AMATEUR SPORTS CLUB & BASEBALL LEAGUE. The Chairman reported that he had not interviewed Mr.Irwin yet regarding this matter, but would do so before next meeting.

Record Secretary. It was decided to leave this appointment until next Meeting when Mr.A.H.Taylor had received a report from Melbourne.

CORRESPONDENCE

Secretary read a letter from the Amateur Sports Club advising that a Sub-Committee from their Club had been appointed to go into the question of the Amateur Sports Club keeping a record of all the affiliated Associations. Mr A.H.Taylor was appointed to interview the Sub-Committee and report back to this Association at the next meeting as to the particulars required by the Amateur Sports Club.

Letter dated 18/1/39 received from Amateur Sports Club advising that, the nomination of a delegate from this Association to their Club was due. On the motion of Mr.V.P.Selth and seconded by Mr Taylor our previous delegate, Mr.H.D. Irving was re-elected.

Letter dated 3/2/39 received from Sturt Lacrosse Club asking, that, in view of the unsatisfactory state of the Club Rooms at the Unley Oval after the Interstate match last year, The Sturt Club, for all future matches played at Unley ~~shall~~ be in control of the rooms etc, this was agreed to by this Association.

BRISBANE CARNIVAL

Secretary read a letter dated 30/11/38 from the Carnival Secretary for the Queensland Association advising certain particulars, he advised that the dates were 29/7/39 and 5/8/39 but later he advised by telegram that the dates had been altered, in order not to clash with the Hockey Carnival and had been put back a week, so that the definite dates were 22/7/39 to 29/7/39. In view of the number of details to be carried out regarding the Carnival it was decided to appoint a Carnival Sub-Committee. The Following members were appointed:—Messrs F.L. Parsons, A.E.Harvey, H.Rule, C.Mackenzie, C.H.Schulz & A.H.Taylor. Mr.Mackenzie Convenor.

Secretary read a letter from the S.A.Railways Lacrosse Club advising that owing to the ~~lax~~ State of their Club's finances they could not see their way clear to help the Association by a voluntary contribution. Letter received.

The Secretary reported that the Chairman and himself had accepted a quotation from the Adelaide Sports Depot for 6 doz Junior Sticks at 15/9 plus 5% nett 30 days.

The Chairman reported that he still had 12 sticks from the last shipment slightly rat-eaten. It was decided that the sticks be shown at the next meeting.

Mr.Rule reported that he had spoken to Mr.Nelson of S.A.P.S.A.S.A. who reported that owing to the holidays his Committee would not be meeting until late in February, so that we would not know until then, whether any further schools would be playing this Season.

Entertainments

Mr.J.L.Parsons reported that the Palais had been booked on the 18th July for the Annual Ball. Members pointed out that mostly our Carnival team will have left for Brisbane by this date and Mr.Parsons was asked to try and arrange the Ball date for a week earlier.

The Convenor Mr.C.H.Schulz reported that owing to pressure of business he had not called the Committee together but hoped to do same next week.

Baseball League The Chairman reported that the Baseball League had been re-admitted to the Amateur Sports Association. The reason given was that, as they had served about 4 or 5 years disqualification, it was ~~thought~~ deemed to be sufficient reprimand. Report received.

From the discussion which followed it seemed that many members thought the Goodwood Lacrosse Ground should be handed back to the Goodwood Lacrosse Club.

Moved by A.E. Harvey and seconded by J. Wiles that H.E. Irving be asked for a report on what views were taken in the matter of having the Goodwood ground returned. Carried.

Amateur Sports Assoc. Records It was suggested that the information contained in the Annual Report was sufficient for the records, proposed to be kept by the Amateur Sports Association.

Post Records Moved by J. L. Parsons and seconded by J. Leeder that A.H. Taylor be requested to investigate the possibility of collating the past records of this Association and perhaps appointing a sub-committee for such purpose. Carried.

Correspondence A letter was received from Adelaide City Council re 3 grounds in South Park Lands.

Resolved that the rent £3-15-0 be paid for these grounds.

