again been admitted to the association, and would probably figure in the junior ranks.

The report in regard to the adoption of the report, said if the clubs had not voluntarily decided to suspend operations during the war they would have been forced to do so, as so many of the players had enlisted in service at the front. The members of the various associations had responded to the call of duty with a great credit to the sport. Players were looking forward to the coming season with hopefulness. He believed the sport would soon be placed on an even basis as far as the amateur game was concerned. The game produced fine men (Cheers). In the existing circumstances the balance-sheet was an satisfactory as they could expect.

Mr. H. Hodgetts seconded the motion, which was carried.

At the instance of the secretary it was resolved:-"That players who have changed their place of residence since the premiership matches were suspended be granted the option of playing for the 1919 season with the club with which they last resided or with the district in which they now reside." Mr. West explained that players must continue throughout the season with the clubs they elected to represent.

## LACROSSE REVIVED.

## AN ENTHUSIASTIC MEETING.

In common with other sports, lacrosse was discontinued shortly after the war began, and it is gratifying to learn that this popular game is to be re-introduced in this State. It is the enthusiasm which was the predominant feature of the annual meeting of the South Australian Lacrosse Association at Ware's Exchange Hotel on Thursday evening, May 2nd, to which the attendance was well enough to warrant the future, Mr. G. Mostyn Evan presiding over a large attendance.

The report, which was presented by the hon. secretary (Mr. C. A. M. West), stated that at the general meeting on April 11th their efforts to introduce lacrosse into the high schools had been discussed, and the matter had been left with the committee to determine what further steps should be taken. Upon further consideration he had to advise that further negotiations with the schools had been deferred, while they were in recess. The question would be reviewed again after the schools were again in session. The most important event of the year had been the cessation of hostilities which, in effect, meant, apart from national considerations, the homecoming of the troops with their honourable percentage of heroes and the return of those of our personnel in the places where they had been serving in the coming season. They all rejoiced at the victory achieved, and with lighter hearts, they might now prosecute their duties and pleasures with the knowledge that their freedom had been won.

It was felt that in January last a suitable opportunity occurred in the proposed arrangement to the members of the association who had been serving with the military forces to make the choice of any such club. Last year he was unable to provide a review on that period, but in the circumstances must rather dwell upon forthcoming events. Practically all the affiliated clubs had been in session during the year, and much enthusiasm had been in evidence in each individual case for a complete and vigorous revival of the sport. All the clubs represented on the programme in 1919 would again appear. It was owing to the absence of many of their members, who had been called up to the colours, and had been abroad on active service, especially indicating those of their comrades who had sacrificed their lives for their country. Their lists were incomplete, and he hoped to add to that club by the time referred to so that that might be remedied without delay. He hoped that the game would be thoroughly revived and that the high standard of past years would be maintained.

Mr. West, in moving the adoption of the report, said lacrosse had gone into recess on account of the war, which had terminated so satisfactorily. If the association had not been able to go into recess, the players who had enlisted would have forced them to do so. Many lacrosse men had answered the call to the colours, and the large percentage received was a great credit to the sport. Lacrosse received a great impetus for war, and the coming season's enthusiasm will be great. They would keep the lacrosse flag flying at a great number of clubs, which had done a fine service (cheers). Lacrosse was a strenuous game, and had produced many fine men. That day the Governor had informed him that he considered across the mass armament of all over-age sports.

Mr. H. Hodgetts seconded the motion which was carried unanimously.
