Annual Report Year ending 31st March, 1939

PRESENTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING HELD AT THE COMMERCIAL TRAVELLERS' CLUB, MELBOURNE, ON MONDAY, 29th MAY, 1939.

Mr. President and Gentlemen.

It is my privilege to submit for your approval the Eighth Annual Report of the Australian Lacrosse Council covering the year 1939. During the past three years it has been my pleasing duty to comment on the steady progress lacrosse was making, but to-night I regret that I have to report there has been a very serious setback in respect to the number of players during the year under review. In 1937 the total number of players in the Commonwealth stood at the record figure of 2,702; this unfortunately has decreased during the past year by 272 to 2,430, or in other words 10 per cent. of our players were lost. This is a very serious position, and I therefore propose to deal with it later in my report.

MEETING .- Only one meeting of the Council was held during the year. Our President, Mr. C. Lempriere Abbott, once again made a special journey from Adelaide to preside, which was greatly appreciated by the delegates.

INTERNATIONAL VISIT.—At the last meeting of the Council a sub-committee was appointed to investigate the possibility and cost of an international visit and to suggest methods of financing same. Shortly after the appointment of this committee affairs in Europe took a very serious turn, which, in my opinion rendered it futile to think of international visits. I therefore take the responsibility for not calling this com- 240 mittee together. I would suggest that the committee be reappointed and authorised to make a report before the next Annual Meeting, provided the international outlook shows signs of improvement to justify consideration being given to a venture of this magnitude.

PROPOSED REVISION OF RULES.—In my report of last year I made reference to the laws of lacrosse and enumerated a number of alterations that had been successfully brought into operation in other countries, notably the United States of America, and made suggestions that a number of these innovations 200 were worthy of a trial in actual play. The Council adopted these recommendations, and the State Associations were requested to make a thorough test of these proposed rules under match conditions. It is pleasing to report that all States readily adopted the Council's request, and staged a number of games in which these proposed rules were in operation. It is to be regretted, however, that although asked for last year, all the reports did not reach me until a few weeks ago, and in certain instances the information was so meagre that it was of very little value to the sub-committee appointed to collate the reports. From this report, which will be placed before you to-night, it will be noted that the only suggestion that was unanimously received was that dealing with the enlargement of the centre ring. Those suggestions relating to off-side play, the reduction in the number of players constituting a team and the dimension of the playing field were rejected. Regarding the proposed substitute rule, the views of the States are somewhat obscure, and it is suggested that this question should be referred back to the State Associations for further con-

GARLAND McHARG CUP.—The deed of trust in reference to the Garland McHarg Cup as adopted by the Council, and appointing Messrs. C. Lempriere Abbott, R. O. Moore and I. J. Taylor as trustees, has been drawn up and now awaits the final act of signing, which will be officially carried out

AUSTRALIAN LACROSSE CARNIVAL - The Queensland Lacrosse Association has advised the Council that the date for the Ninth Australian Lacrosse Carnival has been fixed for 15th to 22nd July, and all States have signified their intention of competing. A very successful carnival is confidently anticipated.

FINANCIAL.—The Hon. Treasurer, when submitting the financial statement to-night, will report that the Council has a credit balance at the Commonwealth Bank of £42/5/9, and assets amounting to

RHODES SCHOLARS.—The selection of Messrs, J. H. Chinner (Victoria), D. C. Menzies (South Australia) and E. E. Jarvis (Western Australia) as the Rhodes Scholar of their respective States for 1938 is a unique record, and I doubt if any other sport can claim such a wooderful achievement as three Rhodes Scholars in one year. Anticipating your wishes, I sent a letter of congratulation to each of these gentlemen wishing them every success at Oxford, and also expressing the hope that on their return to their native land,

INTERSTATE VISITS.—It is pleasing to note that an unusually large number of interstate visits were made during the year. All States participated, and at least one match was played in every capital with the exception of Brisbane. Provided that reasonably representative sides can be sent, these visits help to create enthusiasm for lacrosse, and consequently are very desirable, especially to the far distant centres. To-night you will be asked to give consideration to a proposal sponsored by Western Australia, which seeks to place interstate visits during non-carnival years on a more regular basis.

OBITUARY.—It is with great regret that we record the passing of Mr. Alex. Beech. The late Mr. Beech, who was a son of Mr. George Beech, the father of lacrosse in Australia, was Honorary Record Secretary of the Victorian Lacrosse Association, and was well known throughout the Commonwealth.

The Victorian and South Australian Lacrosse Association have suffered a severe loss in the death in tragic circumstances of Mr. R. S. Symonds. The late Mr. Symonds was a Pilot Officer in the R.A.A.F.

