The number of teams entered for competition was 23 as sgainst 29 last year. The number of registered players was 335, compared with 460 last season. In the schoolboys section 188 boys registered, being a decrease of 17 from the previous season. Great interest was displayed by four schools in a mid-week competition conducted by the Junior Technical Schools Sports Association. Owing to the enlistment of a large number of senior players, the Port Pirle Association carried on with three junior teams.