Carnival Committee A.E. Harvey reported that the recommendations of the Carnival Committee were as follows:-

- (1) That 24 players be selected for practice <sup>immediately</sup> after the second match of the season,
  - (2) That the final 16 players be selected immediately after the last Saturday in May
  - (3) That the team play two trial games, one of which be played on the June holiday
  - (4) That the Carnival team consist of 16 players and a Manager
  - (5) That the Manager be appointed forthwith and recommend Mr. C. Mackenzie
  - (6) That the team should leave not later than 17 July 1939 arriving in Brisbane on 20<sup>th</sup> and leave Brisbane on 30 July (17 days)
  - (7) That fares and board be paid by the Association
  - (8) That the team should be granted a second class fare from Adelaide to Sydney and first class fare and sleeper from Sydney to Brisbane - (1/13/14/14 Return)
  - (9) The team should book at the Gate Hotel, Queen Street, Brisbane.

Resolutions Recommendations (1), (3) and (4) were carried unanimously.

(2) was passed as a recommendation to the Program Committee for 1939 season.

Resolved that C. Mackenzie be appointed Manager. Recommendations (6), (7) and (9) were duly passed by the meeting.

The matter of the teams fares was discussed at length and it was decided that, for the present, the Committee could only commit the Association to a second class return fare right through. It was felt that the incoming Committee would consider the matter of allowing for the first class return fare and sleeper between Sydney and Brisbane in due course.

A copy of the proposed Model Bylaws had been handed to each member of the Committee and it was suggested that they be dealt with as soon as convenient probably 1st May.

Badges

H. Rule showed the Committee two sample badges which could be sold by the Association with a view to ~~not~~ raising funds for the Carnival.

Resolved that the badges should be of the brooch type and that the matter of purchasing of these badges be left for consideration by the incoming Committee.

Minutes of the Annual General meeting held on 21st March 1938 were read and confirmed.

Report On the motion of Mr. A. E. Harvey, seconded by Mr. Rule the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for season 1938 as distributed to members were taken as read.

Financial Report Mr. Schulz then read a report on the finances of the Association and also read out comparisons of the management and finances of the Association in other States.

Adoption Report Mr. Davidson in moving the adoption of the Annual Report and Balance Sheet congratulated the Committee on their policy in the encouragement of Junior Lacrosse. He also spoke on the very satisfactory state of the finances of the Association but he was not altogether in favor of the Association paying all expenses of the interstate players. He considered players should be prepared to pay at least some of the expenses. Mr. J. L. Parsons seconded the motion for the adoption of the Report and Balance Sheet and supported Mr. Davidson's remarks in the matter of the expenses of interstate players.

The adoption of the Report and Balance Sheet was carried unanimously.

Constitution & Rules

- (a) Constitution.—That in Clause 5, Subsection C, line 3, the words "every 30 members or fractional part of 30," shall read "every 45 members or fractional part of 45."  
 (b) At the end of Clause 5, Subsection C, shall be added, "each Club shall be entitled to appoint a proxy delegate in place of each appointed delegate unable to attend any meeting of the Committee. Such proxy delegate appointed by his Club shall hand to the Secretary of the Association on his arrival at the meeting concerned notice of his appointment in writing signed by his Club Secretary."  
 (c) Rules.—"That Rule 2, Subsection (f), be deleted from the Rules of the Association."

Mr. Schulz seconded.

Mr. McCormick in supporting the amendments advised that he wished the Chairman to take clause (a) first and then (b) and (c) to follow as he thought it was necessary to take clause (a) separately from clauses (b) & (c). On a show of hands it was decided to take a vote on them separately.

Mr. Mackenzie moved an amendment to clause (a) to the effect that one delegate be allowed for 50 members or part of 50 members. The amendment was carried but on becoming the motion the chairman called for a division and as it did not receive the required 75% majority the motion was lost.

Clauses (b) and (c) were duly carried. Mr A.B. Cox moved a vote of thanks to the chairman who had so ably substituted for Mr. Abbott which was carried by acclamation.

