What's Ahead in Lacrosse

As we enter the second half of 1987 we are all becoming more and more aware of 1988 and its importance in the history of our country. Celebrations of many forms have been planned including the opportunity of a number of sporting bodies to project Australia to the world and to invite international teams to participate with the aim of strengthening relations with their countries.

As one of the sporting bodies selected by the Australian Bicentennial Authority the Australian Lacrosse Council is at present busy supervising arrangements being made for the conduct of the Inaugural Under 19 Mens Lacrosse Championships in mid 1988. Planned to be held at a new Hockey/Lacrosse complex at Gepps Cross, a few kilometres from Adelaide, the series offers the opportunity for our teenagers to taste top level international competition against sides from England, Canada and the U.S.A. Coaches John Carter, Greg Gamsworthy and Klay Johnson will be taking a very close interest in the current series with the view of shortly naming training squads in the three lacrosse states.

More international men's lacrosse may also be seen in '88', if the Australian Lacrosse Council and state associations agree to accept visits by Yale University and possibly North Carolina who have both expressed interest in visiting.

Heralding in an International Lacrosse bonanza over three years the '88' series will be followed in 1989 by the Senior Women's World Cup to be staged at the W.A.C.A. ground in Perth. Current World Champions, the Australian team will be striving to continue its great record in World Women's Lacrosse.

Perth, the following year, will also host the Men's Senior World Championship. Although the standard of play of participating countries has improved considerably over recent years, Australian officials are optimistic that its team will perform well and emulate the example of the 1986 Australian women's team.

After 1990 what then? Will the disturbing trend in playing numbers be arrested? Where will lacrosse be headed Internationally and Nationally?

Recent reports from overseas show a growing interest in lacrosse in Japan, Norway, U.S.S.R. and other countries. This may lead to lacrosse becoming an Olympic sport in, say, 10 years, with the resultant increase in interest among the Australian public.

In the meantime it is my belief that Administration at all levels cannot afford to be complacent. As a friend of mine once said, "Things just do not happen. You must make them happen". Nationally positive efforts must be made to capitalise on the efforts devoted so far to the A.C.T., N.S.W. and elsewhere by creating centres of interest. Existing State Associations should closely examine their administrative and club structures and continue to do so periodically if stagnation is to be avoided. For instance, how do the club structures fit into age patterns of the surrounding areas? Are clubs making use of untapped resources of parents? Are they paying attention to junior development noting normal wastage rates and the need to plan well ahead?

It is my belief that in all states there is room for improvement in all these and other areas. It should not be a consolation that other sporting bodies are experiencing similar problems.
