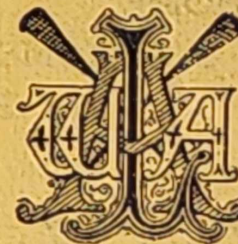

The last visit we had from our sister State was in 1929, when we were decisively beaten, but an improvement in the game was shown when W.A. beat S.A. at the Melbourne Carnival in 1932 by an odd goal. South Australia however, turned the tables on us by a one goal victory in 1936 at the All States Carnival held in Adelaide.

Our best will be in the field this year, and although we hope to avenge our defeat, we can assure our visitors that the matches will be played in a good spirit. Whatever the final results, we feel honoured that they have made the trip and shall do all in our power to make their stay both pleasurable and memorable. May the best team win.

A Trophy has been donated by Mr. C. E. M. Hickey for the Fairest and Best Player in the 1st Interstate match. A Committee consisting of Messrs. R. H. Angus and H. J. Carmichael together with two South Australian representatives will decide the winner.

Our Visitors

MUECKE, J. S. (Capt.)—He has led his State for the past four years and is one of the best backmen in the game. His Club is East Torrens, of which he is Vice-Captain.

GIFFEN, H. (Vice-Capt.)—Probably the most experienced Interstater in the team, and can play equally well from centre to point position. He captained Sturt Club.

MEDLEN, V. W. C. (Goalkeeper)—Has been very consistent in goals for West Torrens, of which he is Captain. Gave a brilliant display against Victoria last year.

HALL, G. W.—Captain of East Torrens. Has been a prominent attack for a number of years. Was conspicuous in match against Victoria for the capable way he led the forwards.

SELTH, M. B.—A fast attack player who gained a place in the trial match last year. Plays with East Torrens.

KIDD, R.—Another East Torrens player, has scored well for his Club this season.

SYMONDS, W. J. B.—A reliable forward from East Torrens. Is a solid player and a hard man to stop. Played in trial match last year.

NAIRN, M.—Is one of the most consistent defence men in S.A. at present. Is fast and reliable. Played against Victoria last year. His Club is University.

CARTER, R. D.—Also a reliable defence man who played against Victoria last year. West Torrens Club.

TAYLOR, M. G.—A consistent backman from University Club. Played in Inter-varsity matches against Melbourne.

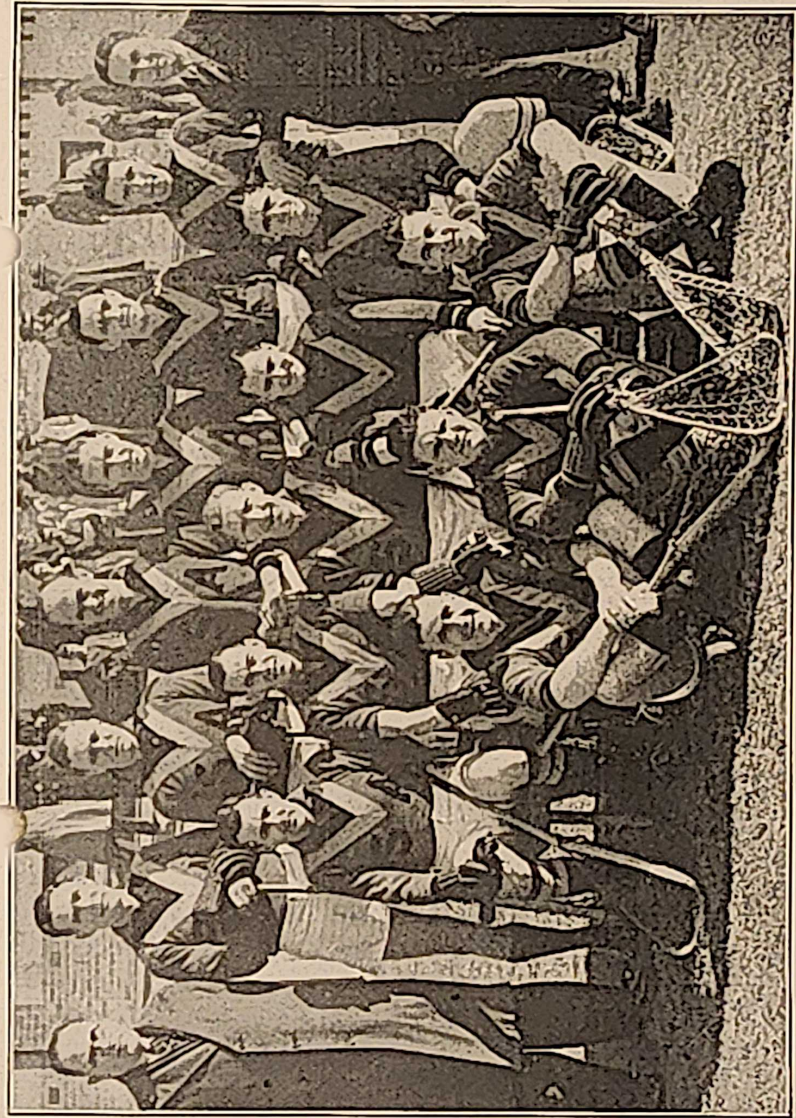
BARNFIELD, G.T.—Is University's leading goalthrower. Has had experience in Inter-varsity matches and is a left hand player.

