

### SYNOPSIS OF PLAY

Play is commenced in the centre of the field. the "centre" player being the connecting link between his side's defending players and the attacking players, giving help, as occasion demands, to both attack and defence divisions. The players are allowed to go wherever they please; experience has taught them how and when to change their positions to best advantage.

It will thus be seen that the game is simply a struggle by a combination of attack players to get rast a combination of defending players, and by sprinting, dodging, quick passing, feinting, and manoeuvring for positions, a breach is made in the ranks of the defenders, and a shot at goal results.

### Extracts from Rules of Lacrosse

When Referee calls "foul," or "out of bounds," no player (except goalkeeper) can move from position in which he may happen to be at the moment.

In the event of accident or injury to any player during a match, Referee has right to direct removal of injured player and equalise the sides.

No player shall hit wildly with his crosse under

any circumstances.

Any player disputing decisions of Referee, claiming fouls on trivial grounds, rough play, or otherwise misconducting himself may be ordered off the field by the Referee.
