## Editorial

Welcome to Issue 7 of the Australian Lacrosse Journal in our third year of publication. This issue is being produced earlier than usual to provide you with information about the international and national events being conducted in Adelaide during July.

Everyone who plays, coaches, officiates, administrates or has family members

Everyone who plays, coaches, officiates, administrates or has family members involved in lacrosse should be planning their annual holidays in Adelaide in July. There is something for everyone and it is a rare opportunity to make new international friends.

The Olympic Games has been a topic of interest, for the wrong reasons, of recent times. For some of the Olympic sports the Olympics is their World Championships. For others it is another international event on a busy international calendar - even an age restricted international event.

Some people see the Olympic Games as the top of the elite competition while for others is provides a high profile to a number of sports which causes one to wonder at the eligibility criteria to be a member of the "Olympic Club". Most sports are not Olympic sports, most athletes are not Olympic athletes or athletes involved in Olympic sports. And yet in Australia most government funding is directed to Olympic sports and to the small percentage of elite athletes participating in those sports. The Olympic "Inquiry" in Australia should be directed to the application of funds throughout all sports rather than, or in addition to, the use or abuse of funds towards one event in Sydney.

Lacrosse World Championships are the "Olympics" of lacrosse and the athletes participating are the equal of Olympic athletes, the organisation is as demanding and as efficient as Olympic events and it is all done on a voluntary basis with participants and organisers paying large sums from their own pockets and giving their time freely to participate. The Olympic ideals are perhaps more evident in the international lacrosse events than in the Olympics.

Your lacrosse season will probably have commenced by the time you read this. You may have been playing or involved in another sport in the "off" season. Lacrosse cannot afford to operate on a part-time basis like this. We need to create attractive activities and programs which will encourage our members to remain involved in lacrosse clubs and associations all year round. This enables clubs to keep in touch with members and not go through this annual process of 'cranking up' the club, teams and players for another season. Statistics will show that most players, and other club members, are not lost during the season - but do not come back for another season. They become involved in other activities not related to the lacrosse club and fail to 'make the switch' when lacrosse time comes around. If members were involved all year round with lacrosse club related activities they never go away - so they don't have to be enticed back.

"Off season" activities may include indoor modified lacrosse, other sports such as basketball, volleyball, touch etc which can be more social than competitive, social activities etc. This may make better use of available club facilities and spread membership costs so players may be club members costing \$xx for the full year with a fee paid for each additional activity, including lacrosse.

We need to treat all members as members and not simply as players who are involved in running around a field on 20 Saturday afternoons.

Enjoy your lacrosse throughout 1999.

## The New President

When Doug Fox finished a distinguished four year term as President of the Australian Lacrosse Council (ALC) he handed the reins to a successor who was well informed about current lacrosse issues and who has a lacrosse history dating back to 1958.

Leighton Beamsley has been ALC Treasurer since 1985 and ALC Director of Administration and Finance since 1993 - a role in which he continues concurrently with his new additional responsibilities as President.

Leighton enjoyed a 20 year playing career commencing in 1958 at Melbourne High School then Melbourne High School Old Boys till 1974 when he joined the Camberwell Lacrosse Club where he played until 1978. That career included five premierships as a player (three with Melbourne High School Old Boys and two with Camberwell) and two premierships as coach of junior Melbourne High School Old Boys teams. At Melbourne High School Old


Boys he won School Colours, Club Fairest and Best and Leading Goal Thrower awards. He was senior team captain and a coach of both senior and junior teams.

After his playing career he refereed for four years from 1979 to 1982 and was President of ALRA (Vic) and a member of their Gradings and Appointments Panel.

His extensive lacrosse administration career includes terms as a Committee Member at both Melbourne High School Old Boys and Camberwell Clubs, Club Treasurer, Club delegate to VLA, Permits Committee Member and Auditor for Camberwell Lacrosse Club, VWLA and AWLC.

Leighton's service to lacrosse in Australia was recognised by the ALC with the presentation of the ALC Certificate of Merit in 1996.

The ALC President is elected by the six ALC Directors as part of the portfolio allocation by the Board after



Directors are elected by the ALC Annual General Meeting of Members (currently LSA, VLA and WALA). The process of election of the ALC President is conducted on an annual basis as three ALC Directors are elected each year for a two year term.

Lacrosse is fortunate to have a person with the credentials and capabilities of Leighton Beamsley to lead the Australian Lacrosse Council in the management of lacrosse in Australia.