All these recommendations were adopted by the committee and it was decided that the votes on the Dunks Trophy were to be disclosed at the end of the season.

Letter dated 24.4.39 received from the Editor of the Sporting Globe advising that owing to the limited amount of space they could not grant any column for South Australian Lacrosse notes. The matter of increasing the size of the Sporting Globe was receiving attention and should the size be made bigger they would advise us.

Letter received from Port Pirie Lacrosse Association asking for assistance to a junior grade. They are trying to form in Port Pirie. Secretary instructed to advise them that we could not help them as all old sticks have been taken up by the local clubs. The secretary also requested to send them a form of affiliation for this season.

Letter received from the 27 Battalion asking permission to use one of the Association grounds in the South West as their home ground. Permission granted.

Mr. MacKinnon pointed out that owing to the Railways not having sufficient grounds they also would be playing a number of matches on the Association Grounds. # AUSTRALIAN LACROSSE COUNCIL

Annual Report Year ending 31st March, 1939

PRESENTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING HELD AT THE COMMERCIAL TRAVELLERS CLUB, MELBOURNE, ON MONDAY, 29th MAY, 1939.

Mr. President and Gentlemen,

It is my privilege to submit for your approval the Eighth Annual Report of the Australian Lacrosse Council covering the year 1939. During the past three years it has been my pleasing duty to comment on the steady progress lacrosse was making, but to-night I regret that I have to report there has been a very serious setback in respect to the number of players during the year under review. In 1937 the total number of players in the Commonwealth stood at the record figure of 2,702; this unfortunately has decreased during the past year by 272 to 2,430, or in other words 10 per cent. of our players were lost. This is a very serious position, and I therefore propose to deal with it later in my report.

MEETING.—Only one meeting of the Council was held during the year. Our President, Mr. C. Lempriere Abbott, once again made a special journey from Adelaide to preside, which was greatly appreciated by the delegates.

INTERNATIONAL VISIT.—At the last meeting of the Council a sub-committee was appointed to investigate the possibility and cost of an international visit and to suggest methods of financing same. Shortly after the appointment of this committee affairs in Europe took a very serious turn, which, in my opinion, rendered it futile to think of international visits. I therefore take the responsibility for not calling this committee together. I would suggest that the committee be reappointed and authorised to make a report before the next Annual Meeting, provided the international outlook shows signs of improvement to justify consideration being given to a venture of this magnitude.

PROPOSED REVISION OF RULES.—In my report of last year I made reference to the laws of lacrosse and enumerated a number of alterations that had been successfully brought into operation in other countries, notably the United States of America, and made suggestions that a number of these innovations were worthy of a trial in actual play. The Council adopted these recommendations, and the State Associations were requested to make a thorough test of these proposed rules under match conditions. It is pleasing to report that all States readily adopted the Council's request, and staged a number of games in which these proposed rules were in operation. It is to be regretted, however, that although asked for last year, all the reports did not reach me until a few weeks ago, and in certain instances the information was so meagre that it was of very little value to the sub-committee appointed to collate the reports. From this report, which will be placed before you to-night, it will be noted that the only suggestion that was unanimously received was that dealing with the enlargement of the centre ring. Those suggestions relating to off-side play, the reduction in the number of players constituting a team and the dimension of the playing field were rejected. Regarding the proposed substitute rule, the views of the States are somewhat obscure, and it is suggested that this question should be referred back to the State Associations for further consideration.

GARLAND McHARG CUP.—The deed of trust in reference to the Garland McHarg Cup as adopted by the Council, and appointing Messrs. C. Lempriere Abbott, R. O. Moore and I. J. Taylor as trustees, has been drawn up and now awaits the final act of signing, which will be officially carried out to-night.

**AUSTRALIAN LACROSSE CARNIVAL.**—The Queensland Lacrosse Association has advised the Council that the date for the Ninth Australian Lacrosse Carnival has been fixed for 15th to 22nd July, and all States have signified their intention of competing. A very successful carnival is confidently anticipated.

