Message from the IFWLA President



As President of the International Federation of Women's Lacrosse Associations (IFWLA) it is with the greatest of pleasure that I welcome participants to my home state of Western Australia, for the 2008 Senior Women's National Lacrosse Championship.

This event was last hosted in Perth in 2001, and during the ensuing seven years I have been privileged to witness two IFWLA World Cups (2001 & 2005), and two U19 IFWLA World Championships (2003 & 2007). Australia has made a significant contribution to these events, and I have no doubts having seen the team lists from the three competing states, that this year's Nationals will be of the highest standard, as this event boasts many of the finest and most respected players in the lacrosse world.

National Championships play a major role in the development of competing athletes, and particularly those with aspirations of representing their country. Many in this event have already donned the 'green and gold', and have enjoyed a strong taste of international competition; the calibre of Australian players is the very reason why Australia remains one of only two nations to have medalled at every World Cup & U19 World Championship since their inception in 1982. Alongside the USA, Australia is the only nation to have also won gold (1986, 1995, and 2005), and with the greatest number of teams in World Cup history, sixteen, competing in Prague next year, eighteen Australians shall take to the field in defence of their current "World Champions" title.

With the International lacrosse world beginning to focus their attention on World Cup 2009, and with my term as International President coming to a close in 5 weeks in Finland, I take this opportunity to wish Head Coach Sue Sofarnos and the Australian Team much success in Prague, and commend and thank past players, support staff, officials and administrators, who have contributed so much to raising the standard of competition and umpiring throughout the International lacrosse world.

The IFWLA has long nurtured a close relationship with Australian lacrosse, and particularly Western Australia, hosts of the 1989 IFWLA World Cup, and the 1999 IFWLA U19 World Championship. We know only too well that events such as these are not possible without organizers, and I pay tribute to Lacrosse West and the Wembley Lacrosse Club, in particular Co-ordinators Karen Mau and Jenny Banyard, for their organization and hardworking efforts to bring this event to fruition.