## Adelaide for Nationals in 1999

To provide the total Australian lacrosse community the opportunity, and a good reason, to see the 1999 World Under 19 Lacrosse Championships in Adelaide, all Australian Championships and Tournaments are being conducted in Adelaide at the same time.

The Australian Under 17 Championships and Tournament and the Australian Under 15 Tournament will be played from July 3 to July 9 and the Australian Senior Championships commence on July 9 with the final on Saturday, July 17.

The Seniors will be played on the same fields as the World Under 19 Championships, while the Under 15 and Under 17 competitions will be played at the same location on adjoining fields.

Fourteen teams will contest the Australian Under 15 Tournament with a team from USA, twelve teams from five Australian States (SA - 3, Vic - 4, WA - 2, Qld - 2 and Tas - 1) and a Panthers team which is a composite WA/SA/Vic team. These are the players who should be planning to be in the next Australian Under 19 team!

The Australian Under 17 *Championship* is contested between South Australia, Victoria and Western Australia, with the Australian Under 17 *Tournament* including those three teams plus two teams from USA and an ALC President's team which will include players from Queensland and Tasmania.

At this time there are no visiting international teams to compete in the Australian Senior Tournament and the Australian Championships will be


between South Australia, Victoria and Western Australia. Efforts are being made to have a fourth team involved in an Australian Senior Tournament.


## **South Australia**

In South Australia the Sportsmen's Association of Australia (SA Division) present a Service to Sport Award, sponsored by Flag International, to recognise the achievements of a person who has contributed in an outstanding manner towards the development of a sport or sporting organisation.

The nomination of Peter Drew by Lacrosse South Australia was successful ahead of many other nominations, including four other finalists who have won Olympic or Commonwealth Games gold medals.

The award is judged on service over many years and Peter was well-credentialled, having commenced his playing career with the Sturt Club in 1948 and representing Australia (1995 Colts) and South Australia on six occasions.

Peter has held office for 22 years at Sturt Lacrosse Club as Secretary, Treasurer, Auditor, Deputy Chairman, Chairman or President. Since 1994 he has been Vice President (1994-95), President (1996-97) and Committee Member (1998) of the Crows Lacrosse Club (past players). He was SA delegate to the Australian Lacrosse Council from 1968-72 and his service

to SALA includes Senior Selector, Team Manager, Assistant Secretary, Deputy Chairman, Chairman, Vice President and, since 1983, he has been Commissioner (Tribunal and Complaints). He was Vice President of ALRA (SA) in 1973-74 and Chairman of SAWLA 1963-65.

Peter is a Life Member of the Sturt Lacrosse Club and SALA. He was awarded the ALC Certificate of Merit in 1969 and is to be inducted as a Fellow of the ALC at the ALC Fellows Dinner on July 8 at the Unley Community Centre.

Season 1999 is ready to go with the men's reserves teams to play their first round on the 10th April and with the official opening day for league men's and women's teams 17th April at the East Torrens Payneham Lacrosse Club. With the traditional grand final men's and women's teams from 1998 playing one another it gives an opportunity for the lacrosse community to enjoy a great contest.

Lacrosse SA has enjoyed some successful junior development throughout the off season with a professionally conducted development operation being directed by Gary Mortimer. Lacrosse SA and Glenelg are all geared up for the 1999 Lacrosse Festival entitled "Adelaide '99". The Event Director is Allan (Barney) Frederick, Event Co-Ordinator is Helen Keane, and Nationals Co-Ordinator is Bruce Rosewarne.

Woodville and East Torrens Payneham Clubs will both be celebrating one hundred years of lacrosse history this year. Sturt are currently celebrating the same milestone.

## Queensland

As we step into the year 1999 we have gone back to our recruiting areas and re-established ourselves in the schools around Camira and Caboolture. With Rex Wigney being our front man and doing clinics at the schools, we have injected new blood into the areas we have been concentrating on.

## Western Australia

A lot has been happening in the "off-season" to make the lacrosse season a successful and enjoyable experience for lacrosse players.

Presidents' Forums - The WALA Board of Directors meet each month with every second meeting preceded by a Presidents' Forum. This provides Club Presidents the opportunity to meet with WALA Directors and each other to discuss issues, seek information and provide opinions about decisions being made by the Board. February was the first Presidents' Forum for 1999.