**FINANCIAL.**—The Hon. Treasurer, when submitting the financial statement to-night, will report that the Council has a credit balance at the Commonwealth Bank of £42/5/9, and assets amounting to £48/9/9.

**RHODES SCHOLARS.**—The selection of Messrs. J. H. Chinner (Victoria), D. C. Menzies (South Australia) and E. E. Jarvis (Western Australia) as the Rhodes Scholar of their respective States for 1938 is a unique record, and I doubt if any other sport can claim such a wonderful achievement as three Rhodes Scholars in one year. Anticipating your wishes, I sent a letter of congratulation to each of these gentlemen wishing them every success at Oxford, and also expressing the hope that on their return to their native land, they would continue their lacrosse activities.

**INTERSTATE VISITS.**—It is pleasing to note that an unusually large number of interstate visits were made during the year. All States participated, and at least one match was played in every capital with the exception of Brisbane. Provided that reasonably representative sides can be sent, these visits help to create enthusiasm for lacrosse, and consequently are very desirable, especially to the far distant centres. To-night you will be asked to give consideration to a proposal sponsored by Western Australia, which seeks to place interstate visits during non-carnival years on a more regular basis.

**OBITUARY.**—It is with great regret that we record the passing of Mr. Alex. Beech. The late Mr. Beech, who was a son of Mr. George Beech, the father of lacrosse in Australia, was Honorary Record Secretary of the Victorian Lacrosse Association, and was well known throughout the Commonwealth.

The Victorian and South Australian Lacrosse Association have suffered a severe loss in the death in tragic circumstances of Mr. R. S. Symonds. The late Mr. Symonds was a Pilot Officer in the R.A.A.F. To their sorrowing families the Council extends its deepest sympathy.

**STATE OF GAME.**—In the current issue of "Wisdens," Don Bradman contributes a very informative article under the title of "Cricket at the Cross Roads," and while reading it the thought occurred to me that probably lacrosse was also at the Cross Roads. This was forcibly brought home when I endeavoured to ascertain the causes responsible for the loss of 10 per cent. of our playing strength as mentioned in the opening paragraph of this report. A loss such as this must be taken seriously and is a matter of grave concern to all. I would therefore suggest that an effort be made by the associations concerned to endeavour to interview some of these lost players and ascertain their reasons for giving up lacrosse, and it may be that from the answers given something useful may eventuate.

From personal observations I am of the opinion that kindred associations such as hockey and baseball are definitely obtaining a greater proportion of recruits than lacrosse. Why this should be so it is difficult to understand, as I am sure no lacrosseur will admit that these games can offer any greater attractions than lacrosse. The fact, however, must be faced that lacrosse has had a setback, and while we hope that it is only of a temporary nature, nevertheless a drift has commenced, and if not immediately checked will soon become irreparable. I would, therefore, suggest that the Council should express its deep concern at the turn events have taken and adjourn any discussion on the subject until the next meeting of the Council, which will be held in Brisbane during the carnival.

In the meantime the State Associations could be asked to institute an immediate enquiry into the causes of the loss of players and report as to what steps are being taken to remedy the position. At the same time clubs and individuals might be asked for suggestions for the improvement of the game, and in this respect I have in mind a very constructive suggestion submitted to me by Mr. Arnold Hudson, Chairman of the New South Wales Association, which will be placed before the Council to-night. In the pooling of ideas I am very confident that something helpful will be brought to light that will be beneficial to the game as a whole. The loss of players mentioned above represents the gloomy side of the year's activities. Happily there is another side, which records South Australia's progress both in its steadily increasing numbers of players and its greatly improved standard of play as revealed by its first victory over Victoria for the past twelve years. Congratulations are due to Western Australia for nearly sustaining its members despite the loss of the Goldfields Association.

In conclusion, I desire to thank the secretaries of the State Lacrosse Associations for the continued assistance they have afforded me in carrying out my secretarial duties.

I have pleasure in submitting a brief report on the recent visit of the South Australian Team to the Brisbane Carnival.