WILES, I.—Plays centre for Goodwood Club, is most consistent.

MENZIES, D. C.—A University backman who has shown much improvement this season.

NEWLAND, C. B.—Captain of Port Adelaide Club. Is a useful centre-field player. Minute Secretary of S.A.L.A.

Mr. McKAY—Manager of the team, is a playing member of Goodwood Club and was a member of the South Australian team which visited Perth in 1925.

HOW TO FOLLOW THE GAME.

As a guide to any spectators who may not be fully conversant with lacrosse in all its details, the following comments on the game and rules may be of assistance:—

Usual arrangement of a team:—Twelve players in all.

Three Forwards—First Home, Second Home, Third Home.

Two Attacks—Right and Left. Centre.

Two Defences—Right and Left.

Three Backs—Third Man, Cover Point, Point (first man out from goal). Goalkeeper.

The goal is six feet square. The goal crease is a rectangle, 18 x 12.

The playing-ground between goals is 110 yards long and 80 yards wide, the ball still being in play behind each goal for 20 yards.

The centre is a circle with a diameter of six yards. No player — other than the centre man — is allowed to enter this area until the ball has been played clear of it.

The game is divided into four quarters, the first two of 25 minutes each, the second two of 20 minutes each, with an interval of 10 minutes between second and third quarters.

When the Referee has called a "foul" or "out of bounds" the ball must not be touched by either party, nor must the players move from the position in which they happen to be at the moment, until the Referee has called "play." A goalkeeper can resume his place in goal providing a "foul" has not been given against him or his side.

The Referee need not suspend play when the player who has been fouled (or his side) is still in possession of the ball.

If any player drops his crosse (stick) he is out of play until he recovers it.

The ball is of solid rubber the size of a tennis ball but weighing about the same as a cricket ball.

Fouls. Touching the ball with the hand, save by the goalkeeper, who may do so while defending the goal within the goal-crease, although not allowed to catch and throw the ball with his hand, may put away with his hands or feet or block the ball in any manner with his crosse or body.

Hitting wildly with the crosse or throwing it at an opponent.

Charging into, shouldering or interfering in any way with another who is in pursuit of an opponent. This does not prevent the use of the "body-check" nor the pushing of an opponent with the shoulder in ground scuffles.

Holding an opponent's crosse, or pushing him with crosse in hand, or running in front of him or interfering in any way to keep him from the ball until the other player reaches it, or checking the crosse of an opponent who is not actually in possession of or immediately about to take possession of the ball.

Using the free arm to protect his crosse.

Holding, striking or tripping a player with the crosse.

"Cross-check," which consists of a player charging with both hands on the crosse so as to make it meet the body of his opponent.

Swinging the crosse into or across the body of an opponent in such a way as to hit or otherwise endanger the body.

"Shepherding," "Up-check" is not permitted.

No attacking player shall stand, or check the goalkeeper, within the goal crease until the ball has entered the crease.

Penalties. The Referee may give a "face-off" or bounce or free position at the place where the foul occurred, yet not nearer either goal-post than 10 yards, unless the foul be made by the defending side, and/or he may disqualify the offending player or players for such time during the game as he thinks fit.

When the ball goes out of bounds the Referee shall give it to the nearest player or bounce it if two opposing players are an equal distance from it.

THE WESTERN AUSTRALIANS

E. L. BERRY (Capt.)—He is considered the best point player in the State. He played in his first interstate game at the Adelaide carnival in 1926; he represented Western Australia in the 1932 carnival and captained the State team at the Adelaide Carnival in 1936. He was for many years captain of the Mt. Lawley team which won the I. J. Taylor shield for six consecutive years. He won the fairest and best trophy in 1930 and 1931.

H. V. HORNER (vice-capt.)—Attack and reserve goalkeeper. He is captain of the Midland Junction Club which last year secured premier-ship honours in all grades. The senior team broke Mt. Lawley's run of premierships. He first played for Western Australia in the 1936 carnival.

A. R. BOXHORN (Mt. Lawley)—Second home; a clever forward who has represented the State in 1935 and 1936.

K. C. BUCHAN (Nedlands)—Second home; selected as first home in the 1932 carnival side and secured 18 goals for the series. He holds the carnival record for the most goals thrown by an individual player in a match, namely 13. He played first home in the team which defeated Victoria in 1935.

W. A. CARLTON (Como)—Defence; he wore the State colours in 1932 in the Melbourne Carnival. He is captain of the Como Club.