To their sorrowing families the Council extends its deepest sympathy.

STATE OF GAME.—In the current issue of "Wisdens." Don Bradman contributes a very informative article under the title of "Cricket at the Cross Roads." and while reading it the thought occurred This was forcibly brought home when I endeavoured to ascertain the causes responsible for the loss of 10 per cent, of our playing strength as mentioned in the opening paragraph of this report. I would therefore suggest that an effort be made by the associations concerned to endeavour to interview some of these lost players and ascertain their reasons for giving up lacrosse. Coaceta and it may be that from the answers given something useful may eventuate.

From personal observations I am of the opinion that kindred associations such as hockey and baseball are definitely obtaining a greater proportion of recruits than lacrosse. Why this should be so it is difficult to understand, as I am sure no lacrosseur will admit that these games can offer any greater attractions than lacrosse. The fact, however, must be faced that lacrosse has had a setback, and while we hope that it is only of a temporary nature, nevertheless a drift has commenced, and if not immediately checked will soon become irreparable. I would, therefore, suggest that the Council should express its deep concern at the turn events have taken and adjourn any discussion on the subject until the next meeting of the Council.

In the meantime the State Associations could be asked to institute an immediate enquiry into the causes of the loss of players and report as to what steps are being taken to remedy the position. At the same time clubs and individuals might be asked for suggestions for the improvement of the game, and in same time clius and individuals ingut be asked for suggestions for the improvement of the game, and in this respect I have in mind a very constructive suggestion submitted to me by Mr. Arnold Hudson, Chairman of the New South Wales Association, which will be placed before the Council to-night. In the pooling of ideas I am very confident that something helpful will be brought to light that will be beneficial to the game as a whole. The loss of players mentioned above represents the gloomy side of the year's activities. Happily there is another side, which records South Australia's progress both in its steadily increasing numbers of players and its greatly improved standard of play as revealed by its first victory over Victoria for the past twelve years. Congratulations are due to Western Australia for nearly sustaining its members

In conclusion, I desire to thank the secretaries of the State Lacrosse Associations for the continued assistance they have afforded me in carrying out my secretarial duties.

I have pleasure in submitting a brief report on the recent visit of the South Australian Team to the Brisbane Carnival.

The party left Adelaide on Sunday, July 16thand on arrival in Melbourne practice was arranged on the University Oval. At. 5.0 p.m. the Victorian Lacrosse Association extended a welcome to the S.A.Team at the Amateur Sports Club. Reaching Sydney on Tuesday the team practiced in the morning at The Domain. Both the Victorian and New South Wales Lacrosse Associations placed every facility at our disposal for training purposes. After a rather tiring journey we reached Brisbane at 2.30 p.m. on Wednesday afternoon.

Solid practice was given the team at the Exhibition Ground on Thursday and Friday mornings priotr to the opening game with N.S.W. on Saturday, July 22nd. The S.A.drawfor the Carnival games was not a very favourable one from our point of view. The draw resulted as follows: Sat. N.S.W. . Monday off. Wednesday, Queensland; Thursday W.Aust; Sat. Victoria.

The first match with N.S.W. resulted in an overwhelming victory for our team by 40 goals to 3. The game in N.S.W. at the present time is at a very low ebb and their team in Brisbane was farm below A.Grade standard. All players with the exception of I.Wiles (ill) were available for selection in this match. One player (I.Fauser) was injured the game through colliding with an openent. The second match on Wednesday against Queensland resulted in another victory by 11 goals to 4. This match was well contested throughout and the scores were hardly an indication of the evenness of the play. The only player injured in this game was R.Stephens.

For the match against West, Australia all players with the exception of Stephens were available for selection.

After a hard game W.A. won 17 to 9. The progressive scores were 4 to 2; 8 to 3; 11 to 7; 17 to 9. A series of misgortumes following us in this game. Three sticks were completely broken

REPORT ON THE AUSTRALIAN LACROSSE CARNIVAL HELD AT BRISBANE FROM JULY 22nd. TO 29th.1939.

Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen it is my somewhat doubtful pleasure and duty to present to you this report on the matches played by the South Aust. Team during the Australian Lacrosse Carnival played in Brisbane from July 22nd. to 29th. Somewhat doubtful pleasure because I am unable to report that the Garland-McHarg Cup was won by this State. As you all know the Cup was again won by Victoria with Western Aust. runners-up, S.A. third, Queensland fourth, and N. S. W. fifth.