The party left Adelaide on Sunday, July 16th and on arrival in Melbourne practice was arranged on the University Oval. At 5.0 p.m. the Victorian Lacrosse Association extended a welcome to the S.A. Team at the Amateur Sports Club. Reaching Sydney on Tuesday the team practiced in the morning at The Domain. Both the Victorian and New South Wales Lacrosse Associations placed every facility at our disposal for training purposes. After a rather tiring journey we reached Brisbane at 2.30 p.m. on Wednesday afternoon.

Solid practice was given the team at the Exhibition Ground on Thursday and Friday mornings prior to the opening game with N.S.W. on Saturday, July 22nd. The S.A. draw for the Carnival games was not a very favourable one from our point of view. The draw resulted as follows: Sat. N.S.W. . Monday off. Wednesday, Queensland; Thursday W.Aust; Sat. Victoria.

The first match with N.S.W. resulted in an overwhelming victory for our team by 40 goals to 3. The game in N.S.W. at the present time is at a very low ebb and their team in Brisbane was far below A. Grade standard. All players with the exception of I. Wiles (ill) were available for selection in this match. One player (I. Fauser) was injured the game through colliding with an opponent. The second match on Wednesday against Queensland resulted in another victory by 11 goals to 4. This match was well contested throughout and the scores were hardly an indication of the evenness of the play. The only player injured in this game was R. Stephens.

For the match against West, Australia all players with the exception of Stephens were available for selection. After a hard game W.A. won 17 to 9. The progressive scores were 4 to 2; 8 to 3; 11 to 7; 17 to 9. A series of misfortunes following us in this game. Three sticks were completely broken

Broken/ (Muecke, Swalling and Symonds). Swalling injured an ankle and the teams ~~finish~~ finished 9 a side, which accounted for the high score in the last quarter. For the concluding match with Victoria all players were declared fit. S.A. fielded a strong team but could not withstand a determined challenge from Victoria. The final scores being 15 to 6. Progressive scores being 4 to 3; 7 to 4; 11 to 5; and 15 to 6.

A heavy programme of entertainments was arranged by the Queensland Lacrosse Association and everything was done to make the stay of the visitors to Brisbane a happy and memorable one.

Throughout the trip a wonderful spirit existed among the players and by their conduct all proved themselves worthy of inclusion in a S.A. Team.

Both the Captain (J. Muecke) and the Vice-Captain (R. Stephens) carried their responsibilities excellently.

To Jim Muecke I pay a special tribute. Both on the field and off the field he always held the confidence and esteem of the players and proved himself a worthy leader and an inspiration to his team.

REPORT ON THE AUSTRALIAN LACROSSE CARNIVAL HELD AT BRISBANE FROM JULY 22nd. TO 29th.1939.

Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen it is my somewhat doubtful pleasure and duty to present to you this report on the matches played by the South Aust. Team during the Australian Lacrosse Carnival played in Brisbane from July 22nd. to 29th. Somewhat doubtful pleasure because I am unable to report that the Garland-McHarg Cup was won by this State. As you all know the Cup was again won by Victoria with Western Aust. runners-up, S.A. third, Queensland fourth, and N. S. W. fifth.

The S. A. Team as you know was chosen early so that the players could obtain hard training which would enable them to see out the 4 matches to be played in one week. Training on the whole was well attended and consisted mainly of stick work practice, ground work, and hard sprinting. As well as training on Tuesday and Thursday evenings of each week, it was thought advisable to have match practice. With this object in view, the Team played practice matches on the 4 Sunday mornings prior to departure. The first such practice was held at Glenelg against St. Peters and was the most successful as all players turned out. The following 3 practices unfortunately were marred by Influenza and injuries received in Club Matches. Further training consisted of 2 talks held at the Victoria Hotel after practice. It was a blow to all, when in the last fortnight it was learnt that Ridings our vice-captain was not available and had to pull out. Ridings style of play would have helped S. A. tremendously and may have possibly avoided defeat in Brisbane.