S. G. CUGLEY (Mt. Lawley)—Plays centre for his Club. This will be his first interstate appearance.

H. L. DRAFFEN (Mt. Lawley)—A speedy centrefield player. Winner of the fairest and best trophy in 1934 and 1935. He has represented his State in 1932, 1935 and 1936.

R. E. HASKELL (East Fremantle)—Attack and third home. A tall player who makes good use of his height. A member of the 1936 State team.

M. M. HICKEY (Perth)—Plays centre for his Club. He was also a member of 1936 State team.

A. F. HORNER (Midland Junction)—Attack; his first interstate appearance was in 1935, against Victoria, when he won the trophy for the fairest and best player in the match. He was also a member of 1936 State team.

E. F. JOHNSON (Nedlands)—Third home, was a member of the team which beat Victoria in 1935.

F. W. MILLER (Mt. Lawley)—Captain of his Club; plays first home and first represented Western Australia in 1932.

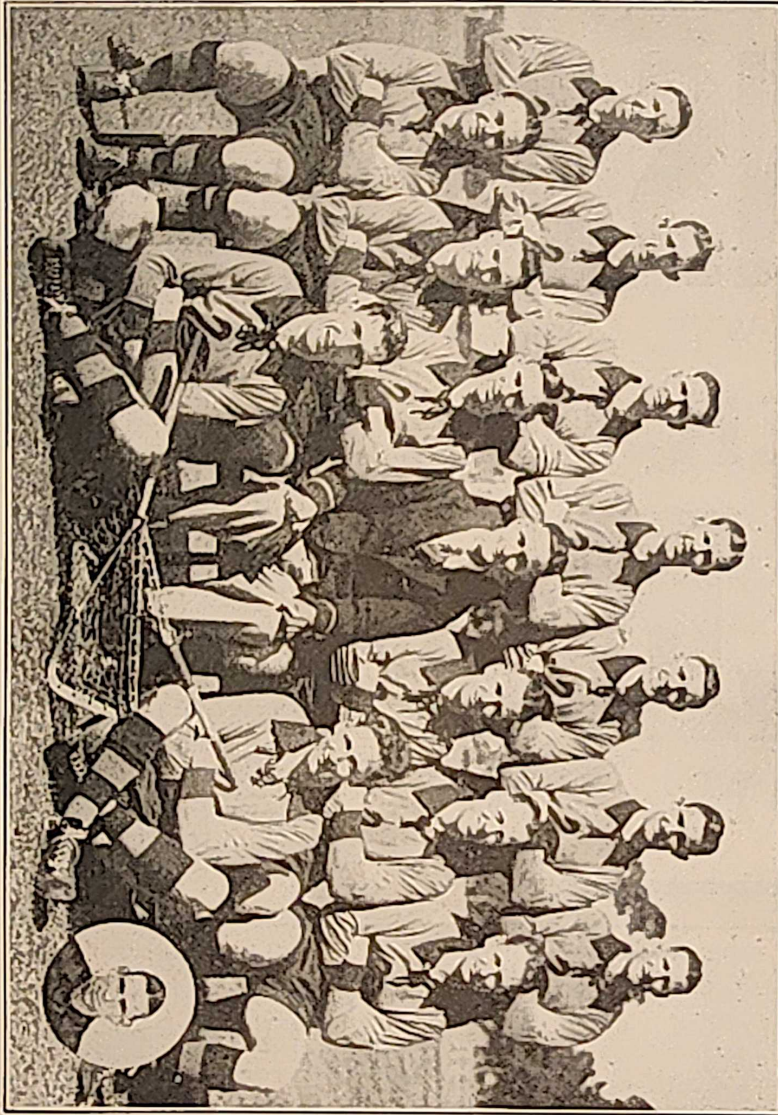
A. R. PAGE (Como)—Captained Como for two seasons and now association secretary. A reliable back, will be making his first interstate appearance.

H. C. RUDDERHAM (East Fremantle)—He has been playing for 13 years and first represented the State in 1929. He has been included in every West Australian team since that time and is a backman of class.

J. G. STAMMERS (East Fremantle)—Defence and centre. Obtained first interstate experience against Victoria in 1935 and was a member of the last carnival team.

K. R. STAMMERS (East Fremantle)—Goalkeeper for his Club. Gained State colours in 1935 and kept goals for Western Australia at the 1936 carnival.

The team was selected by Mr. C. E. M. HICKEY, who first played in 1905 with East Fremantle. Played against Canadians 1907 and against S.A. in 1909. Played centre for W.A. in 1912 and captained State team in 1925 and at Adelaide in 1926. Has been one of the selectors since the War and has held office of Chairman of Committees for nineteen years. Mr. D. C. JOHNSON, manager of the team, has played for years with Mount Lawley, won "best delegate" trophy in 1935, was manager of the last Carnival team which visited Adelaide in 1936.