The S. A. Team as you know was choosen early so that the players could obtain hard training which would enable them to see out the 4 matches to be played in one week. Training on the whole was well attended and consisted mainly of stick work practice, ground work, and hard sprinting. As well as training on Tuesday and Thursday evenings of each week, it was thought advisable to have match practice. With this object in view, the Team played practice matches on the 4 Sunday mornings prior to departure. The first such practice was held at Glenelg against St. Peters and was the most successful as all players turned out. The following 3 practices unfortunately were marred by Influenza and Injuries received in Club Matches. Further training consisted of 2 talks held at the Victoria Hotel after practice. It was a blow to all, when in the last fortnight it was learnt that Ridings our vice-captain was not available and had to pull out. Ridings style of play would have helped S. A. tremendously and may have possibly avoided defeat in Brisbane.

Further team work was obtained or rather aimed at in a practice match against a second team on the Saturday prior to departure. In this match the State Team was easily beaten, but it appeared, however, that the State Team were afraid of being hurt and so did not give of their best, and incidently did not abtain much benefit from this match.

The S. A. Team left Adelaide on Sunday the 16th. July. Practices were held on the University Oval, Melbourne on the 17th. on the Domain, Sydney on the 18th, and on the Exhibition ground Brisbane on the Toursday morning the 20th and Friday afternoon the 21st. These practices consisted of light runs with much attendion being paid to stick work.

The first match was played against N. S. W. at 1 pm. on Saturday the 22nd. The S. A. Team was as follows. - Medlen goal, Muecke, Fauser, Stephen backs, Nairn, Oats defence, McLaren centre, Lee, Thompson attacks, Horwood, Haddad, Symonds forward with Vinall and Gitsham reserves .- Wiles not being available for selection as

his pusctor ended with Victoria instead of S.A. he was suffering with a slight attack of influenza. This match was won by S. A. 40 goals to 3. - N. S. W. being of a very poor standard and in subsequent matches having to be assited by several Victorian visitors. During the second quarter of this game Fauser collided with a N.S.W. Player and had to leave the ground with a cut on the head. His place was taken by Vinall. The game was so easy that good Lacrosse was seldom seen and the match of little benefit to S.A.s failure against T.A. a

The second match was played on Wednesday, 26th. against Queensland and again S.A. won by 11-4. The team chosen was -Medlen, goal, Muecke, Swalling, Stephen back, Nairn, Vinall defence Wiles centre, Gitsham, Thompson attacks, Horwood, Haddad, Symonds forwards, with Oates and Lee reserves. In this match better Lacrosse was seen with the back and defence line working well against good combined play by Queensland. This match was unfortunate, however, for S.A. as Stephen, who had been playing well, had to leave the round in the last quarter with a badly sprained and bruised ankle which necessitated him standing down for the match against W.A. on the following day.

The match against W.A. on Thursday, 27th, was won by W.A. by 17-9. These scores did not indicate the true nature of the game. The W.A. side were first to score and let at half time by 8-3. In the third quarter S.A. scored 4-3 making the score in W.A. favour at 11-7. At the beginning of the last quarter S.A. made a bold bid for victory but misfortune again befell us as first Swalling broke his stick and soon afterwards received a leg injury and had to leave the ground. Soon after I broke my own stick followed by Symonds breaking his. Added to this Nairn's place man had to leave the ground. This left the game very open for W.A. and unfortunately we were not in a winning position which would have enabled us to pull men from the attack or forward to close up the goal. W.A. in the last 10 minutes scored freely. S.A. in this match was represented by - Medlin goal. Muecke, Swalling Fauser backs, Vinall, Oates defence, Nairn centre, Thompson, Lee attacks, Symonds, Haddad, Horwood forwards, with McLaren & Gitsham reserves. presidualy against Victoria.

The final match was played against Victoria on Saturday, 29th. and resulted in a win for Victoria by 15-6. The S.A. tean was Medlin goal, Mucke, Stephen, Swalling backs, Vinall, Oates defence, Nairn centre, McLaren, Thompson attacks, Symonds, Haddad, Horward forward with Wiles & Gitsham reserves. In this match the best Lacrosse of the Carnival was witnessed. The first quarter was most unfortunate for S.A. as 2 goals scored by Victoria were definitely not goals -1 being received in the crease and the other thrown whilst a Victorian was standing in the crease. This was probably due to rain just before the match, partly washing out the goal crease and to a habit the goal umpires in Queensland have of standing some yards behind the net. Also in this quarter a ball was knocked into the net by a S.A.

player, so this quarter ended with Victoria instead of S.A. in the lead at 4-3, this lead was further increased and at half time the scores stood at 7-4, our forwards being able to make little impression on the Victorian back line. half time the injuries received by several players during the week began to tell and Victoria steadily inwreased their lead and finally won by 15-6.