Further team work was obtained or rather aimed at in a practice match against a second team on the Saturday prior to departure. In this match the State Team was easily beaten, but it appeared, however, that the State Team were afraid of being hurt and so did not give of their best, and, incidently did not obtain much benefit from this match.

The S. A. Team left Adelaide on Sunday the 16th. July. Practices were held on the University Oval, Melbourne on the 17th, on the Domain, Sydney on the 18th, and on the Exhibition ground Brisbane on the Thursday morning the 20th and Friday afternoon the 21st. These practices consisted of light runs with much attention being paid to stick work.

The first match was played against N. S. W. at 1 pm. on Saturday the 22nd. The S. A. Team was as follows.- Medlen goal, Muecke, Fauser, Stephen backs, Nairn, Oats defence, McLaren centre, Lee, Thompson attacks, Horwood, Haddad, Symonds forward with Vinall and Gitsham reserves.-Wiles not being available for selection as

he was suffering with a slight attack of influenza. This match was won by S. A. 40 goals to 3.- N. S. W. being of a very poor standard and in subsequent matches having to be assisted by several Victorian visitors. During the second quarter of this game Fauser collided with a N.S.W. Player and had to leave the ground with a cut on the head. His place was taken by Vinall. The game was so easy that good Lacrosse was seldom seen and the match of little benefit to S.A.

The second match was played on Wednesday, 26th. against Queensland and again S.A. won by 11-4. The team chosen was - Medlen, goal, Muecke, Swalling, Stephen back, Nairn, Vinall defence Wiles centre, Gitsham, Thompson attacks, Horwood, Haddad, Symonds forwards, with Oates and Lee reserves. In this match better Lacrosse was seen with the back and defence line working well against good combined play by Queensland. This match was unfortunate, however, for S.A. as Stephen, who had been playing well, had to leave the ground in the last quarter with a badly sprained and bruised ankle which necessitated him standing down for the match against W.A. on the following day.

The match against W.A. on Thursday, 27th. was won by W.A. by 17-9. These scores did not indicate the true nature of the game. The W.A. side were first to score and let at half time by 8-3. In the third quarter S.A. scored 4-3 making the score in W.A. favour at 11-7. At the beginning of the last quarter S.A. made a bold bid for victory but misfortune again befell us as first Swalling broke his stick and soon afterwards received a leg injury and had to leave the ground. Soon after I broke my own stick followed by Symonds breaking his. Added to this Nairn's place man had to leave the ground. This left the game very open for W.A. and unfortunately we were not in a winning position which would have enabled us to pull men from the attack or forward to close up the goal. W.A. in the last 10 minutes scored freely. S.A. in this match was represented by - Medlin goal, Muecke, Swalling Fauser backs, Vinall, Oates defence, Nairn centre, Thompson, Lee attacks, Symonds, Haddad, Horwood forwards, with McLaren & Gitsham reserves.

The final match was played against Victoria on Saturday, 29th. and resulted in a win for Victoria by 15-6. The S.A. team was Medlin goal, Muecke, Stephen, Swalling backs, Vinall, Oates defence, Nairn centre, McLaren, Thompson attacks, Symonds, Haddad, Horward forward with Wiles & Gitsham reserves. In this match the best Lacrosse of the Carnival was witnessed. The first quarter was most unfortunate for S.A. as 2 goals scored by Victoria were definitely not goals - 1 being received in the crease and the other thrown whilst a Victorian was standing in the crease. This was probably due to rain just before the match, partly washing out the goal crease and to a habit the goal umpires in Queensland have of standing some yards behind the net. Also in this quarter a ball was knocked into the net by a S.A.

3.

player, so this quarter ended with Victoria instead of S.A. in the lead at 4-3, this lead was further increased and at half time the scores stood at 7-4, our forwards being able to make little impression on the Victorian back line. After half time the injuries received by several players during the week began to tell and Victoria steadily increased their lead and finally won by 15-6.

