




Lacrosse in Scotland 1890-1983

Lacrosse was first played in Scotland in 1890 at St. Leonards School. St. Andrews

Records of the first Inter-House matches played indicate that the teams consisted of 8 players and the games lasted for one hour. Photographs show the girls holding sticks with short handles and enormous nets.

By 1895 the teams had expanded to 10 players - 4 forwards, 4 backs, a centre and a goalkeeper. In 1901 the positions of the team members were listed as full forward, 2H., R.A., L.A., C., R.D., L.D., C.P., full back and goals.

In 1913 the first Scottish Trials were held to select a team to represent Scotland in a Tournament against England and Wales.

Matches against England have been regular events since the formation of the S.L.L.A. in 1920. Records of Internationals against Wales have been kept since 1931 and matches with Ireland were played from 1931 until 1970.

The importance of encouraging Junior players was recognised in the early 1970's and a Scottish Schoolgirls team was established. This team has played against the Welsh Schoolgirls annually since 1972, and more recently a fixture has been established against Junior England.

Over the years Scotland has entertained visiting teams from America and Australia. An Australian team visited Scotland during the 1971/72 season and more recently the Australian team came to Edinburgh after narrowly losing to the U.S.A. in the World Tournament Final in October 1982.

Opportunities for Scottish players to tour have been limited until now. A few players have had the opportunity to visit America or Australia as members of a Great Britain Squad. 8 Scottish players went to the U.S.A. as members of the Celtic Touring Team in 1981. It was this tour which seemed to 'spark off' the great improvement in Scottish Lacrosse which has been so apparent during the past two seasons.

Scotland's defeat of England in March 1982 was the first time that Scotland had ever beaten England. At the Brine 1982 World Tournament this success was repeated and as a result Scotland headed the Home Countries table at the completion of a week of matches.

The squad is looking forward to their tour to Australia with tremendous enthusiasm, particularly as it will be the first time that Scottish Lacrosse players have had the opportunity to represent their Country abroad.