S.A.'s failure against W.A. and Victoria was partly due to the forwards and attacks loosing all understanding of each other and more or less endeavouring to score goals by individual effort rather than by combine play. The backs and defence players did their job up to a certain point. That is to say that both W.A. & Victoria had men from centre to first home that were able to play any where, and our corresponding men from centre to point were unable to cope with the many changes made during the matches.

I am definitely sure that if S.A. are to succeed it must produce utility men - men who can play in any position. For many years now Sth. Australian players have specialised positions at the outset of their career. This is a great mistake as it is only by playing in all parts of the field that a player can learn the game properly and can adapt himself better to any type of game that may be played by his opponents. The Victorian & W. Aust. success in my opinion was due to a better understanding of the game brought about by the fact that nearly all their players were utility men and could play in any position from goal to first home.

At the same time it must not be overlooked in S.A.'s lossed that it was agreed by all that S.A. had the worst draw of the Carnival - having to play three hard matches in 4 days. Again I would point out that with the exception of N.S.W., Sth. Australia were the youngest team and the most inexperienced team of the Carnival. By inexperienced I mean previous Carnival experience -Victoria having 7 players with previous Carnival experience, W.A. 5 and Queensland 8, whilst S.A. only had 2 and again only 7 out of the 16 had played previously against Victoria.

The team whilst away behaved wonderfully well and was well managed and looked after by Mr. McKenzie. It was one of the happiest and cleanest playing team it has been my pleasure to Captain. I sincerely thank the Selectors for having confidence in me in appointing me Captain and coach but only regret that I was not able to lead the team to victory and bring back the Garland-McHarg Cup to South Australia.

LAW 1.

No Player shall play in any match with a stick which in the opinion of the referee is dangerous through its having been broken.

By Law 11.

THE CROSSE.

Any player whose stick is hopelessly broken may with the approval of the referee take his place man off with him for a period of not more than three minutes whilst he obtains a new stick or has repaird effected.

THE BALL.

All balls used in matches shall be marked "Approved by A.L.C." and shall be submitted to the referee prior to the commencement of the match for approval.

By Law 1. THE GOALS, CREASE & CENTRE. LAWS 111, 1V, V.

The Home Club must distinctly mark out the ground in accordance with Laws 111, 1V & V of the Australian Lacrosse Council's "Laws of Lacrosse" prior to the commencement of any match, In the event of a match being played on a neutral ground, the team or Club first mentioned in the official programme shall be deemed the

LAW VII.

The Captain of the competing teams shall in all premiership matches where the Association has not appointed field officials appoint and notify the referee immediately prior to the commencement of thematch of such appointment of a time-keeper and goal umpires.

LAW X1.

All Clubs must furnish not later than by one o'clock each Thursday to such person as the Committee shall appoint the names of the players in each of their teams for the Saturdays matches next ensuing, provided that this By Law shall not apply to grades, publication of whose teams is not made by the Press.

THE TEAMS.

LAW X1.

Any club fielding less than eight players to contest a premiership match shall be deemed to have forfeited the match to its opponents. THE TEAMS.

Any club unable to field eight players in any match set down in the programme must notify the Honorary Secretary on or before noon own the day preceding the date set down for the match.

Seventhly: After the conclusion of the minor round the semi-final matches shall be played between the Minor Premiers and the third team and between the second and the fourth teams. The winners of the semi-finals shall then play the final match. In the event of the Minor Premiers being defeated in either the semi-final or final matches they shall have t the right of challenging the the winners of the final match - the ultimate winners being the "Premiers". The defeated team in the last match of the major round shall be the runners-up. The positions of the third and fourth teams at the conclusion of the major round shall be the same respective positions as the two teams occupied at the conclusion of the minor round.

All grades other than "A" grade may wear numbers at the players' option, but all numbers so worn shall be the number of the player as registered with the Association.

COMPLAINTS AND OFFENCES.

Rule XXII H.

The Secretary shall forthwith on receipt of any complaint of a breach of the Constitution, Laws, Rules or By laws for which breach there is a penalty scheduled in By Law 11, Rule XXII H. notify in writing the club or person concerned and unless the Secretary receives within 7 days of the posting of such notice a reply setting out the reason why the penalty should not be enforced then the penalty shall be automatically imposed forthwith. Where reasons why the penalty should not be imposed are supplied within 7 days the Committee shall consider such reasons.