Information Seminar - February 10 was the annual WALA Information Seminar where Club Presidents and Secretaries were briefed about WALA Rules and plans for 1999. Clubs, and WALA Directors and officers, are issued with an Administration File which includes the WALA Calendar for 1999, lists of contacts (Directors, Officers, Club Presidents and Secretaries), WALA Rules, Fees, Forms and all relevant information to enable clubs and officers to function efficiently.

**Roles** - Mark Hickey has accepted responsibility for 'updating' the WALA Rules which is being managed progressively by presenting proposed changes, primarily of a 'tidying up' nature, for amendment at each meeting of Directors.

Media Scholarship - The Western Australian Lacrosse Foundation provides a scholarship each year to a Media Studies student from Curtin University. The student is involved in working with Club Publicity Officers and the WALA Director of Publicity to produce media reports for local

community newspapers and main media ('The West Australian', 'Sunday Times', radio and television). 1998 scholarship holder, Sean Cowan, earned a highly regarded cadet position at "The West Australian' and so continues to be a valued contact for lacrosse in the media. 1999 scholarship winner is Jason Marocchi who aspires to follow the record set by his predecessor.

### 2002 World Lacrosse

Championships - Planning for this event in Perth has been managed by a Steering Committee led by WALA Special Projects Director, Don Rudderham. The committee recommendation to the WALA Board that former WA and Subiaco club player, George Halleen, be appointed Chairman of the Organising Committee was endorsed: George met with ALC President, Leighton Beamsley prior to the recent ALC Board meeting in Perth to brief him on progress to date.

**WA Lacrosse Foundation** - Another former WA and Subiaco player welcomed into an administrative role is Barry Groves who accepted appointment as a Trustee of the WALF joining Graham Rose who was reappointed for a further two year term.

### **WALA Development Officer** -

Australian lacrosse player, Matthew Schomburg, has been appointed to this position, taking over from Mark Hickey. Matthew is already very busy conducting clinics in schools and at other events to introduce current and future school teachers to moderosse.

**Australian Lacrosse Council Board Meeting** - This was held in Perth from March 5-7 and representatives from clubs and the WALA board accepted the invitation to meet with the ALC

board on Friday, March 5 in a session which was agreed to be of mutual benefit.

**Referees : ALRA (WA)** - conducted their annual seminar at Club Capricorn, Yanchep on March 13-14.

## **Coaching Accreditation Course** -

A Level 1 Lacrosse Specific Coaching course was conducted on Sunday, March 28. Accreditation requires completion of this course in addition to a Level 1 General Principles Coaching course conducted by the Coaching Foundation of WA.

Coaching Foundation of WA (CFWA) - supports coaches for all sports and conducts a wide range of activities which are of value and benefit to lacrosse coaches. This includes a program of seminars presented by experts on a range of topics of relevance to all sports. WALA is also taking advantage of the CFWA Coach Recognition Scheme in 1999.

Coach's Code of Ethics - WALA has adopted the Code of Ethics for Coaches which was developed by the Australian Sports Commission and team coaches in 1999 are required to sign an agreement to abide by the WALA Code of Conduct and Coach's Code of Ethics. Coaches are also required to be registered members of the WALA in 1999 and provision is included for the name of the coach of each team on match reports.

**Library** - The WALA has arranged for the City of Perth Library to maintain a library of books and videos on lacrosse coaching which will be provided by WALA. This makes a lot of material on coaching readily available to all lacrosse coaches and other interested people.

Wanneroo Club Changes - The Wanneroo Club has appointed a new Division 1 coach - former Australian player, Chris Hockey - and re-located their Senior and Under 18 teams to the Joondalup Arena which is a large sporting complex further north than the 1998 home of Penistone Reserve, Greenwood which will still be home to Wanneroo Under 15 and Under 13 teams. The Wanneroo Sofcrosse and Modcrosse competitions are also played at Penistone Reserve and another reserve further north in Kingsley. The Wanneroo Club has also changed the colour and style of their Division 1 team uniform to more closely resemble the "livery" of the West Perth Football Club which also uses the Joondalup Arena as their home.

WALA Shootout - The 1999 season commences on April 17, which is the final Saturday of the school holiday break, with the WALA Monster Shootout involving all club teams down to Under 15 level in a carnival to be held at the Joondalup Arena, hosted by the Wanneroo Club as a sanctioned event for the WALA.

**Club Participation** - The WALA has adopted a Club Participation Scheme which offers clubs the opportunity to gain a total 20% rebate on their 1999 WALA fees. This involves the rebate of 4% of fees for the participation of the club or specified personnel, at each of five nominated WALA activities.

