

LACROSSE IN GENERAL Womens

The Senior National Championship will be held in Perth and will conclude on the 19th July. An Australian team will be selected immediately after the Championships to play the first of an International series against a team from Great Britan on the 23rd July.

Great Britan will visit South Australia - Tasmania - possibly Canberra - and will finalise their tour in Victoria with an Australia versus Great Britan match on August 20th. His Excellency, The Hon. Sir Henry Winneke, K.C.M.G., O.B.E., K.St.J. Q.C., Governor of Victoria has consented to open the match.

Australia is doing well in the World Championships in England. Although beaten in America 22-17, our boys scored a good win over England 16-10.

Goal Keeper, Evan Jones was injured during the last quarter of the match against America and left the field with Australia trailing 15-14. America outscored the Australians 7 goals to 3 goals to take the match.

The game against England was just as exciting with the Aussies down 9-8 at three quarter time. However Evan Jones took the field, bandages and all, and England was swamped in the final quarter by 8 goals to 1 goal.