S.A.'s failure against W.A. and Victoria was partly due to the forwards and attacks loosing all understanding of each other and more or less endeavouring to score goals by individual effort rather than by combine play. The backs and defence players did their job up to a certain point. That is to say that both W.A. & Victoria had men from centre to first home that were able to play any where, and our corresponding men from centre to point were unable to cope with the many changes made during the matches.

I am definitely sure that if S.A. are to succeed it must produce utility men - men who can play in any position. For many years now Sth. Australian players have specialised positions at the outset of their career. This is a great mistake as it is only by playing in all parts of the field that a player can learn the game properly and can adapt himself better to any type of game that may be played by his opponents. The Victorian & W.Aust. success in my opinion was due to a better understanding of the game brought about by the fact that nearly all their players were utility men and could play in any position from goal to first home.

At the same time it must not be overlooked in S.A.'s losses that it was agreed by all that S.A. had the worst draw of the Carnival - having to play three hard matches in 4 days. Again I would point out that with the exception of N.S.W., Sth. Australia were the youngest team and the most inexperienced team of the Carnival. By inexperienced I mean previous Carnival experience - Victoria having 7 players with previous Carnival experience, W.A. 5 and Queensland 8, whilst S.A. only had 2 and again only 7 out of the 16 had played previously against Victoria.

The team whilst away behaved wonderfully well and was well managed and looked after by Mr. McKenzie. It was one of the happiest and cleanest playing team it has been my pleasure to Captain. I sincerely thank the Selectors for having confidence in me in appointing me Captain and coach but only regret that I was not able to lead the team to victory and bring back the Garland-McHarg Cup to South Australia.

BY LAWS.

Adopted 5th June, 1939.

By Law 1.THE CROSSE.LAW 1.

No Player shall play in any match with a stick which in the opinion of the referee is dangerous through its having been broken.

By Law 11.THE CROSSE.LAW 1.

Any player whose stick is hopelessly broken may with the approval of the referee take his place man off with him for a period of not more than three minutes whilst he obtains a new stick or has repair effected.

By Law 1.THE BALL.LAW 11.

All balls used in matches shall be marked "Approved by A.L.C." and shall be submitted to the referee prior to the commencement of the match for approval.

By Law 1.THE GOALS, CREASE & CENTRE.LAWS 111, 1V, V.

The Home Club must distinctly mark out the ground in accordance with Laws 111, 1V & V of the Australian Lacrosse Council's "Laws of Lacrosse" prior to the commencement of any match, In the event of a match being played on a neutral ground, the team or Club first mentioned in the official programme shall be deemed the home club.

By Law 1.THE REFEREELAW VII

All appointments of referees and field officials for Premiership matches shall be made by the S.A. Lacrosse Referees Association and appointments for all other matches shall be made in the manner prescribed by the General Committee of the South Aust. Lacrosse Association from time to time.

By Law 11.THE REFEREELAW VII.

The Captain of the competing teams shall in all premiership matches where the Association has not appointed field officials appoint and notify the referee immediately prior to the commencement of the match of such appointment of a time-keeper and goal umpires.

By Law 111.THE REFEREE.LAW VII.

The "off" "A" grade team and or "B" grade team, if any, shall supply up to six referees to officiate in matches nominated by the S.A. Lacrosse Referees' Association.

By Law 1.THE TIME-KEEPER.LAW X

The "Home" Club or team must supply a bell or suitable warning instrument for all "A" Grade matches for use by the time-keeper. In the event of a match being played on a neutral ground, the club or team first mentioned shall be deemed to be the "Home" Club or team.

By Law 1.THE TEAMS.LAW XI.

All Clubs must furnish not later than by one o'clock each Thursday to such person as the Committee shall appoint the names of the players in each of their teams for the Saturdays matches next ensuing, provided that this By Law shall not apply to grades, publication of whose teams is not made by the Press.

By Law 11.THE TEAMS.LAW XI.

Any club fielding less than eight players to contest a premiership match shall be deemed to have forfeited the match to its opponents.

By Law 111.

THE TEAMS.

LAW XI.

Any club unable to field eight players in any match set down in the programme must notify the Honorary Secretary on or before noon on the day preceding the date set down for the match.