All clubs qualified for a 4% rebate by having their Club President, Secretary and three current senior players at the 1998 WALA Annual General Meeting in November.

Clubs only have to field a team at the Monster Shootout in each grade for

which they have nominated a team in 1999 to qualify for another 4% rebate. Attendance by the Club President and Secretary at the WALA Information Seminar on February 10 provided another 4% rebate opportunity.

Having a club representative at all Junior and Senior Lacrosse Council will provide another 4% rebate.


Coaching is also rewarded by having a specified number of coaches accredited and attending CFWA and WALA seminars.

Sanctioned Events - WALA Special

Projects Director, Don Rudderham, is in the process of formalising arrangements by which WALA clubs conduct WALA events on behalf of WALA. The sanctioned events process will outline clearly to clubs the requirements and will include a signed agreement.

1999 Service to Sport Award - This award is included in the Sportstar of the Year Awards which is now the only awards event of its kind in Western Australia, having combined three different events previously conducted by the Sportsmen's Association of Australia (WA Branch), Western Australian Sports Federation and "The West Australian".

WALA nominates members in all relevant categories every year and 1999 realised a rare success when the nomination of Malcolm Stokes was declared the winner of the "Gibson and Gibson May Campbell Service to Sport" award. The trophy, a crystal decanter was presented at a black tie Sports Star Awards Dinner at the Hyatt Regency in Perth on February 15. Junior Sportstar nominee, David Bullen, attended a social function for all nominees and was presented with a certificate acknowledging his nomination.

## Vale George Tillotson

(1922 - 1999)


Australian lacrosse lost a great supporter and a wonderful person with the death on February 26, 1999 of George Tillotson. The attendance of some 400 mourners at the funeral service on March 3 attest to the esteem in which he was held by the community.

In 1936 the Box Hill Lacrosse Club recruited 14 year old George Tillotson who was a student at the Caulfield Technical School. From 1941 to 1946 George was a pilot in the RAAF on war service, earning the Distinguished Flying Cross which, as an observer noted "you don't get that for just turning up!". It is a reward for gallantry by members of the country's armed forces in the face of the enemy, in action or under fire.

On his return George played with the Wattle Park team which had combined with the Box Hill team, until 1948 when he was a founding member of the Surrey Park Lacrosse Club. His service with this club spans 50 years including grass roots roles as bench official for the senior team every Saturday to the time of his death, Club President for 20 years, Club Secretary, 30 years on the Management Committee, coach of senior and junior teams and a senior player.

George was a State Director of Lacrosse Victoria, which is the joint promotions body of the VLA and VWLA. He was a member of the VLA Management Committee from the early 1960s and has been a VLA Vice President since 1967. He was a member of the VLA Permits Committee for more than 40 years, including a 15 year term as Chairman.

First elected as a VLA delegate on the Australian Lacrosse Council in 1974, George held a number of positions on ALC in the following 25 years. He was ALC Secretary from 1979 until his death and this included terms as ALC Director of Administration, Executive Director and Property Officer. His

performance at ALC Board meetings with a suitcase of papers from which he could invariably extract the required ones and his high-tech mini cassette recording of meetings to assist in preparation of minutes, is legendary. George embraced new technologies and developed computer literacy which included considerable satisfaction at being hooked to the internet.

George's influence also spread to the international lacrosse arena, where he was a delegate from Australia on the International Lacrosse Federation, serving terms also as ILF Secretary and ILF Vice President.

George was honoured with Life Membership of the Surrey Park Lacrosse Club in 1962, being appointed as Club Patron in 1992.

He was elected as a Life Member of the VLA in 1979 and awarded the ALC Certificate of Merit 1967. In 1990 George was recognised with the highest honour which lacrosse in Australia can

award - he was elected as a Fellow of the Australian Lacrosse Council, inducted at the 1991 ALC Fellows Dinner held at Formbys Restaurant, Port Adelaide.


George enjoyed and appreciated the support of Beryl and was immensely proud of the achievements of sons Gary and Ric, who both played lacrosse at the highest level of playing representation.

George had a very busy life outside of lacrosse with active involvement in community groups such as Rotary, Lodge, his Air Force Squadron and he enjoyed his golf and cricket. George held office in all of these organisations at some time.

He has set a wonderful example of dedication and commitment to lacrosse which could rarely be matched in any sport.

George was a wonderful human being who will be sadly missed by all who had the good fortune to know him.

Establishing the game in Argentina offers the prospect of future "border hopping" to Chile, Uruguay and Bolivia.