By Law 1V

THE TEAMS.

LAW XI.

Should both teams in any premiership Match fail to field at least eight registered players in each team then the match shall be deemed to have been abandoned and no premiership points shall be awarded to either team.

By Law 1.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

CLAUSE V A.

The Executive Committee shall only deal with such matters as are in the opinion of the Chairman and Secretary urgent or such matters as may be delegated to it by the General Committee.

By Law 11.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

CLAUSE V A.

Any member of the General Committee being a player or holding any office in a club shall for the purposes of representation on the Executive Committee be deemed to be a member of the said club. Should however any member be so interested in two or more clubs the chairman shall rule forthwith and without discussion by the General Committee as to which club he shall be deemed representative.

By Law 1.

POWER TO APPOINT SUB-COMMITTEE.

CLAUSE VI.

The committee shall at the commencement of each season appoint a sub-committee of three to whom all By Laws shall be referred for approval before adoption.

By Law 1.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

RULE 1.

Notice of General Meetings together with a copy of the Report and Balance Sheet shall be sent by the Honorary Secretary to each registered member and all officers of the Association not later than a fortnight prior to the Annual General Meeting.

By Law 11.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

Rule IX.

The Assistant Hon. Secretary shall table at each meeting of the General Committee other than a Special Committee Meeting a table showing match results and points gained up to and including a date not earlier than the Saturday last but one immediately preceding the date of the General Committee meeting.

By Law 111.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

RULE IX

The Hon. Secretary shall insure and keep insured with an Insurance Company approved by the General Committee all trophies, cups and assets of the Association.

By Law 1.

PREMIERSHIP MATCHES.

RULE XI (A)

The method of determining the premiership in each grade shall be:-

- First: The winning team in each match shall receive two points.
- Secondly: The losing team " " " " " no "
- Thirdly: In the event of a draw each team shall receive one point.
- Fourthly: In the event of a forfeit the team receiving the forfeit shall be deemed to have won the match.
- Fifthly: The teams shall be ranked during the minor round according to points received as hereinbefore set forth and at the conclusion of the minor round the leading team shall be designated "Minor Premiers."
- Sixthly: In the event of any teams having an equal number of points the position of each team on the Premiership table shall be determined by dividing the number of goals scored by a team into the number of goals scored against that team.

Law 1.

PREMIERSHIP MATCHES (Contd).

Seventhly: After the conclusion of the minor round the semi-final matches shall be played between the Minor Premiers and the third team and between the second and the fourth teams. The winners of the semi-finals shall then play the final match. In the event of the Minor Premiers being defeated in either the semi-final or final matches they shall have the right of challenging the winners of the final match - the ultimate winners being the "Premiers". The defeated team in the last match of the major round shall be the runners-up. The positions of the third and fourth teams at the conclusion of the major round shall be the same respective positions as the two teams occupied at the conclusion of the minor round.

By Law 1.

REGISTRATION OF PLAYERS.

RULE XIV

All grades other than "A" grade may wear numbers at the players' option, but all numbers so worn shall be the number of the player as registered with the Association.

By Law 1.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

RULE XIV M.

The Honorary Secretary shall send to each new player registered a copy of the Australian Lacrosse Council's "Laws of Lacrosse" as published by the Australian Lacrosse Council from time to time.

PERMIT COMMITTEE.

RULE XVI.

The second team of any club fielding an "A" grade premiership team shall be placed in "B" Grade by the Grading & Permit Committee.

By Law 1.

COMPLAINTS AND OFFENCES.

Rule XXII H.

The Secretary shall forthwith on receipt of any complaint of a breach of the Constitution, Laws, Rules or By Laws for which breach there is a penalty scheduled in By Law 11, Rule XXII H. notify in writing the club or person concerned and unless the Secretary receives within 7 days of the posting of such notice a reply setting out the reason why the penalty should not be enforced then the penalty shall be automatically imposed forthwith. Where reasons why the penalty should not be imposed are supplied within 7 days the Committee shall consider such reasons.
